Throughout the U.S., millions of people are being thrown out of work as the current crisis of monopoly capitalism unfolds. As the people who run this country scramble to protect their profits in the face of the general downturn in the economy, working people across the country are being forced to bear the brunt of the burden.

Here in the St. Louis area, more than 120,000 people have already been thrown out of work. Here in the St. Louis area, as is the case elsewhere in the country, the Black community is being hardest hit by the crisis of unemployment. In the inner city of St. Louis, the unemployment rate is climbing 25% or more than three times the national average. With millions unable to find work, they are hoping that we will be too busy fighting each other in a frantic attempt to find any work that we can, that we will fail to identify the real enemy, the monopoly capitalist economic system that brought on the crisis and the capitalist class that rules this country. The ruling class is using the present crisis as one more episode in its ongoing attempts to divide working people.

On February 22, in cities across the country CAP will mobilize unemployed and employed workers, students, activists, welfare and food stamp recipients, unionists and consumers to protest against the hardships caused the masses of people by the system called Monopoly Capitalism.

In the St. Louis area, CAP called together an anti-imperialist coalition to help sponsor Workers' Solidarity Day. The Anti-Imperialist Coalition is composed of Worker Unity Organization, a local Marxist organization struggling for socialism-planned economy controlled by the working class, Afrikan Liberation Support Committee, an anti-racist, anti-imperialist Black united front, in addition to the Congress of Afrikan People.

In order to build Workers' Solidarity Day, the St. Louis Anti-Imperialist Coalition is sponsoring: a forum on "Why Unemployment?" to be held at St. Stephens Church at 14th and Park Sat. Feb. 8 at 7 p.m.; a mass meeting and rally which will present speakers, films, and discussion at the Yeatman Community Center at 3160 King Dr. at 5 p.m. Sun. Feb. 16; and a DEMONSTRATION to protest the layoffs beginning at the Federal Building (15th & Market) at 1 p.m. on Feb. 22.
