EXPOSES DIER

The following exposure of British im-perialism's "big brother" spy tactics is made all the more important by the fact that the information and photographs have been provided by a man who until a short time ago was a 2nd corporal, acting sergeant attached to Army Intelacting sergeant attached to Army Inter-bigence as a spy photographer in north-east occupied Ireland. The material cante to this paper unsolicited and from the private resources of the man con-cerned, who has now left the British aggressor army in disgust. His identity is not heing divulged for obvious reasons, though he has stated that he is prepared to testify publicly as to the validity.

QUESTION: What were you doing in north-east occupied Ireland?

ANSWER: Until a few months back I was a second corporal, acting sergeant in the British army. My specific job that of a spy photographer attached to Military Intelligence . . .

QUESTION: What did your work involve and how were the photographs you took used?

ANSWER: First and foremost it was

our job (there were about half a dozen that I knew of doing the same thing) to photograph all those people, men, women and children, who were thought to be "involved." These photos were sifted by Intelligence officers and wanted lists drawn up which were then passed on to army raiding squads who would, in dawn raids reminiscent of what I have been told about the darkest days of Nazi Germany, raid the ghetto areas of Belfast, Armargh, Newry and Derry. Officers of Army Intelligence always led such raids.

OUESTION: How were the people treated during these spy raids?

ANSWER: During one period of three days I constantly accompanied the raiders. This was so that I could photograph any "incriminating" objects found in the homes of those wanted by Intelligence. Incidentally, the most harmless leaflet or poster was photographed and later used as evidence of "subversive" activities. Many people have gone to prison for long sentences because of this sort of "evidence." Those raided were treated in a brutal and callous manner. Often their homes were just torn apart, while the British press praised the the

'security forces'' for their efficiency and Army Intelligence for their "fine work." Army intelligence for their "nine work." In reality I saw with my own eyes how they treated the people as if they were cattle. It was disgusting how these bullies pushed people around in their own homes,

QUESTION: How long has this sys-tematic camera spying been going on?


ANSWER: Since the first days of largescale military intervention in the north, but really for years, though not on the present scale. Army Intelligence, since 1969, has been building up dossiers and card index systems on known activistsand there are thousands. Anybody who and there are thousands. Anybody who was even merely suspected of being politically involved in struggle is photo-graphed by Army Intelligence photog-raphers. They are followed and their names, addresses and photographs are marked on "tribal maps" in various Ops, rooms throughout the six counties. rooms throughout the six counties.

QUESTION: Have any of these photo-graphs been sent to London?

ANSWER: Hundreds of copies of photographs and miles of film are circulating

30,000 CHILDREN AT STARVATION LEVEL IN NORTHERN IRELAND Stormont, lackeys of Whitehall, have refused to hold a survey into standards of nutrition of children in northern Ireland. This is despite the estimation by a group of social workers in north-east occupied Ireland thut about 30,000 children there are brought up at starvation level.

The reason so many children suffer such con-ditions is because of the pittance of a wage the breadwinners are paid by their bosses. The

• COURTS OPPRESS THE PEOPLE --NORTH AND SOUTH Two cases in December illustrate the anti-working-class nature of the courts both north

At Beifast Magiatrates' Court, Mrs. Marguarite O'Hare, a young mother with three children, was charged with the murder of a British aggressor soldier. She had to imp into court on crutches due to injuries inflicted by aggressor troops. The lackey magistrate revealed his inhumanity and viciousness when, despite the fact the court knew that Mrs. O'Hare had been crippied for life by gunshot wounds, he refused outright to grant her bail.

The other case occurred in the south at Bally-shannon where three patriots were charged with offences under the firearms act, at the end of December,

So scared were the authorities by the people's anger that they called in 150 gardia and troops to guard the courtroom while the hearing was in progress. 500 local people picketed the court-room in support of the patriots. Fighting broke out between the people and the troops and gardia, during which the people used paving stones to deal with the troublemakers. The people issued a warning that any further collaboration between the Lynch regime and the British ruling class would be strongly resisted.

SPECIAL AIR SERVICES REGIMENT ACTIVE IN NORTHERN IRELAND Units of the Special Air Services Regiment (a part of the imperialist British Army) have been on active service in northern Ireland since March 1971. The S.A.S. are specially trained in keeping down anti-imperialist movements and in interrogation techniques. Arch-people's enemy Lord Balniel has denied that units of the S.A.S. are in northern Ireland, even though the S.A.S. is being secretly used against anti-mperialist struggles in Aden and the Trucial States. However, the working people in N. Ireland are showing the representatives of British imperialism (its Army and S.A.S.) exactly what it thinks of them, and whatever low tactics the British oppressors may use they will never keep down the working masses.

•MORE OUT OF WORK IN THE SOUTH Over 70,000 workers are jobless in the south. Indications are that the situation will worsen in 1972 following 53 factory closures in 1971. Many of these involved important industries such as textiles. Capitalist financiers admit the increase is due largely to the economic situation in Britain. In the north, too, the unemployment situation is worseuing. The jobless total has risen to 8.5 per cent, the highest for 19 years. Many people suspect that the real figure is more like 10-11 per cent and that the bosses class is cooking the facts.

A group of middle-class intellectuals at a seminar held in Cork during mid-November 1971, admitted that Irish old-age pensioners get a worse deal from their gavernment than old folk in other European capitalist countries. Social Security benefits are even less and harder to come by for Irish pensioners than for pensioners in other countries. Only under a Socialist system will old people be able to live full and decent lives, without going with sub-standard and poor food, and almost freezing to death in winter, which is the fate of many old-age pensioners who live in a capitalist country. live in a capitalist country.

MASS RAIDS BY AGGRESSOR TROOPS IN ANTI-UNIONIST AREAS Although the British Army continues to raid the homes of Anti-Unionists, particularly in the Ardoyne, where in November 1971, 1.200 troops were used in one raid, there is evidence that there are more arms in the possession of Unionists than patriots. The British Army deny this, although they admit that the great majority of raids are carried out in anti-Unionist areas.

POLICE AND ARMY CRIMINALS CALLED IN TO QUELL KIDNAPPED

PATRIOTS 200 troops and police were rushed to Belfast's Crumlin Road jail early on January 9th after an aprising by patriots in the detention wing. An Army spokesman said ridiculously that "there was no question of violence" being involved. Crumlin Road jail houses many kidnapped patriots. Several have escaped recently.

ANSWER: Army Intelligence provided us with cover. They got us accredited as journalists and we mixed with the press corps for cover. Of course, we wore corps for cover. Of course, we wore civilian clothes. We were simply spying on the people. We were given the latest spy camera equipment, special lenses that would allow us to take shots from long distances and others that could take before during the dot photos during the dark.

QUESTION: But weren't the people ever suspicious of you?

