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WHAT'S IN A NAME

Following on the great Ninth National Congress of the Communist Party of China, hailed by the forces of anti-Imperialism and proletarian internationalism all over the world as a tremendous consolidation of socialism, we have been treated to the spectacle of two International congresses of an entirely farcical naturs.

There has been the Communist Conference in Moscow attended by 75 parties which are in no sense communist and the Congress of the Socialist International in Britain attonded by delegates who are in no sense socialist.

no sense socialist. The Moscow Conference sum-moned by the revisionist leadership of the Soviet Union was intended to endorse the concept of "limited sovereignty" which is a term used by the social imperialist Brozhnew to cover the Soviet invasion and occupation of Czechoslovakia. It was also intended to underwrite the revisionist isedership's condemna-tion of China as the main enemy.

revisioniat leadership's concerning tion of China as the main enemy. Such is the disarray in the revisioniat camp that neither of these intentions was fulfilled to the 5 or is t leadership's satisfaction. Houmania was not likely to agree own frontiers to Soviet froops and revisioniat parties like the Italian, while having no liking for China's revolutionary leadership, were pre-pared to use the rift between China and the USSR to safeguard their independence of Soviet domination. None of these differences repre-sented matters of principle — only the manoceurrings of self-aseking in-dividuals and groups. The whole charade was typilled by the secretary of the British revisioniat party, John Gollam, whose party and press are heavily subsidised by Moscow, standing up and making brave noises about not being in sympathy with the invasion of Czechoslovakia.

sympathy with the Invasion of Czachoslovakia. The final wording of the compromise communique is full of empty verbiage about the continuing threaf of American Imperialism; but not one country which is or has recently been involved in struggle against US Imperialism was repre-sented at the Conference – not Vietnam, not North Korea and certainly not China and Albania. No doubt the Soviet leadership would have explained to Nixon that it was necessary at least to SAY such things. In any case their actions of collaborating with the US in trying to end the war in Vielnam on American terms, to get an accep-able four power settlement in the Middle East and to co-parate with the US against China in attempting to prevent the apread of nuclear weapons would provide all the assurences Nixon could want that the Soviet leadership is only interested in managing its own empire as it pleases while the US can do what it likes in beirs.

Just as ridiculous, though on a amailer scale, was the meeting of such notorious imperialists as, Harold Wilson, Will Brandt and Golda Meir under the pretence of being 'socialist' leaders of the so-called 'free world.'

called 'tree world.' Harold Wilson as the sgent of British monopoly capitalism is pre-sently waging an all out war against the workers of British and trying to legislate against their being able to fight back. Will Brandt is associated with the German imrecele' which is simply the victory of resurgent monopoly capitalism in Germany over the workers. And Goida Mair Identifies herself com-pletaly with the US-backed aggree-sion of Israel against her Arail repression of the Arab poole with ther conquested the de socialismi. There have been others who reckoned to outlaw "Strife" that is, struggle involving workers with their employers — but they made no pretence of being democrats even if they called themselves socialists. The Labour Front of Nazi Dr Ley was based on such a conception. The White Pamer is a rat bas of

The White Paper is a rag bag of proposals many of them purporting to remove causes of "Strife" but on close examination proving to be meaningless in practical terms.

The sections of the White Paper intended to be the most eignificant are those which threaten penalties or restmints on workers, including fines for taking part in 'unofficial' or 'unconsti-tutional' strikes.

tutional structs. Predictably the White Paper met with such opposition from workers that this was reflected in decisions by nearly every Trade Union delegate conference to oppose the White Paper or threatened legislation based on it.

Here we see a divergence between rank and file and so called leadership. The rank and file position was straight opposition and readiness to fight the Government. The leadership, however, while appearing to respond to this feeling began at once a long series of negotia-tions with the Government.

At the end of April the oppressed masses and revolutionary youth staged a militant demonstration in Falmouth, Jamaica, against the Shearer puppet government which represents the dictatorship of the big landloads and capitalists against the people and in the interest of U.S. imperialism. At this massive rally the people put forward their demands for work, decent living con-ditions, schools, medical zare, housing and sanitation and an end to police terrorism.

