

HAMMER & STEEL NEWSLETTER

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U.S. imperialism seeks to establish its military control and neo-colonial oppression over all of Asia, Africa and Latin America. It has been meeting many setbacks. It sought to reverse the setbacks by the Manila conference with its No. 1 governmental pawn, L.B. Johnson, in attendance. The Manila conference was an effort to prepare for further acts of aggression in Asia under the false slogan of "peace". U.S. imperialism thought that an organized meeting to plug its leaky boat in Viet Nam could intimidate Asians into surrendering their sovereign rights.

Hardly had the meeting adjourned when the People's Republic of China answered General Motors and L.B. Johnson. They conducted their successful nuclear guided missile test. In this way the PRC again showed the people what must be done in the face of Wall Street aggression. It said to the oppressed and exploited in effect; "Do not be bullied by paper tigers who are momentarily vicious, but have no future. Strengthen your fighting ability. U.S. imperialism will be smashed. A new world, free of national oppression and exploitation, will award your struggles."

Hammer & Steel's editorial board opposes any monopoly of nuclear arms by the 50 billionaire U.S. families and the present revisionistic and chauvinistic Russian Tsars. Such a monopoly has been used and is being used in attempts by the Soviet-U.S. imperialist alliance to divide the world into a U.S. bloc and a Russian bloc. Russian-U.S. monopoly on nuclear weapons increases the danger of a third world war. We, as Marxist-Leninists, fighting for national liberation of oppressed peoples and for the Socialist revolution in our country, take pride in the Socialist achievements of the Chinese people and the CPC under the leadership of the great Marxist-Leninist theoretician, Comrade Mao Tse-tung.

The interests of the Afro-American people, the Puerto Rican people, our working class, and all other really patriotic forces directly contradict the Johnson-General Motors policy of nuclear blackmail. Hammer & Steel's editorial board believes that nuclear development in China will eventually lead to destruction of nuclear weapons by all countries. We, together with the hundreds of millions of oppressed and exploited in the world, congratulate the Chinese people, the Chinese Communist Party, the CPC leadership and Comrade Mao Tse-tung on their successful nuclear test.

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On the other side of the world, starting on the 1st of November, took place the 5th Congress of the Albanian Party of Labor. The Congress was the first meeting held in the Palace of Culture in Skanderbeg Square in Tirana. N. Khrushchev had laid the cornerstone of the building and promised to complete it as a gift to the Albanian people. The impressive statue of Comrade Stalin in the Square looked down on him as he made the promise. Like all his promises to carry on the work of Lenin and Stalin, Khrushchev broke his pledge to Albania on the building. Instead he joined Tito and the imperialists in a vicious blockade of Albania. The blockade is broken. The Albanian people, led by Comrade Hoxha and the Albanian Party of Labor have completed the beautiful functional building with their own personnel, using nearly all native products. Stalin's teachings proved powerful while Khrushchev's bragging followed by his shameless slanders, threats and blockade have been a dismal failure.

The main report was delivered by Comrade Enver Hoxha, First Secretary of the Party. Another important report was delivered by Comrade Mehmet Shehu, member of the political bureau of the Central Committee, Albanian Party of Labor, Chairman of the Council of Ministers in the Albanian government, on the 4th Five Year Plan.

Comrade Enver Hoxha evaluated the current international situation. He said; "A common great fierce and dangerous enemy is standing vis-a-vis the peoples of all the world --U.S. imperialism." And further, "that in its efforts to establish world domination, U.S. imperialism, as a ferocious beast, has extended its feet the world over." This is by no means a sign of its strength, but its weakness. "...it has disseminated its forces over an immense territory on whole continents...these forces are insufficient to cope with and oppress the liberation struggle of all people..."

Comrade Hoxha recalled Stalin's prophecy of 1952 on West Germany, Britain, France, Italy and Japan. Stalin observed these nations had a servile attitude toward the U.S., but, "it would be a blunder to think that this 'get on well' will continue forever..." Citing France and other capitalist nations Comrade Hoxha said; "The U.S.A. has lost at present the absolute hegemony over the other capitalist forces under their control."

Speaking of national liberation struggles in Asia, Africa and Latin America, Comrade Hoxha said; "The Albanian people greet and support by all their forces the just struggle of the peoples of these areas..."

