## CARRYING OUT DISTRICT PROPAGANDA WORK

"BE WELL POSTED ON THE STATE OF AFFAIRS" Lenin

"Who are our propagandists? They include not only teachers and journalists, and the writers, but all our cadres working in every field. Take the military commanders for instance. Though they make no public statements, they must talk to the soldiers and have dealings with the local inhabitants. Isnt that a form of propaganda? Whenever a person speaks to others, that is propaganda. And unless one is dumb, one is bound to speak to others..." While it is true that certain comrades will specialize in propaganda work, all comrades are propagandists, as Mao Tse Tung pointed out in "oppose The Party "Eight Legged Essay," Vol III Selected Works.

To become a good propagandist for the Party and for Marxism-Leninism, comrades must be "well posted on the state of affairs." This is a pre requisite for a Communist, without which it is impossible to make a concrete analysis of concrete conditions, which, according to both Lenin and Mao, is "the living soul of Marxism."

This is not simply a matter of keeping up with current events, but must be seen as "the objective consideration of the sum total of the relations between absolutely all the classes in a given society and consequently a consideration of the objective stage of development reached by that society and of the relationship between it and other societies.." On Marxism, Lenin.

Obviously it will be too late "to start organizing the distribution of literature at a time of unrest, a strake, or turmoil, this work can only be built up gradually." For that reason, the following guidelines have been established in order to make a disciplined effort to keep comrades well posted on the nature and pace of the class struggle, worldwide and domestically.