ANSWER: On occasions, yes. But if I ever got into a tight corner 1 would produce a forged card provided of course by Army Intelligence, which said that 1 was from a Welsh-language newspaper sympathetic to the Free Wales Army, The idea was that this would make people feel friendly towards me and get me out of the jam.

QUESTION: Were your photographs used for any other purposes

ANSWER: Ves. one other important use was made of certain pictures. These were ones that were "set-up" for propa-ganda use in British papers and reactionganda use in British papers and reaction-ary publications throughout the world. We used to be ordered by Army Intel-ligence to kid a group of children into sitting with a soldier. Intelligence would sitting with a soldier. Interligence would give them sweets and promise them all sorts of presents which their parents could never have afforded with so much unemployment. The kids didn't know what was going on. They thought it was just a game. But it was no game as far as Intelligence was concerned. It was an important part of their job of trying to ensure that people in Britain and elsewhere were subjected to dose after planned dose of poisonous lies about what happening in the northern part of Ireland.

QUESTION: Who masterminded this aspect of Army Intelligence work

ANSWER: Men like Major Kennedy, Military Intelligence Liaison Officer between Special Branch and the R.U.C.

QUESTION: Why are you volunteering this statement

ANSWER: Because what I've seen and

what I've done has_siekened me. not trying to make any excuses. But the least I feel in my conscience that I must do is to make this thing public. You may be suspicious of me coming to you people. but anyway, this is what I have to tell you. I really believed that Britain was a democratic, free country. Now I see that this is not so. The British estab-lishment has created a police state in northern Ireland and seems intent on doing the same thing here in Britain doing the same thing here in Britain, I'm told that militants are being photographed here in Britain for doing nothing more than taking part in strikes. They always told me at school that it was socialists and communists who supported terrorism and "big brother" techniques. But it's not the Irish people who are the terrorists. I know. I've seen it from the other side. I've started to read about socialism now. The "Irish Liberation Press" I bought in a pub one night really made me think.

QUESTION: Is there much demoralization in the British army in Ireland?

ANSWER: Yes. A lot of men are confused and more and more are feeling

guilty about being in what they realize is someone else's country. There's no enthusiasm, apart from the real pigs who get a great kick out of beating people up. Yes, there are quite a few who are res, incre are quite a few who are demoralized and simply want it all to end. They know they can't win in the long run. QUESTION: Has the spying and the brutality frightened the Irish people?

ANSWER: No.

QUESTION: Now that you're out of the army, what are you doing?

ANSWER: I'm not sure. I've tried to get work as a photographer, but things seem tight as far as jobs go. I've walked miles. I've been unemployed since I came out, Funny, most of the people in northern Ireland 1 was instructed to photograph were protesting about being unemployed. Now here I am in the same position as they are. No money, no job, and I can't see what future there is until things are changed completely. That's what attracts me to socialism.

FIFTEEN YEARS FOR PRESCOTT Jake Prescott has been given fifteen years imprisonment for allegedly addressing three envelopes that were used in connection with bomb threats. This paper has made its position absolutely clear on the matter of individual terrorism. It is opposed to it because it would not kring down the British ruling class, would hot kring down the British ruling class, would not have the support of the masses, would be used by the ruling class to slander and isolate genuine revolutionary socialists, and because it is doomed to failure if for no other reason than it attempts to substitute a handful of individual-istic "heroes" for the masses of the people who must be politicised as they alone have the power to make the revolution. The people, not tiny romantic cliques, make history, in particular that the masses and the masses alone, armed with revolutionary politics and ultimately guns, are the midwes of revolutionary change. NO EVIDENCE

NO EVIDENCE If Jake Prescott really believes in this form of struggle then he is as wrong as anybody else who does. However, there has never been produced one shred of concrete evidence to say that Prescott was actually doing anything. Police lies are not facts, except of course in the courts of the bosses class. This paper has thus main-tained that Prescott should be freed and that fifteen years is a monstrous thing to have done to this man who shouldn't be in prison at all.

OTHERS WITH QUITE DIFFERENT MOTIVES

Pernaps most advocates of this form of futile, impetuous struggle genuinly believe it damages the exploiters and somehow helps the exploited neonle

the exploiter and somenow neips the exploited people. But there are others who are involved who have very different motives. These people, acting on instructions, understand how bomb explosions can be used as a means of attacking genuine and serious revolutionaries struggling for a socialist Britain and world. Precisely hecause individual terrorism can be used by capitalist newspapers, T.V. radio etc., it becomes advantageous, in certain conditions, say when a big political diversion is required, for the ruling class them-selves, through the special agencies they have set up to do this sort of work, to actually commit acts of sabotage and to hame these onto those acts of sabotage and to blame these onto those who they see as a political threat.

Too fantastic for words? It is easy to point to instances where it has happened, for example the way Hitler organized the firing of the Reichthe way Hiller organized the hring of the keck-stag building as an excuse to launch an allout attack against German communists and other social groups he despised. But, the reader might think, it couldn't happen here in Britain, in the 1970's. But it is happening here, reader. And there is every possibility that Jake Prescott is the latest victim of ruling-class organised sabotage.

SPECIAL BRAN failed to turn up and disappeared.

The man pictured here is a police officer, a member of the Special Branch, probably of member of the Special Branch, probably of the Irish wing. He was spent by his ruling-class masters to infiltrate the INLSF. For several months during 1969/70, however, it was Dick Jackson, as he described himself, who was in fact being closely watched by the INLSF. A dossier of evidence was drawn up and Jackson was summoned to a meeting to face charges. He

all Special Branch pigs Jackson, like working with all revolutionary organisations, had two functions to perform within the INLSF: the first was to get information about the organisation and its links with other anti-racist, anti-fascist, anti-imperialist individuals and organisations; the second was to set-up organisations; the second was to set-up people, to frame them ready for trial and imprisonment, as was done in the case of Smullen and Doherty, two Irish patriots now serving long prison sentences in ruling class jails here in this country.

JACKSON INVESTIGATED

JACKSON INVESTIGATED Over time a picture emerged. He would say nothing about his personal background. He claimed to believe passionately in the revolutionary cause, yet he had no previous political history and could tell of no involvement in politics in Ireland -in short his revolutionary consciousness had dropped straight out of the blue sky. meetings of the Palestine Solidarity Campaign and wormed his way into-the position of Treasurer of the Kensington-Paddington branch. He sought information as to how he could get into one of the Palestinian guerrilla training camps (on occasions the Palestinians have allowed neople who support their strungle allowed people who support their struggle against Zionism and U.S. imperialism to visit their camps). He attended meetings of the "Stop the 70's Tour". He asked a leading member of the North London branch of the organisation if bombs would be used during the tour of the South African cricket team African cricket team.