The main report stated; "The attitudes towards U.S. imperialism is a touchstone for the political forces of the world. The question is thus posed: Should one resist and fight U.S. imperialism or should one capitulate and join with it; can it be vanquished achieving a victory over it, or should peoples fall on their knees and submit to it?"

While expressing revolutionary optimism about the future Comrade Hoxha warned that imperialism will not wither away. He said; "These dark forces will never die off of their own accord....The more they approach their death the fiercer become their attempts to preserve their

existence....they will not hesitate to throw themselves into the most despicable adventures, to use the most inhuman means and commit the ugliest of crimes." He cited the U.S. support for genocide in Indonesia as one example.

"It is the noble duty of the socialist countries and of the Communist and workers' movement in the capitalist nations to give to the revolutionary movement of the peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America, all their unreserved help and support, and to consider this as the most vivid expression of proletarian internationalism and as a decisive factor for the destruction of imperialism and for the triumph of world revolution"; said Enver Hoxha.

#### On the U.S.-Soviet Alliance

This alliance was described as "one of the most fundamental characteristics of today's international situation." Comrade Hoxha cited their common desires for world "domination of two great powers." "They need each other, they undertake common actions and co-ordinate their plans." Although the two countries have "difficulties and contradictions" the main characteristic is unity, with the Soviets ready "to sacrifice at any time, the vital interests of peace and socialism." Creating diversions and illusions among the people on behalf of the U.S. imperialists, the Soviet revisionists have used the "twin headed serpents" of peaceful transition and peaceful co-existence to embellish imperialism. The Soviets have made all kinds of anti-Chinese agreements with Japan, Indonesia and India as well as with the U.S. on the Congo in the U.N., Cuba in 1962, the Dominican Republic and Germany.

While talking peace and disarmament both the Soviets and the U.S. were "armed to the teeth". "The exposure and destruction of the Soviet-American alliance is at present a task of historical importance."

### On Viet Nam

After saying, "Today Viet Nam is the main front of the struggle against U.S. imperialism"; Comrade Hoxha posed the following question: "To be with the Vietnamese people and their just cause...or with U.S. imperialism, that is to say against the Vietnamese people and their just war. There is no middle course. You cannot be at the same time a friend and ally of the Vietnamese people and a friend and ally of the U.S. murderers."

Comrade Hoxha ripped the mask from Soviet revisionists on Vietnam. He said, "verbally they express their solidarity with Viet Nam and pose as anti-imperialist, while they have not taken any step to at least break off their relations with the hangmen of the Vietnamese people, but (they) extend and strengthen them every day and raise them as the main objective of their foreign policy."

Enver Hoxha said that U.S. imperialism in Viet Nam is "perpetrating monstrous crimes which surpass those of Hitlerite fascists." The result has been "defeats and only defeats." He exposed the actions of the recent Warsaw Treaty meeting which were to "make safe the rear in Europe for American imperialism."

Comrade Hoxha described the "war of the fraternal Vietnamese people as our war..." The delegates burst into sustained applause when he announced the setting up in Tirana of "a permanent mission by the National Liberation Front in South Viet Nam." With rhythmic applause the delegates shouted; "Viet Nam Can Win!!"

### On China

"...The American imperialists and Khrushchev revisionists in collusion with one another, are trying to use the Vietnamese war for their common plot against China" said Comrade Hoxha, but such plans "have always met and will

meet with complete defeat before the invincible economic political, military and moral might of the 700 million Chinese people, united as one single body around the glorious CPC, led by Comrade Mao Tse-tung." He said; "Solidarity with People's China, her defense from the attacks of the imperialist and their revisionist lackeys is today an historical task and a vital question for all revolutionary and freedom loving people."

Comrade Hoxha greeted the successful Chinese nuclear guided missile test and the conference delegates roared their approval. He noted the excellent relations between China and Albania and said that the Albanians "have a friend and comrade in arms, loyal and resolute in good as in bad days, the fraternal Chinese people and the PRC."

In strong terms he lauded "the Chinese Proletarian Cultural Revolution which aims at fighting mercilessly against the bourgeois and revisionist ideology manifested in the peoples minds, in the field of culture and in every other sphere of the country's life, against the class enemies and all open or camouflaged revisionists who try to draw People's China to the capitalist road, against U.S. imperialism, Khrushchev revisionism, and all the reactionaries."