Among the many posters expressing in-dignation at the lack of jobs and miser-able conditions was a placard tied to a dog which read "Dog and all a look work"!

work"! As soon as Shearer's police heard of the demonstration they sushed in and broke up the march, threatening to shoot down any who resisted. This is in line with their recent practice of cordoning off the areas where the pooreer people live and in the early hours of the morning breaking into houses at gun point and beating, arresting and looting.

beating, arresting and looting. At a meeting a few days after this demonstration shearer openly boasted of the rich life he was able to lead as the tool of imperialism and the local oppres-sors. He shared the platform with a Kuomintang counter-revolutionary agent, Chin See, who is one of the biggest capit-alists in Falmouth. People in the audience shouted back sayings of Mao Tsetung.

Workers Subsidise Shipyard

One of the moves to save the Upper Clyde Shipbuilders from liquidation was the announcement on June 15 by the Boilermarker's president Dan McGarvey that his members would forego a nationally negotiated six shillings a week rise due in December of this year. This would save the company year, 1 £70,000.

4.70,000. He also said that Fairfields' boilder-makers, numbering about 2,000 men and the highest paid in the consortium, had agreed to a cut of 5d an hour — the differential over their opposite numbers in the other three UCS yards — a saving of another £83,000 a year.

The men also agreed to "discuss sensibly" three-shift working to improve productivity and besu tuilise financial aid to be granted by the government.

to be granted by the government. Thus the unions are bailing out the cupitalist bosses when the Government; refuses to advance the amount of capital needed to keep the UCS alloat. Instead of exploiting the contradiction between bosses and Government the union spokes-men for the workers are prepared to make their members foot the bill. Capitulation is wrong at any time. It is ridiculous when the class enemy is weak. The £150,000 a year that workers are investing in the UCS woa's buy them a single share in the company nor bring them in a single penny in dividends!

BRITISH IMPERIALISM NEEDS POWELL!

Once more we have been treated to Powell's blatant racialism, lying statistics and a calculated appeal to all the worst elements in British capitalist society, in his bid for the leadership of the Tory Pacty. And once more we bave seen the usual results of his performance — a intensification of insult and injury on black people living in Britain by the racialist louts who are among his most devoted followers, nauseating letters to the Times from all those Top People who have to admit that there is a lot in what he says and the hypocritical sugments from the Labour Ministers deploring his remarks while quicity taking advantage of the dust raised to pass their own racialist immigration and implement their anti-working class policies.

Racialism has been British Imperialism's Stock in Trade

Racialism is rooted in British im-perialism. The slave trade from Africa to the New World, which so helped British mercantile capitalism, saw the birth of naked racialism. The conquest of large tracts of Asia and Africa nourished reolalist ideas of white supremacy and chavinism. The British ruling class saw to it that the educational system it created both for the classes and the masses propagated ideas which would enable them to fight colonial wars and rule over millions of black people. The press, literature and entertainment of Victorian and Edwardian Britain reked of ingoism on the one hand and the denigration of the subju-sated I id an s. Africans and West Indiana on the upber. As the profits came

rolling into the coffers of the banks and shipping companies, into Manchester and Liverpool. London and Birmingham, so did the British ruling class recognise the value of racialism to maintain such a wastly lucrative system. And not only the entrepreneurs but also the phoney socialists whether of the "Christian" or "Fabian" persuasion found colonial wars and doctrines of white supremacy quite compatible with their ideas of reform.

But the value of black people as scape-goats is almost as great as their profit-ability. As British imperialism has begun to decline and the British ruling class has found it necessary to step up its

exploitation of the working class, make sharp cuts in the standard of living, raise the price of social services etc the presence of a black minority has been very fortunate. For diverting the anger of workers from the real source of their troubles nothing is so useful as an ethnic unionity which has through history been portrayed as inferior. Both Tory and Labour have made full use of the scape-goat role of the black population vying with each other over cutting down the number of black persons allowed to enter, using the propaganda machine to boild up scare stonies about the "pressure" of am-migrants on housing, education, etc.

Powell's Blatant Racialism is intended to Divide Workers

Why does Powell's racializt nonsense receive such extensive treatment in the mass media? The press covers his drivel in full and radio and relevision give him every opportunity to develop his monstrous ideas and ridiculous remedies before a mass audience. Ob-viously the ruling class who control all these media are very pleased with the job Powell is doing for them. This job is the attempt to anticipate the future in which the British working class will grow ever more militant with its deterior-ating conditions of life and to check this through all conceivable weapone. Powel-lism — a virulent form of racialism — is seen as an important weapon to divide the working class.

In the economic crisis of British im-perialism which is going to get worse the ruling class wants as many weapons as it can obtain to shackle the workers.

