

RED PARTY CHARGES MADE AGAINST GATES

John Gates, editor of The Daily Worker, was accused yesterday by a unit of the national committee of the Communist party of breaking party discipline.

The National Administrative Committee said Mr. Gates had violated "the most elementary organization principles" of the party by giving information to The New York Times on the proposed suspension of publication of The Daily Worker.

At an emergency meeting of The Daily Worker staff yesterday afternoon, Mr. Gates denied the charge of disclosing party secrets.

The committee had said at its earlier meeting that the information given by Mr. Gates concerning the proposed suspension contained "false rumors."

The committee was said to have voted to recommend that the newspaper's staff reorganize itself so as to be able to save the Sunday edition of the Communist party newspaper. The daily edition would be dropped. The recommendation cannot become effective unless approved in a poll of the full sixty-member National Committee.
