Alberto Moreau dies; CP leader and teacher

NEW YORK, July 29—Alberto Moreau, a veteran of 60 years of revolutionary struggle, died here yesterday at the age of 80. Moreau, a member of the Central Committee of the Communist Party,

USA, was beloved by many as a teacher and a leader in the revolutionary struggle.

Moreau was an outstanding leader of the U.S. antiimperialist movement in the 1920's. In 1927, he, along with others, including Cubans, Spaniards, Venezuelans and Puerto Ricans, organized the Club Obrero Espanol (Spanish Workers Club), an important center of political

activity and discussion in New York

He had an extensive history of international revolutionary activity on behalf of the Communist Party, USA, especially with regard to Puerto Rico and Cuba. He was in Cuba representing "New Masses" a literary magazine, at the time of the revolution that overthrew the tyrant Machado in 1933.

Moreau was member of the CPUSA's international and Puerto Rican commissions.

He was highly esteemed as a teacher of Marxist-Leninist theory to Communist Party cadre, and others.

According to his wishes, his body will be privately cremated. A public memorial will be announced shortly.

He is survived by his wife Jennie, a son and daughter, and several grandchildren.