On the second day of the 5th Congress, Comrade Kang Sheng delivered his speech and read the greetings from the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China, signed by Comrade Mao Tse-tung. While the delegates cheered and pictures were taken, Comrades Hoxha and Kang Sheng embraced on the platform. This symbolized the great unity between the C.P.C. and the Party of Labor of Albania. Such unity is a guarantee that the Marxist-Leninist international movement will grow in understanding and strength, that it will successfully build a world wide anti-imperialist coalition, the indispensable force which will smash U.S. imperialism and lead to Socialism throughout the world.

ON THE PARTY OF LABOR OF ALBANIA

Comrade Hoxha opened his report by stating; "For 25 years in succession our Party thru bloody struggles against the nazi-fascist invaders and local traitors, thru fierce class battles at home and in the international arena, thru incessant clashes with the various enemies of Marxism-Leninism has defended unyieldingly and resolutely the lofty interests of the Fatherland and of the people, the cause of revolution and of Socialism."

But Comrade Hoxha and the strong collective leadership around him do not rest on their past achievements. Last summer the Central Committee had sent a critical and self-critical document to all Party members. It proposed strong measures against bureaucracy in both Party and State, for stronger ties with the people, for an intensification of the class struggle in all fields. "...nearly 15,000 cadres passed from office work to production; measures were taken to radically improve the method and style of work by transferring the center of attention to vital work with the people. During this period, beginning with the main cadres of the Party and the State, high wages were reduced by a considerable measure, by placing them on a more just proportion in comparison to the average wage of the working people."

The First Secretary not only defended the Leninist concept of a strong steeled Party in the period of Socialist construction but he emphasized further steps to strengthen democratic centralism, the ideological work, the composition and style of work by the PLA in the unions, the farm co-operatives, the army, in the cultural field and among woman and youth.

On Youth

"...we have today a new generation educated with the spirit of the best patriotic and revolutionary traditions of our

people, tempered politically, healthy ideologically and morally sound." But, "We should not underestimate the fact that our youth today has not experienced the fierce class oppression and exploitation and the sacrifices... that our youth lacks the direct experience of the national liberation struggle...(and) the influence of bourgeois and revisionist ideology penetrates into our youth too in many forms, often by indirect ways, very refined ones, thru the media of literature, the films, music, fashion, etc."

Further Comrade Hoxha said; "The Party Committees and the basic organizations should...more and more be engaged with the youth and their organizations....They should increase their trust in youth and youth's capability and open up wide roads which will lead them to important and responsible work."

#### On Women

"The Woman question is one of the most important ideological and social problems which confronts our Party." said Enver Hoxha. He traced the successful work of the PLA in leading women, starting with the national liberation war, and through the years of building Socialism. "But...there exist...serious obstacles....We must wage bitter struggle against the old enslaving concepts on women...against the treatment of women as a household article." Further, "We must wage a merciless struggle against these moss grown ideas, which above all exist in the minds of men."

Not satisfied with the numerous nurseries and kindergartens in the major cities he insisted on more in towns and farm cooperatives "so that women may more widely participate in production and social life, in order to be economically emancipated, because it is only in this way that they can successfully oppose also the old patriarchal prejudices." And he called for the PLA to take more steps "to broaden their education and culture to make them actively participate in our state affairs; thus raising the personality of women and giving them the deserved

place in our society." The high calibre of the speeches by women delegates to the 5th Congress showed that this problem can be solved by the PLA.

### On The Ideological Front and Cultural Revolution

Despite the great achievements on these questions by the PLA there is no "lizzy with success" attitude. Comrade Hoxha warned; "It is not only the existence of former exploiting class elements, the imperialists, the Titoite and Khrushchevite revisionists abroad"...that demand sharp class struggle on these questions. It must also develop "within the working people against any alien manifestation of the conscience, mind, behavior and the attitude of every person," and "in the Party ranks as well...emerge people who degenerate and slip into alien anti-Party and anti-Socialist activities."

Comrade Hoxha bore down hard on those in the Party, those in cultural and educational work, who had lost their respect for and do not participate in labor. He said; "The bourgeois and revisionist conception of life to put money, excessive amusements, a luxurious life of ease, comfort and personal well being above everything is alien to our people." Such thinking has "become catastrophic in the countries ruled by revisionists."

