Enclosed is a copy of the CC°s proposal for a New England Regional Center, which I described to you in our meeting of 2/25.

As I mentioned, the CC is interested in encouraging a full expression of minority views in the reading for the discussion groups and would like to solicit contibutions from the RBSG in particular. We feel that your collective has differences with the majority of the OC on all three of the first set of topics to be addressed in the discussion groups, so we would be interested in readings expressing your point of view on any of them (whether the critique of ultra-leftism should be seen as our main theoretical task, the struggle against federationism, and the centrality of the struggle against racism within the communist movement.).

Your views on the question of the ultra-left danger to our tendency have been the most fully expressed so far. We would be interested either in a new minimum statement, or inca suggested reading from an already published article that you feel expresses your views well.

You have not presented such a clear statement of your views on the struggle against federationism. However, members of your collective have expressed very strong disagreements with the NSC's and OC majority's view of this matter. This issue is directly related to the formation of Regional and Local Centers, and so has a special importance for an early discussion of the NERC. Whether or not your collective has unity full unity on this issue, we feel that it is your obligation, as members of the OC, to present your disagreements on this crucial question. Therefore we would like to ask you to presents on this crucial question. In general, we want to distribute the readings for each session at the session before. The first meeting of the NERC will probably be in the first or second weekend in May.