Jackson could never be contacted directly at work. He claimed to work at Shell Haven. Telephone calls to him always had to go through the personnel officer, who would get Jackson to ring back about twenty minutes later as the latter was always "out on the plant", as an engineer. Of course, this meant that Jackson's return call could have come from anywhere in London, anywhere in fact. Jackson could



provide amazing services, considering that he was a site engineer. He offered to get INLSF documents typed and photocopied. He would sometimes go on "holiday", without ever being able to give the organisation a contact telephone number or an address. He would sidle up to INSLF members and try to get a conversation going about the need for people to get training in the use of guns. He was very keen to get the job of compiling names and addresses of people and organisations the INLSF was in contact with. On one occasion he went with a member of the INLSF to the post office at Trafalgar Square to mail 1S7 letters. Consequently 157 stamps were purchased. However, the 'top 50' companies account for about half these figures with total assets of £17,781 million and total sales of £29,538 million. In the last five years the number of com-panies with assets of over £100m, has grown from 48 to 75. The table below contains the 40 largest companies. Of these 31 reported increased profits in their latest financial year including a 21 per cent rise for BP and a 19 per cent rise for Bass Charrington.

Perhaps you work for one of these huge com-panies? If you don't then the chances are that some of your mates do. These concerns steal resources that should belong to the people. They exploit vast numbers of workers here in Britain and elsewhere. In the colonies of Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean they mercil-esly super-exploit millions. As can be seen from the accompanying tables the amounts stolen are astronomical.

IMPERIALISM What picture emerges? These and other im-perialists have wrapped up raw materials and other resources and the peoples of most of the world (exceptions being socialist China, Athania and countries waging national liberation strug-gles) in their profit-sucking tentacles. This system, which is called imperialism, is the cause of wars throughout the world, in Ireland, Vietnam Palestine, and elsewhere.

Revolutionary struggle against imperialist ag-gression and exploitation is the main trend in the world today. When the peoples of the colonies rise up to free their lands, the imperialists hurt their armies against them to protect their loot. When one or a group of imperialist powers feel they are strong enough they launch wars against other imperialists who are weaker than they are in order to selze some of their territories. This happened in the two world wars of 1914-18 and 1939-45.

People are getting very fed-up with capitalist exploitation/ bad housing, unemployment, ever-inflating prices, attacks on the democratic and trade union rights of the people. People are starting to fight back. True, the class struggle is at a very low key in terms of revolutionary politics at this stage, but the ruling class intends to do everything in its power to see that is stays at a low key, and this includes doing everything it can to confuse people as to what socialist revolution is all about. In particular, the ruling class of financiers, commerce bosses, industrialists, land-owners etc., are keen to spread the lie via their mass media that a revolutionary is a mad, degenerate, anti-social bomber, who deserves to be kept in prison or hung.

COINCIDENCE?

COINCIDENCE? Look at some recent events. What happened within hours of the hig anti-Industrial Relations Bill demonstration held on December 8th, 1970 in most major British cities? Robert Carr's home was bombed (Prescott and Ian Purdie were charged with this and found not guilty after weeks of police lies at the Old Bailey) and the millionaire press, T.V. and radio inmediately were into action, in the absence of any facts, blaming it onto revolutionary socialists. The people were subjected to front page pictures under banner headlines for days which showed Carr and his family consoling each other, though none of them had ever been scratched. The message being peddled was all sympathy for Carr (and of course his Industrial Relations Act)

and hate for those who oppose it. In short, a hig diversion away from what the Industrial Relations Act is and a slanderous attack against the wor-king class which is fighting it.

Next, thousands of workers occupied the Upper Clyde shipyards in protest against the threat of massive sackings. What happened within hours of this? Davies's home was the scene of an explosion. Another massive propaganda attack against the working class, innuendoes that it was something to do with the Upper Clyde ship-workers, another diversion away from the very acute problems of these workers in a declining capitalist industry.

On October 31st, 1971 several thousand people marched through London demanding the with-drawal of British troops from north-east occupied Ireland and the ending of internment. The struggle in Ireland is a major comonent of occupied Ireland and the ending of intermment. The struggle in Ireland is a major component of the crisis of British imperialism. Perhaps no other issue has tested the ability of the liars and distorters in charge of ruling class propaganda as much as the need to confuse the British people that their master class is right in its rape of the people of another country. Moreover, the fact that Ireland, unlike any other colonial struggle, is within a stone's throw of this country, coupled with the political potential that comes with one and a hallwrish immigrants having been forced to leave their families and friends to come to Britian to seek work, makes the Irish struggle a very hot potato indeed for the crisisridden imperialist class. Hence, diversions, any diversion, whether it is trying to kid people that the root of the problem is religious (when it is obviously a class question in essence), or creating explosions and then blaming those who support a national liberation struggle and the building of a socialist Ireland for them all-becomes the order of the day. What happened within hours of the October 31st demonstration against the troops and internment? There was an explosion at the Post Office Tower in central London, and to and behold, once again, without an explosion at the Post Office rower in contain London, and to and behold, once again, without any facts, although it is understood arrests have been made, which in itself means nothing, another huge propagnda diversion was hurtled into being on the front pages of every reactionary newspaper, and the latest anti-Irish smear campaign had commenced.

Well, maybe all this is really just coincidence, weit, maybe an init's reaction of the ruling class at all, just circumstantial. Maybe there are some misguided people at work involving themselves in individual terrorism. This paper certainly doesn't know the answer to that sibility.

DEFINITE EVIDENCE But maybe it's not an accident. Maybe the ruling class have entered a new phase that accords with its insoluble contradictions. Maybe the Special Air Service, the unit of the armed forces trained in sabotage and terrorism (and the ruling class does not deny that the SAS is a sabotage organization) is not only working away at the moment in Ireland (the authorities

have admitted that the SAS is working there) and Dhofar (two members of the SAS were killed by patriots in this oil state in recent weeks which is currently the scene of a termemdous anti-imperialist struggle). Maybe the SAS or something like it such as a wing of Special Branch, is at this very moment involved in sabotage here in Britain? Maybe the ruling class is of appring to use such diversions as an class is planning to use such diversions as an excuse to round up genuine communists, socialists and others who are struggling to put an end to the present profiteering system

This paper believes that this is happening. It has produced definite evidence. It is now re-producing this evidence here, partially in order to show just how criminal it was to give a man fifteen years for having done nothing more than allegedly address three envelopes, when pre-viously definite evidence was published but ignored in connection with another person, and partially because of the pattern of developments mentioned above.

stamping Jackson made an excuse to move down the counter, out of sight. At the end of the stamping four stamps were still left. of the stamping four stamps were shu terr. Jackson often asked about contacts within Ireland. Four of the 157 letters of the mailing were to people in Ireland. He had stolen four letters whilst out of sight, forgetting that this would leave four stamps over at the end.