Taking into full account the present situation in Albania, the First Secretary of the Party of Labor of Albania made proposals on the cultural, ideological and educational work of the Party as the key to strengthening the proletarian dictatorship. These proposals acknowledge that the cultural and ideological struggles are a long and difficult part of the Socialist Revolution. The Central Committee of the PLA, in its open letter, and in the main report to the 5th Congress, self-critically examined its own role and accepted its share of responsibility for any past weaknesses. In this serious, modest M-L'ist manner, the CC, PLA inspired even greater confidence among the Party and the people.

The Party members and people are more determined than ever to support M-L'ism on questions of ideology and culture.

As we understand Comrade Hoxha's report, the struggle on the ideological and cultural fronts in Socialist Albania contributes to the world-wide struggle against reaction and counter-revolution. M-L'ists in other countries will study the ideological and cultural struggles in Albania; their comments and criticism are welcomed by the PLA.

The cultural revolution in Albania is not an abstract "thing in itself." It conforms to objective laws of Socialist development. It emphasizes the responsibility of the Party, from the newest member to the highest committees. Comrade Hoxha's report on the cultural and ideological struggles will strengthen all M-L'ists in capitalist nations, (their leaders in the first place) in the bitter battles against revisionism and imperialism.

#### ON STALIN

Comrade Hoxha's report included a thorough examination of the development of revisionism in Yugoslavia, the Eastern European Democracies, and Soviet Union and the present objectives of the revisionists. He also explained the reasons the Party of Labor of Albania had been able to effectively struggle against revisionism. Not the least of these reasons was the correct evaluation of Stalin as a great M-L'ist theoretician and leader.

Recent developments in Yugoslavia have brought into the open many of the real characteristics of the filthy, degenerate, bourgeois-nationalist cliques in the Titoite regime and fully confirm the correctness of Comrade Stalin and the PLA. Comrade Hoxha said that Stalin "might be criticized" for allowing the Khrushchev clique in the last years of Stalin's life to make so much propaganda about the real merits of Stalin. They created this propaganda

(unnecessary because the people understood Stalin's contributions) in order to hide their own "anti-Marxist and anti-Socialist aims."

Comrade Hoxha ridiculed illusions that the present Soviet leaders have changed for the better. The CPSU leaders have not "fully and unequivocally rehabilitated Stalin... therefore there is no change from the 20th, 21st and 22nd Congresses of the CPSU." The Albanian Party of Labor stresses that "Stalin is a basic question, for the revisionists concretized their attack on Marxism-Leninism and on the dictatorship of the proletariat with their attack on J.V. Stalin." Said Comrade Hoxha, with long and loud applause from the 891 delegates, "The revisionist slanders against Stalin cannot tarnish his outstanding figure and his monumental work which will shine forever and will always serve as a great inspiring example and a fighting banner for all the Marxist-Leninist forces of the world."

Comrade Hoxha's ideological hammer blows on Stalin's role made shreds out of the Trotskyites and neo-Trotskyites who masquerade as anti-revisionists in order to turn anti-revisionist organizations into their opposite.

#### ON THE INTERNATIONAL MARXIST-LENINIST MOVEMENT

Said Comrade Hoxha; "In the course of its history the international Communist movement has witnessed a transition from unity to disruption and from disruption to a new unity on a higher basis. The victory in the struggle between Marxism-Leninism vis-a-vis opportunism and revisionism has always been on the side of Marxism-Leninism ...and....The dialectical law of development through the struggle of opposites, as a universal law, operates within the Communist Parties and the Communist movement."

The "most suitable form of infiltration of bourgeois ideology into the Socialist countries and Communist Parties is in the form of revisionism, which is but a bourgeois ideology camouflaged with Marxist and Socialist phraseology." Therefore Comrade Hoxha ridiculed efforts by revisionists to stop open polemics, citing also the current slanders by the CPSU and others against China.

The Leninist norms on criticism between Marxist-Leninist forces were clearly stated by the First Secretary; "The PLA considers that it is the duty and the right of every M-L'ist Party to defend the teachings of Marxism-Leninism from any right wing or left wing deviation, both inside the Party ranks and in the international Communist movement and to make a principled criticism of any Marxist-Leninist Party which violates and distorts the Marxist-Leninist principles and the laws of proletarian revolution." Also; "It is the right and duty of everybody to criticize us openly, in case we are not right in a certain question or somebody does not share our views. We would welcome any right and principled criticism."