The Labour Government's racialist laws are combined with efforts to hamstring the right of workers to strike. Powell's raving is intended to split the working class on racialist lines. If large sections of the British working class could be persuaded to adopt the artitude of the dyckers and porters who marched in support of Powell last year the boss class would be laughing. White chauvinism among workers is simply class collab-oration. It means that workers forget who is exploiting them and join hands with their class enemy in a meaningless racialist pact from which they get nothing and the boss gets everything.

The racialism spouted in season and out by spokesmen of British imperialism like Powell is part of the general drive toward the fascistisation of British capitalism towards the fascistisation of British capitalism towards a corporate state. In such a drive the use of depostation, especially of those black workers who are politically con-scious and are in the forefront of struggle will play an important part. Powell's latest outburst on what is very much in line with such thinking.

very much in line with such thinking. The future is grim. On the one hand we have the British ruling class plotting its strategy by pulling out of the raybag of history mything that has proved useful to its brethren, in the past. The so-called working class leadenship as found in the labour Party and T.U.C. have exposed themselves as the enemies of the workers. Now comes the poison of weaklism. British workers must not be deceived by such a trick. In strongsle they are already finding allies among the black workers with whom they are making a common cause against suckings and closures, reduced pay and victimisation. This struggle must be developed so that all disreptuable agents of monopoly apptialism like Powell will be cut off at the roots.

It is now obvious that we have to stand on our own strength and rely on our own efforts, or like the Pressed Steel workers, we shall be sold out — left, right and centre. The fight must be where the struggle is and not left to the signifi-of the bosses.

WORKER-STUDENT STUDY SESSION

Industrial workers, trade union offi-cials, and militant student leaders from various universities and colleges meet together on Saturday, 31st May, at a study seasion on worker-student co-operation organised by the CPB(ML).

study seasion on worker-student co-operation organized by the CPB(ML). A draft Action Programme ard Analysis of the Present State of the Student Movement in Britain had been prepared to provide an orientation for discussion and future work. In the opening speech presenting the ideas behind ahe programme, it was pointed out that the principal current task of Marxist-Leninists in the student movement was the recruitment of a limited number of cadres to act as a vanguard. This is because of the lack of any intense history of struggle in the British universities over the past decade, and a higher proportion of atudents of petty-bourgeols origin in no mass revolutionary student move-ment et present existing in Bikala. Hereits in being reflected in the univer-sities which exist as imperialist inget

In order to carry out the struggle within the universities from a proletanian standpoint, Marxist-Lennist st ud e at s must struggle against the common enemy of both workers and students, im-perialism, which in the student context is the university as an imperialis insti-tution. Pure student demands for an ideal academically free university (seen when periali is +1 It uses that a student demands for an ideal academically free university (even when a they are couched in pseudo-revolutionary terms, such as university red based should be resolutely opposed, since their aim is to consolidate the position of students as a petty-bourgeois elite, thus reflecting the class origin of the majority of students. Such aims are obviously in opposition to the interests of the working-class. In this context the role of revisionists and trotskyites as mis-leaders of the student movement was examined.

teaders of the student movement was examined. The ideas of the programme and analysis were shown to have acisen from real struggles in British universities, consequently methods of work were dis-cussed including the use of various forms of confrontation such as have taken place at Sussex University and the LSE. The creation of left"centre" coalitions was put forward as an important aspect of base building, helping the ideological de-velopment of the "centre" elements. It was emphasised that Marriat-Leninar students must, to develop the con-tradiction they face with imperialism as members of the perty-bourgeoise, identify their future interest with that of the pro-leasent. This means placing their move-neast with that of the vanguard of the reverse. arty.

In the ensuing discussion some students expressed doubts as to the value of political work among students due to the ir predominantly petty-bourgeois nature. However generally both workers and students agreed on the necessity for Marxist-Leminists to carry out work in the students over the past thirty years, and that they were no longer a reac-tionary force that could be used for atrike-breating as happened during the General Strike. This was regarded as being in part due to an increasing intake of students from working-class origins resulting from the expansion of the universities and colleges.

Several speakers pointed out that under imperialism, university students not only found themselves in a privileged petty-bourgeois position relative to the working-class, but that they also found themselves in an elite position relative to the students et Technical colleges and teacher training colleges, where there is a much higher proportion of students of working-class origin. These students of the student movement could only integrate fully with the working-class, and achieve its potential revolutionary ex-pression through the Marriat-Leminist party. The party is the only political and erganisational form that can link together all revolutionary struggles in order to smash the monopoly capitalist state. Several speakers pointed out that under