One afternoon Jackson was caught going One alternoon Jackson was caught going through the diary of the general secretary of the INLSF. The diary had been left as bait for Jackson. Jackson possessed an expensive camera which he used to photograph people on demonstrations. He said the prints would be good for the "Irish Liberation Press". However, the printa rarely ever got back to this paper and it can marcly ever got back to this paper and it can safely be assumed that they were destined for the files of a very different organisation. The camera, which had been borrowed by the INLSF prior to the point at which Jackson was to be charged, was retained after his disappearance. It has since been stolen from the INLSF office, the organisation believes, by the police:

Jackson, had stated clearly that there was no telephone where he lived. He had to do this, of course, because if he admitted the this, of course, because if he admitted the existence of the phone it would have been much too easy a matter for the organisation to be able to follow his movements closely. In fact he used to display mock anger at the G.P.O. for taking too long to install a phone, a phone which in fact already existed. Jackson made a slip-up. He told a member of the "Stop the 70's Tour" to ring him at home over some matter. The person rang Jackson at his home number and when he couldn't get through, because Jackson was not there at through, because Jackson was not there 31 through, because rackson was not there at the time, the person rang the INLSF office to try to contact him. INLSF comrades in the office at the time obtained Jackson's number and rang it later in the day. Jackson picked up and answered the phone, Jackson had a phone all right-458

But there was one most serious piece of work Jackson tried to get the INLSF to undertake. In the autumn of 1969 he tried to get the INLSF to carry out an act of terrorism. For weeks Jackson had been saying that the organisation must do something more than organise rallies, demonstrations and political education classes. Jackson proposed that a bombing be organised. It was explained to him that the job of the INLSF was to educate and mobilize the masses for a revolutionary struggle, and that this was quite different from engaging in acts of individual terrorism. Political power, it was explained, grows out of the barrel of a gun, but it is grows out of the barrel of a gun, but it is the masses led by the working class who must grasp this truth in theory and apply it in practice. Jackson (or rather his masters) in practice. Jackson (or rather his masters) chose to make his proposal at precisely the time that the INLSF general secretary was on £1,500 bail awaiting trial at the Old Bailey on charges stemming from an anti-fascist demonstration which had taken place earlier in the year at South Africa House

When Jackson realised that his game was up and that he was to be charged in front of the INLSF, he disappeared.

ere are several people in the INLSF who will give evidence as to the validity of this statement. Moreover details of his activities statement. Moreover details of his activities and his photograph have been published in the "Irish Liberation Press" twice in the past year. The Special Branch are, of course, regular readers of this paper. It is due to their "support" that its street sellers are so frequently harased by uniformed are so frequently narassee by uniformed pigs. Not only have the police refused point blank to investigate or arrest Jackson and charge him; they do not even dare to acknowledge that "Jackson" exists. Terrorist bombers who are policemen do not get arrested. They get promoted.

Currently the two main imperialist super-po carready the two main imperiant super-powers are America and Soviet social-imperialism (socialist in words, imperialist in deeds), which are sying and colluding simultaneously in an attempt to divide up the whole world into their respective spheres of influence.

IN BRITAIN Here in Britain the exploitation of the working class is intensifying daily. Fascism is developing in Britain. Fascism is the capitalist/imperialist system in crisis, a crisis brought on by anti-colonial struggles which are reducing the area of the work that the imperialists are free to plunder at will, forcing them in turn to shift their difficulties more and more onto the backs of workers within the imperialist heartlands, such as Britain.

Wage freeze, productivity deals, legislation such as the Industrial Relations Act aimed at depriving workers of their hard-won democratic and trade union rights, the racist Immigration Act aimed at dividing and ruling workers by inciting them against each other while simultaneously diverting their attention from the bosses class which is the real common enemy of all workers of whatever colour, the incitement of religious bigotry in Ireland aimed at causing divisions there..., all these tricks are now being tried in order to increase the exploitation of workers in this country.

"WHAT CAN WE DO?" "What can we do?" say more and more people. Different answers are given to this important question. Some organizations that claim to be socialist, such as the Communist Party of Great Britain (what's "great" about it they have never explained) and the Socialist Labout League (the former called revisionist because in reality it has opportunistically revised away the fundamental principles of revolution upon which communism is based, the latter a Trotskylte organisation) any that what is required is to get the Tories out and the Labour Party back in power.

Clearly this is seen to be nothing but a dishonest diversion which suits the ruling class because it sows confusion. The fact is that the Labour sows conjusion. The fact is that the Labour Party objectively represents capital not labour as it clearly displayed when last in power. Every anti-working class policy now being introduced by the Tory Government has its predecessor in policies pursued by the last Labour government, for example there is no read difference between policies pursued by the last Labour government, for example there is no real difference between Barbara Castle's "In place of Strife'' and Carr's

A study of the table of the major nationalized industries shows that in terms of profit per employee the three nationalized industries South of Scotland Electricity Board, BOAC and BEA all make more out of their employees than any

Britain, It should be pointed out here that the Britain. It should be pointed out here that the contrast between "companies" and "industries" is fair enough when it is considered that many of the privately owned companies virtually monopolise the industries they are in. So, from the tables shown it can be seen that the national-isation of a company or industry does not mean an end to the exploitation of the workers in it ir a strengthening of socialism. The essential point here is that the nationalisation theory leaves the capitalist class intact in power.

Moreover, in crisis times the ruling class will want to nationalise strategic industries so that it can directly control their rates of production and their pricing policies etc., in accordance with the needs not of the people but of the capitalist owners of the means of production, control and exchange. In times of crisis the besses will nationalise as part of the building of a fascist corporate state. The prolitable sections of the industries already nationalised will generally be handed over to private companies, leaving unpolitable sections still nationalised. These are kept going by workers' taxes and increases in the prices of commodities produced (such as coal) or services (such as railways), which once again have to be paid for out of workers' pockets. So from which ever way nationalisation is looked at, in a capitalist society it does not amount to changing anything for the working class. Moreover, in crisis times the ruling class will


The working class. As for "workers' control," a slogan championed by other Trotskyite organisations, such as International Socialism, suffice it to add that in a society that is divided mainly into two great classes, workers and bosses, only one class can have "control" at any one point in time. Workers' class have had their controlling power taken from them. And the tables shown here help establish for all to see that nationalisation under real workers' control simply cannot take place whilst the bosses remain in political control of the country. The "workers' control" notion is seen upon examination to be riddled with con-tradictions that the Trotskyites are understan-dably unable to explain away, no amatter how dably unable to explain away, no matter how they try in 'Workers Press,' 'Socialist Worker,' they try in 'Worl' 'Red Mole,' etc.

THE ONLY REAL ANSWER Real solutions must of course be based upon concrete facts. The most important of these facts is that the ruling class, which has the state machine of its army, police, courts, prisons,

up its profits' paradise voluntarily. Working-class rule can only be established through a revolution which will be violent precisely because the capitalist class will not give up pencefully. A look at what is at stake for them can be gained from the profits indicated in the tables shown. This being the case any talk of penceful transition to socialism in Britain is either ignorant twaddle or a conscious attempt to divert the people along political channels harmoless to the bosses. Political power grows out of the barrel of a gun and the British working-class will have to grasp this fundamental political truth.