Comrade Hoxha confirmed the experience of Hammer & Steel and many others in capitalist countries struggling against revisionism; "The PLA, caring not a straw for revisionist slanders and accusations that we have been allegedly carrying out 'factional' and 'splitting' activities, has helped, and will help with everything she can, the new M-L'ist forces, all those who fight against imperialism and revisionism and who are for revolution. We regard it to be our lofty internationalist duty, for in the growth of these new revolutionary forces we see the only just way to the triumph of Marxism-Leninism and the destruction of revisionism."

Said Enver Hoxha; "Tens of new parties and M-L'ist groups have been founded in different countries of the world, including some Socialist countries." Many representatives of these new Parties and groups spoke at the 5th Congress. A message of greeting to the 5th Congress<sup>was</sup> read from the new M-L'ist organization in Poland.

Comrade Enver Hoxha's report defends and upholds M-L'ism by enriching it. He exposed the weakness of the revisionists by laying bare the growing contradictions, feuds, and fusses in their own camp; "While revisionists call for proletarian internationalism in words they disrupt it in deeds; while the Soviet revisionists call for independence of Parties, they work to make everyone dependent on them." And he warned that "modern revisionists try by every means to split us, for our Marxist-Leninist unity means their death and the end of their masters--U.S. imperialism." Said Enver Hoxha; "Marxist-Leninists must work out a common line and a common stand on the basic questions, especially in the struggle against imperialism and modern revisionism, in the new alliances concretized in the real conditions of the actual situation but always based on Marxist-Leninist principles."

Comrade Hoxha said; "It is an undeniable historic fact and very fortunate for the peoples and international Communism that in the forefront of present day struggle against U.S.-led imperialism and modern revisionism, with the Soviet leaders at the top, stands strong and steadfast the Communist Party of China and the great People's Republic of China, headed by the prominent Marxist-Leninist Comrade Mao Tse-tung. Immense is the role and contribution of the CPC and PRC in the struggle for the revolutionary cause of the international proletariat and peoples of all the world."

He spelled out the kind of unity necessary to defeat imperialism and revisionism; "The PLA thinks that all Parties and Marxist-Leninist forces, as equal and independent, must closely unite with the CPC and the PRC to form an

iron block against which our enemies will break their heads." He advised contempt for slanders from "revisionists and their imperialist masters that by joining with China we become her 'satellites' and lose 'independence'." Such slanders "never have and never should prevent the M-L'ists from strengthening unity with People's China and her Marxist-Leninist Party."

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Above are only a few of the highlights of Comrade Hoxha's report to the 5th Congress, Party of Labor of Albania. All emphasis, shown by underlining, is ours. We do not have the space to deal with more of this report or with Comrade Mehmet Shehu's excellent and informative report on Albania's 4th Five Year Plan or the important contributions made by the delegates. However, Comrade Hoxha's and Comrade Shehu's reports will be published in English. As soon as this important event takes place, we will inform our readers.

At this stage of the development of the M-L'ist forces, and considering that the Party of Labor of Albania is the leading force in a Socialist country and we are not, there are bound to be certain differences on emphasis and solutions of problems between the PLA and Hammer & Steel. The 5th Congress passed a resolution correctly condemning the terror in Indonesia. It did not reflect the important article by the Party of Labor of Albania on Indonesia concerning Sukarno. Hammer & Steel feels that whether he is alive or dead, in or out of power, illusions about Sukarno's two-faced role are a road-block to ending terror in Indonesia and an obstacle to a correct coalition policy needed for the democratic revolution there.

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We hail the political courage and initiative of the Party of Labor of Albania and Comrade Hoxha in calling for discussions to create new Marxist-Leninist policies. We believe that such discussions are urgently needed partly because the 81-Party Statement, which Comrade Hoxha mentioned briefly in a positive way, contains serious errors.

We completely agree with Comrade Enver Hoxha's report on the role of the CPC and Comrade Mao Tse-tung. We also agree that every M-L organization or Party has an equal responsibility to contribute their utmost to M-L theory and practice. On basic questions all M-L organizations should criticize other M-L Parties if there is disagreement and should welcome criticism. This is the way to Marxist-Leninist unity.

