

# VIENNA REPORTS SOME FIGHTING STILL IN HUNGARY

Reports from Vienna yesterday declared that some fighting continued in Budapest and elsewhere in Hungary for the third straight day. The Hungarian government's radio station at Pecs broadcast an announcement that "counter-revolutionaries continue their resistance."

Western sources in Vienna expressed the belief that the revolt was petering out, as the Budapest government renewed amnesty offers to the remaining belligerents to lay down their arms.

Vienna reports, however, quoted one radio broadcast from rebel-held Rockoczy Radio appealing to

Western powers to parachute in war materiel, food and medicine in expectation of an attack by Soviet troops.

Diplomatic sources said heavy fighting raged in Budapest Monday night on "an appreciable scale," with the Soviets moving in heavy armor to wipe out pockets of rebels in at least two Budapest districts.

One tiny group of rebels still occupied the Hungarian customs and passport control house at the Nickelsdorf crossing point on the Vienna-Budapest highway. Here the Soviets withheld fire, apparently for fear of hitting Austria, but the rebels were expected to flee to Austria.
