We don't make enough money to live decent lives anyway, but when our checks are shorted (right after the holidays, too) those responsible should be punished!

Under capitalism, our wages enslave us. That is, we make only enough to provide the bare necessities for ourselves and our family, in order to return to work the next day. This ensures maximum profit for the owner. In our case - that's the banks that control the Blues. And every year, as the contradiction between private ownership and the social character of our labor grows, we are less and less able to meet these bare necessities. Under capitalism we work to live. Under socialism we live to work because our labor serves us and our family's productivity.

Well, over a month ago, Ms. Brooks, a working supervisor in keypunch, gave notice that she was leaving. Torace, the boss, should have immediately posted a union opening. Instead, he waits until the last minute and proposes that

keypunch (they prepare our payroll) be subcontracted. His intent was to weaken the union and the fighting leaders we have in that department. Result -- Friday, January 3rd, nearly 50% of everyone in the hospital had errors and deductions on their checks.

What's worse, Fabilli told one woman who was short \$60 to take it or leave it! Damn him! Everybody has said "Somebody's gonna hurt that man!" That's no threat -- it is a statement of fact, unless management gets rid of him, Torace and other fascist types upstairs who treat people like they were undeserving dogs.

The CLP demands that these wrongs be righted. Yes, most of us got our money that same day, but do we have to be subjected to insults, arrogance, and security guards to get what's ours!-NO!

Blue Cross Meeting - A Sham !

At this late date I'd like to give a brief run down of what came down at the meeting between Blue Cross and the MHP patients. Right from the start the meeting was a sham. Patients remarked that the meeting was stacked with Blue Cross officials, hospital management flunkies, and many of our supervisors, who had been ordered to attend. There was poor attendance of MHP patients which reflected a lack of publicity on the part of Blue Cross.

During the meeting the patients charged that since the Blues took over, thier health care has been going straight down hill. Most folks felt that they were purposely trying to make the Metro Health Plan fail. It was also plain to see evasive answers to all their questions. The displaced Hazel Park patients were told, in so many words, that their health care and convenience came second and the money Blue Cross saved came first.

Dr. Deshler stated that under the present social system (capitalism), only two out of the three necessary elements needed to keep a quality health program going could be attained. These three elements were quality, accessibility and low cost. We, of the CLP must ask why in a country as wealthy as this one can't we have all three?

The end result of the meeting exposed the fact that under the capitalist system in which we live there is no acceptable solution to the public around health care. It showed that money (profit) comes first and people second! It's real clear that the only answer is free and quality health care for all which will only be realized in a social system based on the needs of the people, not profit. That system is socialism.

The struggle is not over! Hazel
Park is still closed and their 4,000
patients are coming to the rest of Metro
with no additional staffing. Pontiac
General is fighting for its survival.
Detroit General will probably be transfered
from a public to a private haspital.
Clearly, the struggle for health care in
Detroit is becoming a struggle for survival!

On January 26th the busses will roll in Detroit! It is no longer a question of trying to postpone or prevent the DeMascio plan from going into affect - now it a question of peaceful integration. The CLP supports busing because integration is essential to class unity and the fight for equal quality education for all children is a democratic right. Let us explain again that a fascist attack is the process of taking away democratic rights of all workers in general, by attacks against national minorities in particular. This is why we all must take an active stand against such groups as MAD (Mothers Alert Detroit), the Klan, etc. for it is they who further this fascist drive in building their support on the basis of white chauvanism.

A Strike Victory --

All II workers arrested during the strike got their charges dropped! Jessie got her \$100 back that she'd had to put up for bond. It is again clear - the police were working in the interests of management (aided by Burnett) to bust our strike. We want to thank our fine lawyer - Buck Davis, who had stuck with us and still, as yet, received no pay. Caution - we can't be fooled to think that the courts really give working people justice. Remember that first judge that denied our strike benefits?

Strike Benefits - January 19th --

Speaking of strike benefits - we again go to court on January 19th to fight for our strike money - \$40 a head. The case will be in Judge DeMascio's court. Make a point to come down.

Arbitration - Partial Victory --

The Heartbeat just got word that the following cases of recall were won:
Appointment Center Keypunch
Fiscal Services Cashiers
Medical Records Admitting
CSR - Purchasing Porters
Messengers

For workers at Metro Main who were not immediately called back from the strike, this means they will receive their wages (minus any unemployment collected) from May 7th to the date of their recall. We lost:
All the cases at Metro West

Tuxedo Receptionists, Conner Clinic & Metro Main Ward Clerks.
Why did we win some and not all?
Because arbitrators are arbitrary! It is clear to us, that if the workers would have judged this case, as they do in socialist countries, everyone would have been reimbursed. In fact, we probably wouldn't have had to even strike, since socialist countries are run politically and economically in the interests of working people. (Read the latest "People's Tribune" report on trade unions in the Soviet Union.)

"The Heat Is On"

For at least the last 5 years, workers at the Conner Health Center have been extremely tolerant in regard to the heating of the clinic in the winter and the cooling system in the summer. Their tolerance came to an end last Friday, January 9th, when they told the clinic manager to get the furnace repaired or they would walk off their jobs around health and safety. Management's immediate response was that anyone who walks, will automatically be suspended. The steward replied, "you'll just have to suspend all of us."

As it turned out, a furnace repairman was sent out that same afternoon and was able to get the heat up a little. He also returned the following Monday and Tuesday making numerous repairs.

During the four days prior to that Friday, the workers and patients complained about the heat and were told that the furnace was working at full steam and nothing else could be done. Well, something else could be done, and it finally was!

Situations such as these help to make it real clear that the brunt of the economic crisis does fall on the backs of the workers. Violations against the workers basic rights around health and safety are on the rise, and workers everywhere must be willing to stand together and fight against management's outrageous tactics.
