Notwithstanding all this, however, Stalin's cult of the individual, with "its cultivation of a highly centralized bureauracy, with its brutalities, ideological domination, and sickly adulation, was so corroding in its effects, as to constitute a ghastly ulcer upon his work and revolu-

tionary reputation.

It has done vast harm to the cause of Socialism, both in the USSR and on a world scale. It produced not only the most senseless and atrocious hardships and cruelties in the Soviet Union, but it has also seriously discredited Socialism in the minds of millions of otherwise sympathetic workers all

over the world.

It would be wrong, therefore, to minimize or to fail to bring out fully the negative sides of Stalin's work, the bad consequences of which are now to be seen in various Socialist countries and Com-