Table only scientific answer to the question "What can we do²¹¹ is that the class must come to see that the political power it must capture to defeat the capitalist imperialist system operating in Britain, which has the companies listed in these tables as its backbone, is a power that is not going to be handed to it on a plate or in a hallot-box but something that has to be taken through struggle. Only through revolutionary struggle, as opposed to a fight for reform of the present system, can the expropriators be expropriated. The way forward for all socialists, all workers and progressive people in Britain is to organise the fight for the complete overthrow of the British ruling class and the establishment of working-class political power—that is the dictatorship of the proletariat. This means the overthrow imperialist class. It means the re-placing of bourgeois democracy, which in reality is the dictatorship of a small percentage of capitalist owners of the means of production, control and exchange over the masses of the people, by proletarian democracy, i.e. the demo-cratic dictatorship, represented by a genuine revolutionary party which has yet to be created in Britain, over the overthrown bosses class.

This is the only path that will lead to the kicking This is the only path that will lead to the kicking out of power of the big monopolists, the ending for all time of the state power of the ruling capitalist class. This is the only message the bosses are really frightened by, because it is the message of socialist revolution, which alone will signal their dispatch into British bistory. It is the adoption in theory and practice of this truth by the peoples of many lands that has ushered in the artest new era in which imperialism it endage to total defeat and Socialism is advar-cing to world-wide victory.







Violence is a class question



To those Black soldiers who have joined to inose black soluters who have pointed the British Army and are now he ing used as instruments for the suppression of the heroic Irish people in their just struggle to determine their own destiny free from foreign interference, I would like to ask you a few questions.

Why have you joined the British army? Why are you in Ireland at the behest of British imperialism helping to gas. Why have you allowed yourselves to be used as tools for carrying out the dirty work of British imperialism?

You cannot be a party to the oppression of the Irish people without also going against the interest of Black working people here in Britain, because just as we have been forced to pull up our roots and leave a country that we love so well and are forced to come here to seek a living, so it is with the people of Ireland who have for centuries heen forced to emigrate from their beloved country because of imperialist plunder and aggression, the like of which you are now participating

Imperialism has bled our country dry, the very same way they have done to Ireland. Just as the profiteers have and still try to whip up racism so they can divide and rule workers here in Britain. to in Ireland they try the same old business, only there where you are they use religion to divide the people and try to spread the lie that it is a religious struggle when clearly it is a question of one class -the exploited working class—doing battle against another class—the ex-ploiting basses.

The Irish people have the same class interest as us Black workers and thus when you attack them you also attack all of us Black brothers and sisters fighting oppression here.

Why is it that you, a slave who still hasn't gained his freedom, is fighting the hasn't guinea his freedom, is fighting the dirty war of your master, who is your real enemy, ogainst the brave Irish people, who are your real friends? A slave yourself you assist in the enslave-ment of others. Have you last your sense of reasoning? Has your mind become so warped that you fail to see reality?

I say to you, let's take a look at the Black experience in this country. You know that we as people face open and hidden racism, exploitation and oppression, and police brutality daily. Do you know that

arrested on pretext by the racist police and in lots of instances brutally beaten, locked up, refused bail, and are then brought before the reactionary courts where the same police lie their heads off and the judge accepts whatever they say and convicts us when we have done nothing wrong. Everywhere there are Black people this goes on. Why don't you buy a copy of "Soledad Brothers", you might learn a lot from its pages.

Look at that beautiful sister, Angela Davis, who has committed no offence but has been framed by the same fascist gangsters headed by Nixon that control America. Have you heard about the many Black brothers who were massacred at Attica Jail in New York State? Do you know about the millions and millions of Black people struggling against fascist oppression in Rhodesia and South Africa. and in Mazambique and Angola?

Is this enough to aquaint you with some of the problems of Black people? Don't you see ... are you blind ... that all you see ... are you blind ... that all your energies are being directed in the wrong direction. So useful are you to your masters that the papers of the rich hot res in Pointed and the papers of the rich bosses in Britain (and no doubt elsewhere in the world) have been carrying lots of more eager than your white mates to attack the Irish people. You are being used not only to try to keep down the legitimate struggle of the Irish people for independence and socialism, but also to assist racist divide and rule in this assist racist divide and rule in this country where your pictured exploits are splashed across the pages of every reactionary rag size to cause con-tradictions between Black and Irish immigrants, in order to set us at each others throat while the bosses class laughs its plump head off at our expense.

I hope this open letter from a Black British worker will help open your eyes so you can begin to see the light. STATEMENT BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE IRISH NATIONAL LIPERATION SOLIDARITY FRONT CONCERNING THE IRISH REPLBLICAN ARMY AND SINN FEIN 1. The Irish Republican Army and Sim Fein, both Officint and Provisional sections, are part of the struggle against the forces of British imperialism. In regard to this struggle the INLSF will side with the IRA and Sim Fein.

2. No thorough scientific class analysis of these urganizations has been made. However, the role of these organizations and the publicity they are given renders it necessary, even in the absence of a complete analysis of their politics, to say what can be said at this time.

What can be deduced from the various 3. What can be deduced from the various publications produced by these organizations is that at leadership level two positions seem to emerge: the leadership of the Officials appear to pursue what can be described as a revisionlat ine (i.e. they appear to be Marsist, but have revised away the revolutionary essence of Marsism) whilst the leadership of the Provision-als appear to follow a Catholic national socialist line.

4. Within both organizations there appears to exist at rank and file level considerable political

generally a low level of political which we believe can be (and is ed by the respective leaderships. being) exploited by

5. The honesty, sincerity and courage of the majority in both organizations cannot be questioned. Many genuinly seek the Socialist path. Unfortuately, at this stage of the anti-imperialist struggle there does not yet seem to exist in Ireland a revolutionary socialist leader-ship or any organization capable of scientifically working out the way forward, giving leadership to the masses, or mobilizing them around a programme that will lead to national liberation, the re-unification of a liberated Ireland, and the programme that will lead to national liberation, the re-unification of a liberated Ireland, and the setting up of an independent socialist people's republic. We understand that the coming into being of such an organization of the people is inevitable, a matter of time, and that many of those who are sow in the IRA and Sinn Fein will become part of such an organization.

6. Because of the lines dominating both organizations it is impossible for them to give adequate leadership in the fight against British imperialism and domestic renctionaries, although at present they appear to have taken the initiative. Despite the existence of what is clearly a situation that is ripe for the mounting of a massive anti-im-perialist campaign-notwithstanding the many difficulties and complex problems that have to

be solved---it appears that the people ure-not being armed either with revolutionary politics or guns by either of these organizations.

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

To sum up, the executive committee of the INSLF will give qualified support to the two groups within Sinn Fein and the IRA when they are involved in struggle with the forces of British imperialism and when they are in any way sub-jected to repression, such as is the case now with forture, interament and other brutual actions. However, the INLSF recognises the weaknesses inherent in the political positions of the leadership of both organizations and will not opportunistic-ally try to pretend that these weaknesses are not there. 

