The Central Committee of the Communist Party of Belgium took note of two resolutions adopted and made public by the majority of the office of the Brussels Federation on November 6th [1962].

The party rejects these resolutions as contrary to the Party line.

The party condemns these comrades from the office of the Brussels Federation and more particularly comrade Jacques Grippa for the practices contrary to the democratic rules of the Party which they have used. He most urgently calls on these comrades to put an end to methods which are harmful to the unity of the Party and to the effectiveness of its action.

The Central Committee invites the Brussels federation to associate itself with this resolution as well as with the two resolutions devoted to international issues and to take all the necessary measures to guarantee their application. He recommended that he organize general meetings of all the sections in the fortnight, with the participation of members of the Central Committee.

Comrade Jacques Grippa is excluded from the ranks of the Central Committee because he intends to persist in thwarting the implementation of his decisions and the democratic functioning of the Party.
