

TOP CANADIAN REDS QUIT

Party Split on Stalinist Policy Widened as Two Resign

TORONTO, Nov. 15—Evidence of further dissension within the Labor-Progressive (Communist) party of Canada was apparent today in the resignations of two members from the policy-making National Executive Committee.

There are now four vacancies on the committee, which is headed by Tim Buck, the party's leader.

Letters published in the party organ, The Canadian Tribune, confirmed the resignations of Harry Binder and Norman Penner, both of Toronto.

Much of the antipathy toward Mr. Buck's leadership has stemmed from events in Hungary and Poland, plus his continued championing of Stalinism.