IRELAND, 1971 In November, 1971 the people of Ireland were under attack from British imperialism and its 14,000 aggressor soldiers positioned in the occupied north-eastern part of the country. 


so jeopodizing the jobs of existing airport workers. The management put forward various proposals. At a mass meeting 8,000 workers voted overwhelmingly to carry on the fight. A further 7,300 joined them. The management rushed to the High Court to seek injunctions against six shop stewards. Another mass meeting was held to take steps against scabs. Panic-striken, the management called in the police, who set dogs on the strikers, bruially assaulted them and even arrested 40. The workers were undauted by the fascist attack.

MORE WORKERS THROWN OUT OF WORK

NORE NORRES THROWN OUT OF WORK 250 Glasgow shipyard workers lost their jobs in December. Some of them who had worked in the yards for 50 years were thrown on the scrapheap without a pension. British Aluminiam announced in November that 10 per cent of its workforce would be sacked by July, 1,100 Manchester engineering workers lost their jobs as a result of a cutback. The British Steel Corporation is to close the New Tube Works in Momouthshire, throwing 1,120 employees on the dole. As long as capitalism continues there will always be unemployment. Only under socialism, where people matter not profits, can it he eliminated.



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TWO MORE POLICEMEN JOIN "THE CLUB" Another Leeds policeman has been suspended, the fifth in 12 months. P.C. Cyril Batty is accused of perjury following a "not guilty" verdict on a man he arrested for disorderly conduct. West Yorkshire Chief Constable Ronald Gregory (19,000 a year) is to face a tribunal after allegations that police cars have heen used for private journeys.

Up and down the country, particularly at senior levels, the police force grows more corrupt daily, and it is on the evidence of auch people that thousands of workers go to prison every year.

COVENTRY TOOLROOM STRIKE ENDS IN VICTORY 8,000 Coventry toolroom workers struck against the employers' decision to cancel the agreement which for 30 years has determined their rate of pay. The workers protested at such arbitrary behaviour by the bosses. The strike hit many motor firms. Chryster lost 22,500 cars worth £22 million. Failing to intimidate the struggling workers, the bosses agreed to a settlement which satisfied the workers' demands.



1971 was a good year for the people and a bad one for their exploiters. Imperialism sank deeper into crisis as the oppressed peoples and the working class intensified their struggle to overthrow the exploiters and win political power for the two-the themselves

One of the year's greatest events was the res-toration of China's rights in the United Nations. This signalled that the United States and the Soviet Union will find it more difficult in future to impose their imperialist will on others. The enthusiasm with which small and medium-sized countries welcomed China back to the world body shows that countries resisting imperialist aggression uppreciate the role of China, which has said it has no intention of becoming a "super-power". In this connection it is interesting to note that even the reactionary Irish government was obliged to vote for China in the UN debate.

CHINA: NEW VICTORIES, NEW ADVANCE In China itself the country's 700 million people devoted themselves to the task of building their socialist country with still greater vigour. The nation registered a 10 per cent increase in indus-trial output value compared with 1970. Steel output reached 21 million tons. Commune members up and down the country brought in the tenth good harvest running. China is now self-sufficient in grain,

These advances stem from China's achievements in the political field. The campaign to study works by Marx, Engels, Lenin, Stalin and Mao went into top gear as the people strove to deepen their understanding of socialism and apply their knowledge in daily life. The practice of officials participating in manual labour alongside the workers and peasants continued. This practice is almed at preventing a new privileged class emerging, as happened in the Soviet Union. All anti-working class ideas exposed during the Cultural Revolution continued to be criticized. Working-class leadership was strengthemed Working-class leadership was strengthened everywhere.

NEW VICTORIES IN INDO-CHINA On China's southern frontier the Vietnamese, Laotian and Cambodian people kept up their Laotian and Cambodian people kept up they fight against the US imperialist aggressors. Lao patriots killed, wounded or captured 300,000 enemy in the first ten months of the year. 3,500 enemy planes were destroyed and the strategic Plain of Jars was liberated.

Cambodia's patriotic fighters defeated a US thrust into the country in the early part of the year. 20,000 Saigon puppet troops invaded northeast Cambodia. 16,000 of them were wiped

In Vietnam 250,000 enemy troops were put out of action and 1,800 aircraft destroyed. The people there were well serviced by their "quarter-master". They seized 15,000 guns from the

All these victories prove the truth of Mao's statement that "the people of a small country can certainly defeat aggression by a big country, if only they dare rise in struggle, dare to take up arms and grasp in their own hands the destiny of their country. This is a law of history."

their country. This is a law of history." REVOLUTIONARY STORMS RAGE ACROSS THE MIDDLE EAST AND AFRICA More victories were chalked up by the people in Dhofar, a British colony in the Arabian Gulf. In seven years of fighting they have liberated 90 per cent of their country. A number of enemy towns were attacked during the year. Several British imperialist troops were sent home in coffins, including members of the S.A.S. (Special Air Services), trained in sabotage and terror. West of the Arabian Gulf, in Palestine, the Palestinian people kept up their struggle to free their homeland from Israeli-Zionist rule. And they stood firm against all imperialist attempts to make them give up the struggle.

MOZAMBIQUE: The war to throw out the Potruguese invaders continues. Patriots were especially active last year in Tete province. The

enemy suffers much harassment along the road from Tete to Malawi, where many vehicles have been blown up. An important enemy railway in the area is also frequently subotaged by the people. A British newspaper reported recently that a Portuguese terrorist had admitted to its reporter in Mozambique that the Portuguese are herding the local people into concentration camps GUINEA (Bissau): People's liberation forces were also active here. 102 Portuguese aggressors were killed in a single battle on December 200th when they attracked the Mores liberated area, 50 kilometres from the capital. The enemy commander committed suicide. ander committed suicide

SOUTHWEST AFRICA (Namibia): The down-trodden people of this country rose in nationwide struggle a against the South African colonialists in December. In an unprecedented strike move-ment 20,000 Namibian workers downed tools, ment 20,000 Namibian workers downed tools, puralysing the mining industry, transport, domestic industries such as dairies and bakeries, and farming. The strike was ostensibly against the "contract labour system" (slavery in disguise), but was largely a product of the people's pent up frustration over the occupation of their country.

of their country. GROWING ECONOMIC CRISIS IN WESTERN EUROPE SPURS ON THE PEOPLE'S STRUGGLE The economic crisis of the West European capitalist countries deepened. In Italy the capi-talists in October had 52 per cent fewer orders on their books than in the same month of 1970. The country's industrial production was below the 1969 level. A million people are currently unemployed with the big Fiat and Pirelli com-panies on short time. Prices in 1970 rose seven per cent over 1970. All this kindled the resistance of the people. There were many large-scale strikes throughout the year, sometimes involving millions of workers at one time.

