MARXIST-LENINIST EDUCATION PROJECT

Study Group Reading List January, 1978

Our study of basic Marxist-Leninist theory breaks down into four major areas:

- A. Introduction which deals with how to study Marxist theory, relation of practice to study and theory, dogmatic, pragmatic, subjectivist errors in study and their ramifications, etc.
- B. Overview of Basic Marxist Analysis which deals with basic principles of Marxist science and philosophy and the basic categories of historical materialism on the economic, political, and ideological levels.
- C. Basic Analyses of the Main Contradictions in Contemporary Capitalism which deals with the contradictions between imperialism and dependent societies, between classes in advanced social formations, the opression of national minorities in the U.S. and the oppression of women.
- D. Socialism and Communism deals with socialism as a period of transition to communism, as a period of advancing proletarian class struggle under the dictatorship of the proletariat.

Reading assignments average about 60 pages a week, though they occasionally go over 70 pages (those readings that are assigned on the basis of Chinese editions are very small pages). As proposed, the study lasts 13 weeks.