We, with the PLA, are opposed to classifying Parties into "big and small, mother and daughter, or leading and subordinate Parties." The small parties must be heard. They must have proper recourse in case of disagreement with large Parties. At the same time we are opposed to egalitarian formulations. Parties in Socialist countries should be stronger theoretically and take more theoretical initiative than those in other countries (as the CPC and PLA have often done). Parties in Socialist countries must be the first to encourage criticism from Parties in capitalist and oppressed nations. Large Parties should take the initiative to consult with small Parties. Marxist-Leninist Parties with great experience in national liberation struggles, in fighting revisionism, and in building Socialism, must not remain neutral on theoretical differences between Parties in capitalist countries; they should help resolve them in favor of Marxism-Leninism. M-L'ist unity can be achieved only if the kind of theoretical leadership that Comrade Hoxha gave in his report is given in such situations.

The 81 Party Statement does not recognize the uneven development of M-L'ist forces. The 81 Party Statement on relations between Parties is being used by certain forces in Japan and other countries to deny the special contribution of the CPC and even for advocating unity with the CPSU revisionist traitors.

These differences are of emphasis and tactics. They are not differences of principle. We welcome and fully support the main line of the report. Our chief task concerning Comrade Hoxha's report is to give it the most thorough study and distribution possible. This is difficult, mainly for two reasons: 1) Khrushchevite attacks on M-L'ism and international solidarity are aimed first at M-L'ist ideology. The new anti-revisionist forces in capitalist countries are not immune from the "contempt for ideology" illness. 2) Bourgeois and revisionist propaganda and pressures on all of us discount theoretical leadership from former colonial and semi-colonial countries especially from small countries. This can result in self-defeating tendencies among many M-L'ist forces in capitalist countries.

Precisely because Comrade Enver Hoxha, and the collective leadership around him, have vast experience with democratic coalition and national liberation struggle in Albania is such a magnificent report possible.

All great Marxist-Leninist theoreticians develop in the struggle against wrong ideas. Comrade Hoxha had to wage struggle against postponing military action, and against wrong ideas discounting the poor peasants as a major force for national liberation, in order to found the PLA 25 years ago. He has fought wrong concepts on building Socialism in Albania. He led the PLA in bitter semi-military and ideological struggle against Tito. He has made immense Marxist-Leninist contributions against Soviet revisionism.

Hammer & Steel considers Enver Hoxha as the outstanding Marxist-Leninist theoretician in the West, a very great exponent of the teachings of Marx, Engels, Lenin, Stalin and Mao Tse-tung. His remarks to the 5th Congress on national liberation are invaluable to Marxist-Leninists here in the Afro-American, Vietnamese and Congolese struggles. His concept of the role of a M-L Party is extremely important for U.S. revolutionaries.

Study of Comrade Enver Hoxha's report makes it possible to understand the major contradictions in the world today. M-L'ists in the U.S. can develop theoretically and lead the people only if they understand these contradictions. While Enver Hoxha's report does not discount difficulties, its theme is revolutionary optimism.

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On November 8th, the 25th anniversary of the founding of the PLA, the 5th Congress concluded its work. It approved the reports of Comrades Hoxha and Shehu and re-elected its Central Committee by unanimous vote. Comrade Enver Hoxha in brief concluding remarks said, "We must carry the struggle against imperialism and revisionism thru to the end, make any sacrifice, our very lives if necessary!" As the Congress adjourned, all stood and sang the "International."

Comrade Enver Hoxha and Comrade Mehmet Shehu then led the foreign delegations to wreath-laying ceremonies at the monument to the martyrs of Albanian national liberation. After that a visit was made to the house where, 25 years ago, the Party of Labor of Albania was secretly founded under the nose of the fascist invaders. In the afternoon a giant mass meeting was held where Comrade Hoxha, Comrade Kang Sheng and delegates from Asia, Africa Latin America and Europe spoke. An amazing display of fireworks lasted for hours after the enthusiastic meeting.

A formal dinner was held with many of the Albanian delegates to the 5th Congress, members of the PLA Political Bureau and Central Committee, the foreign delegates and observers in attendance. So ended the great 5th Congress and the glorious 25th anniversary of the PLA.