In West Germany production stagnated, prices went up and so did the number of unemployed. 170,000 were jobless in October, that's a jump of 53.5 per cent over the October 1970 figure. The West German workers experienced a new awakening of class consciousness, the most noticeable example being the strike of 120,000 metal workers. The workers came out in late November, demanding higher wages. The strike ended victoriously on December 15th when the capitalists bowed to their demand by agreeing to pay a 7.5 per cent increase. Although such strikes were mainly economic, in essence they signalled a new level of militancy.

In France and in Scandinavia also, the o struggle grew more acute with strikes invol hundreds of thousands of workers.

STRUGGLE INTENSIFIES IN LATIN AMERICA, US ECONOMIC CRISIS DEEPENS, Main development in the Americas was the decline of US imperialist control over its 'allies',

a trend shown clearly by the big storm that raged throughout the year over Latin American countries' fishing rights. US (and Soviet) fleets have ignored the reasonable 200 nautical mile limits decided on by the Latin American countries and plundered these nations' sea resources as near as twelve miles from their land. resources as near as twelve miles from their land. The local countries with their small vessels and inferior equipment don't stand a chance against imperialist competition, Four of the main states involved held a conference in January to denounce the US and Soviet maritime colonialism. Such exploitation was also denounced at the Latin American Foreign Ministers' Conference in November, Ecuador was especially active in the struggle. She captured 51 US fishing boats from January to October and funed or otherwise punished the lot of them.

In other developments the new government in Chile nationalised five US copper mines and took similar measures against other US concerns. Many progressive measures were taken there, but it appears the anti-imperialist movement in the country may be in danger owing to the leaders' failure to take firm measures against the domestic capitalist class. There's a danger that the reactionary Army may seize power. Clearly this danger is inherent in a situation characterised by reformist rather than revolution-ary politics.

In the United States the ruling class was in the grip of its worst crisis since World War Two. Nixon in August imposed a wage freeze on the workers to stop them struggling for higher pay. He also imposed a 10 per cent surcharge on imports, which worsened Washington's relations with its "allies." In West Europe and Japan, without improving the situation for the ruling class back home.

In December Nixon had to devalue the dollar, the first devaluation in forty years. But what really struck at the US bosses' pride was the sending in of relief aid from Japan, one of US imperialism's main rivals, to poverty-stricken unemployed workers in the city of Seattle. 18 per cent of the people there are jobless, 48 per cent in the black community. There were many strikes in the US during the year, including a mass walkout by East and West Coast dockers. Millions of people were again involved in actions against the US aggression in Indo-China.

Events in 1971 show that we are living in a great new gra of world revolution and have every reason to be optimistic. India's aggression against Pakistan The present Indo-Pakistan situation is a product

of imperialist divide and rule. In Ireland, Britain divided its colony into two, granting phoney independence to one half and maintaining direct independence to one mait and maintaining direct control over the other, In the Indian subcontinent Britain divided the area into three (India and West and East Pakistan). In this way it hoped to keep the new states weak and dependent on British investment. The war in Ireland and the Indo-Pakistan conflict both steni from British imperialist aggression.

imperialist aggression. U.S. AND SOVIET IMPERIALISM ARE FIGHTING FOR CONTROL OVER THE SUBCONTINENT British imperialism declined at a faster tempo than it expected and the United States and the Soviet Union began to erode its position in the area. Recent events there have been marked by struggles between these two "super-powers" for domination. The struggle has centred on India, the largest state in the subcontinent. The two "super-powers" try to gain the upper hand in the country because each needs the region as a market and an outlet for investment. They also want to threaten socialist China and obtain a commanding position in the Indian Ocean.

India has become the pivot of a giant seesaw in which the U.S. and Soviet reactionaries each try to tip the balance in favour of themselves.

SOVIET SOCIAL-IMPERIALISM BEARS GREATEST RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE PRESENT SITUATION At present Soviet social-imperialism has come aut on top in India. The following figures give some idea of the depth of Soviet penetration of the control.

the country: 80 per cent of military equipment bought by India since 1960 came from the Soviet Union; The Soviet Union has given India 8,000 million

The Soviet Chion has given halo 8,000 million rupees in military assistance; Soviet social-imperialism controls 30 per cent of fue ali industry and 35 per cent of the electric power industry.

electric power industry. The "Indian Express" said recently: "Russia's long arm now reaches into almost every nook and cranny of the country's life". It added, "Mos-cow's envoy can strut around the country like the Moghul or the Viceroy".

PARISTAN-THE VICTIM OF IMPERIALIST AGGRESSION What has this got to do with Pakistan and East

Bengal ("Bangla Desh"). The answer is that Pakistan, unlike India, has to a marked degree resisted becoming an imperialist sphere of influence. Far from allowing herself to become a tool in the imperialist strategy of opposing China she has even established good-neighbourly relations with her. This independent policy has angered both the United States and the Soviet Union, which want to extend their influence in the area. the area

the area. The Soviet support of India's aggression against East Pakistan is aimed at widening Soviet social-imperialist influence to strengthen itself in the competition with U.S. Imperialism. These two "super-powers" aim at controlling the whole world, in furthering their interests they think nothing of trampling on the rights of other nations. This is how the U.S. is acting in Indo-China today (e.g. in Vietnam), and how the Soviet Union behaved in Czechoslovakia in 1968. Whether the official justification for such ag-gression is "defence of the free world" in the case of the U.S. or "support for the people" in the case of the Soviet Union, such actions are designed to further the respective imperialist power's domination over smaller nations.

The Soviet-backed invasion of East Pakistan has liberated no-one. The bayonets of the Yahya Khan fasciat clique have been exchanged for those of the Indian reactionaries and their hoodwinked supporters.

A sovereign state has been raped by an outside aggressor. Part of a country that has stood up against imperialist pressure has been turned into a base of imperialism. This aggression should be denounced by all anti-imperialists. The choice implied by the imperialist press and TV reports, namely, either support the West Pakistan ruling class or the Bangla Desh "freedom fighters" supported by India, is a false one. The third choice, and the only one for Socialists and other progressive people is to support those forces in East Bengal waging a genuine liberation struggle throughout Pakistan in their struggle against imperialism.

U.S. IMPERIALISM'S POLICY OF SHAM SUPPORT FOR PAKISTAN AGAINST AGGRESSION IS DESIGNED TO HIDE ITS OWN IMPERIALIST MBITIONS /hat is US imperialism's attitude towards the

conflict? It is one of condemnation of Indea and superficial support for Pakistan

There is nothing strange about US favouritism towards Pakistan. It is explained by Washing-ton's failure in the competition with Moscow for control over India. India is aiready in the social-imperialist sphere of influence and so now is East Bengal. In this situation US imperialism needs influence in Pakistan to shore up its own position. It also hopes that its "support" for Pakistan will draw help Pakistan away from its friendship with China.

US imperialism's support for Pakistan is, of course, determined by its own reactionary needs. If *ii* controlled India it would probably have supported the separatist movement in East Pakistan itself.


