

U. S. Negro On Moscow Soviet

MOSCOW, U. S. S. R.— George Padmore, Negro worker from the United States, has been elected a member of the Moscow Soviet. The workers of the Palace of Labor, headquarters of the Red International of Labor Unions, and the various unions of the Soviet Union participated in the elections which took place at a meeting of over 17,000 workers.

In his speech of acceptance, Comrade Padmore pointed out that his election was a symbol of the true and deep internationalism of the Soviet workers, and an answer to the poison of race prejudice as in the case of the two American engineers who were expelled from the Soviet Union for refusing to eat at the same table as Negro workers.

White workers in this country should take their lesson from the Russian workers, who realize that race prejudice is used by the bosses to his own advantage in order to keep the workers divided so that he can cut their wages and break strikes.