CHINA'S ANTI-IMPERIALIST STAND THAT EVERY NATION MUST SOLVE ITS OWN PROBLEMS Completely different is China's relationship with Pakistan, which is based on principle—the principle that imperialists, American or Russian, have no right to turn sovereign countries into their sphere of influence.

China has said that the internal affairs of Pakistan are a matter for the people of Pakistan to settle themselves, and them alone. China has not said that Pakistan must stay united at all costs. It is for the Pakistanis—those of the west and those of the east, to decide for themselves whether they are to stay united and how they are to resolve their internal difficulties.

THE WAY FORWARD FOR BENGALI MARXISTS-LENINISTS AND OTHER FREEDOM FIGHTERS The enemies of the East Bengal revolution are the ruling classes of West and East Pakistan. The West Pakistan ruling class in Bengal has been knocked out by the Indian invaders, who have managed to deceive many East Bengalis that the support an independent Bangla Desh, But the independent Bangla Desh, sponsored by India is a confidence trick, a cover for the creation through armed aggression of a Soviet social-imperialist political base.

EDITORIAL ANNOUNCEMENT 1. The workers who bear the main responsibility for producing and selling the Irish Liberation Press have reached a policy decision to incorporate the Irish Liberation Press into a new periodical paper. This decision is the product of several months discussion and is unanimous.

2. The decision has been taken because the coming into being of the new publication will serve the interest of the Irish and British working people who have the same common enemy that exploits them both, namely the British imperialist ruling class which through its ownership of the industry, land, commerce and finances of the two nations exploits the people of Ireland and Britain.

This common main enemy of both Irish and British working classes is like a huge clay-footed brute standing with one foot on the Irish people and the other foot on the British people. This brute can best be attacked by the workers of Ireland and Britian hacking away together with all their might at its legs to bring it down forever. Hence every blow struck against British imperialism in colonial Ireland is a blow of support for the struggle of British workers, and likewise every attack launched against this brute by the British working class is of assistance to the heroic people of Ireland in their glorious fight to clear their country of aggressor troops, expose and crush the Stormont and Dublin lackeys as well as their master British imperialism, win national liberation and march on to re-unite a liberated Ireland an independent socialist people's republic.

The new periodical paper will play a role within Britain in the raising of the political consciousness of the masses so that they will understand that to fully support the struggle in Ireland is in their own class interest, whilst simultaneously they must start work on the construction of a mass inovement and a vanguard revolutionary political party of the working class and other exploited people so that socialist revolution can take place here in Britain.

3. At the top of this page there appears the masthead of the new publication which will take the same uncompromising stand in support of the Irish people as has the Irish Liberation Press during its lifetime.

4. The Irish Liberation Press has been quite successful. The first issue came out in March 1970 and sold two thousand copies. Average sales recently have been about 9,000 per issue. The Special Historic Easter Issue sold 10,400 copies throughout Britatin and Ireland. But the real importance of the paper has not just been that it has sold so well despite all the many problems involved in bringing it out. The significant thing is that it has been a sturdy vehicle for the transmission of revolutionary ideas among the people. In other words it has been the clear, principled political line of the Irish Liberation Press that has caused it to be so well liked by its readers and equally despised by the ruling class.

5. The Irish Liberation Press has also done everything in its power to show that the struggle against exploitation and oppression is an international one and has always supported the slogan "Workers and oppressed peoples of all countries unite."

6: This progress having been made, why incorporate the Irish Liberation Press into a new periodical paper? The answer is that the workers who produce and sell the Irish Liberation Press wish to expand a true understanding of and support for the struggle of the people of a fish in water, sorting out their confusion, raising their level of political consciousness and winning them to revolutionary politics.

Such a paper does not yet exist in this country. The Jrish Liberation Press could never be that paper precisely because its appeal was in the main to Jrish workers in Britain, although quite a few class-conscious British workers of all colours did give it support. As long as this situation continued the millions of workers who are not Irish but nevertheless can be won would be left at the mercy of British imperialism's lie-machine which daily churns out systematically prepared distortions of the facts of the Irish struggle. So, although it was absolutely

Ireland from within Britain. Whereas the Irish Liberation Press has been a good platform for getting across news of what is happening in Ireland to Irish workers in Britain, the fact remains that millions and millions of British workers are politically confused—and are purposely kept confused by the British imperialist newspapers, television and radio—as to the class nature of the fight against colonial domination. Because, as has already been explained, in reality it is in the interest of British workers to give solidarity and support to the Irish people, these millions of workers in Britain are a huge resevoir of potential support, a potential that can only begin to be tapped when there exists here a paper which goes amongst them like vital, particularly after the pogrom of late 1969, that a paper should be brought out which exposed the brutalities being perpetrated against the people of Ireland together with their heroic fight back, it is now absolutely vital that the machinery for exposing the truth to the maximum amount of workers everywhere should be developed. The practical experience gained in almost two years of writing, producing and selling the Irish Liberation Press will be of invaluable assistance to the undertaking of this serious responsibility.

Moreover, the new periodical paper will be the appropriate platform through which not only the struggle in Ireland can be given adequate coverage but also 1972 the struggle of the workers of Britain can

the struggle of the workers of Britain can be reported, analysed and advanced. This will mean among other things that a new awareness of the class struggle for socialism here will be brought to Irish workers residing in Britain who, for as long as they stay, are part of this nation's working class and must be recruited to actively participate in the fight for socialism in Britain.

7. These limitations were inherent in the Irish Liberation Press. They could not be resolved nor the work moved forward and responsibilities shouldered in the absence of a new formulae being worked out through discussion and investigation which would be based upon a desire to serve the struggle of the Irish. British and world's peoples against imperialist domination and exploitation It became apparent that what the people needed was a voice.

The poor cannot rely on the mass media of the rich to tell the truth about its problems or advance its class interest. So, in the spirit of working class selfreliance, the proposal to incorporate the Irish Liberation Press into a new-type socialist periodical paper was wholeheartedly adopted.

 This is then the last issue of the Irish Liberation Press. The end of one phase of the struggle and the beginning of a new one, just as a child grows naturally into an adult.

The first issue of the Voice of the People will appear in time for May Day, an appropriate time for its launching when workers all over the world will be filling the streets marching under the banner of international working class solidarity and fight for a socialist world and the ending for all time of the system of capitalism and imperialism which is based on the exploitation of man by man. It will initially be published bi-monthly, will be the same price as this issue of the Irish Liberation Press, with an initial print order of at least ten thousand.

9. We appeal to all readers of the Irish Liberation Press to loyally support its successor, the Voice of the People. It will be different from every other paper in Britain, though many people are genuinly striving for the same ends as the producers of the new periodical. The producers of the new periodical paper hope that all genuine people up and down the country will over a period of time be linked together through the Voice of the People and that it will aid the eradication of genuine organizations for socialist struggle.
