THE TUC meets on the 1st of this month. It will go through the motions of discussing the economic policy for the Trade Unions, and the Working Class, Unions, and the Working Class ions of income tax, productivity questions prices and incomes:

It will discuss safety measures within factories, social security, occupational health and pensions. In fact, it will caver the whole range of workers' aspirations within Britsin. The fact is that no matter the TUC's pronoun

cements, the working class will know very little about it, except as reported in tha capitalist Press and will care less, for the TUC's true connection with the working class and, indeed, the rank and file of the Trade Unions within the organised working class, is very remote indeed.

Because of this, the working class will, to its cost, ignore the pontifications that shall take place that whole week — for the TUC will seek to so change their Rules to secure greater power over the separate Unions, and thereby over the rank and file, the working class, in order to discipline them

them! One of the questions yet to be analysed is, how could it be that the thinking, active, so-called Left Wing of the Labour Movement could be alerted against the danger of Wilson's legislation against the Unions and yet, at the same time, fail to see the seconding of that duty to the TUC7. That this could have allowed by stream form That this could have slipped by stems from the complete inability at this time of the working class in Britain and this class's most conscious section, the Labour Move-ment, the Trade Union worker, to see the TUC as part of the State.

TUC as part of the State. Indeed, it could be said — et least in the past — Governments may come, Govern-ments may go, but the TUC General Council goes on forever. Fortunately, the workers are very direct. So that, while the manipulating and behavior behavior

lobbying, ell the handing and passing back of the dirty duties for capitalism between the Labour Government and the TUC go on, workers themselves are much clearer.

The steel strike at Port Talbot proved it, 1,300 workers of the Blastfurnacemen raised the banner explaining who is the Union. The Executive of this Union stated the strike was not official. Ron Smith of the British Steel Corporation (at £19,000 per year) suggested that to surrender to the simple and just demand of wage increase of approximately £1 is to surrender to the power of the 'wildcat' anarchistic workers

One of the things capitalism has to learn, the Trade Union Executives and members of the General Council who are even more remote from the working class is, that if they call a strike 'unofficial' or not, it is still there.

We do not suppose that the British Steel Corporation wants to employ the Executive of the Blastfurnacemen's Union, Executive of the Blastfurnacemen's Onion, even supposing at this time that all of them are capable of working so hard! Certainly it is very doubtful whether Victor Feather could be of a great deal of service even to capitalism, lining a furnace with refractory bricks — assuming he known how!

It comes down to the question of 'where is the power?' The British Steel Corporation needs the

Blastfurnacemen. All the Hoo-ha'ing and setting up of courts of inquiry cannot alter that Although the TUC may seek greater

RUSSIAN LEADERS THREATEN CHINA WITH NUCLEAR WAR

WITH THE defeat of revisionists like Liu Shao-chi inside China the Soviet revisionists lost the second round of their struggle to smash the forces of true revolutionary Marxism-Leninism led by the Chinese Com-Marxism-Lenitism led by the Chinese Com-munist Party under the correct leadership of Chairman Mao. The Soviet traitors had lost the first round in the early 1960's when they broke hundreds of economic and technical agreements, pulled out men and haped to bring the Chinese people to their knees during a period of great hardship. It was inevitable, therefore, that the Soviet leadership would try a third round – of direct aggression against the people of china. In March of this year came the attack on China's Chengao leland in China's north-eastern border with the Soviet Union (See The Worker for April). These were followed by many more attacks and provo-cations.

cations. The most serious to date was on the morning of August 13 when 2 Soviet hell-copters, several dozen tanks and armoured cars and hunreds of Soviet armad troops intraded into the Tichlickit area of the Sinkiang Uighur Autonomous Region in the western part of China. In a surprise attack the Soviet aggressors killed and wounded many Chinese frontier guards. At first the Chinase, to prevent the situation from gettin any worse, withdrew further. The Soviet troops, however, now reinforced by more meand tanks pushed deeper into Chinese territory. It was then, in self de-fence that the Chinese frontier soldiers by more men and tanks pushed deeper into Chinese terrifory. It was then, in solf de-fence that, the Chinese frontier soldiers repulsed the invaders. The situation is, however, grave and further aggression by Soviet Imperialism Imminent.

STRATEGY OF US-USSR IMPERIALISM

None of us should be under any Illusion about the strategy and tactics of the Soviet and US imperialists. Vice-Chairman, Lin Plao, was explicit in his report to the 9th Congress of the Communist Party of Chiras: "We must on no account relax our revo-intionary vigilance because of victory and on no account ignore the danger of US IMPERIALISM AND Soviet revisionism has whing a large scale war of aggression. We must make full preparations, prepar-ations against their launching a big war and gainst their launching a war at an party date..."

In the first place China, the great bulwark of socialism and staunch supporter of the struggles of workers and peasants in five continents, is the sworn foe of both US imperialism and Soviet revisionism. Both want to see it destroyed but are not strong enough to do it. Us imperialism, in particular, badly carred at the hands of the Vietnamese, desperately seeking a way out of that bulmder, is totally incapable of taking on the task of destroying China. She was taught a bitter lesson at the hands of Chinese volunteers at the time of the Korean War... Today, a greatly strengthened China, med with the mighty force of Mao Tsetung thought, is a formidable foe for all reaction-ary forces. That is why it greatly helps

biologii, is a tormudable toe tor all reaction-ary forces. That is why it greatly helps US imperialism to have Sovet revisionism undertake provocative acts against China. Indeed, every time the Soviet renogades have launched an attack on Chinese territory they have briefed both US and West German

they have briefed both US and West German officials, an unprecedented act. In the second place the Soviet Union's plans for world hegemony in its own sphere of influence demands that it not only hold on to the imperialist conquests of the Tsars (as opposed to Lenin's oft-stated views about liquidating all Tsarist expansionist gains) but increase its empire. As a result of the 19th century unequal treaties im-posed on China, Czarist Russia grabbed hage tracts of land from the Chinëse. Today the new Tsars of the Kremilin want to get even more. Sinkiang, for example. abo. gains) of the osed get even more. Sinkiang, for example, an extremely important part of China an tratgeically, at the crossroads of the ain routes between the rest of China and main west Asla, and economically containing as it does rich mineral deposits - especially uranium.

Of greater important, however, than the vetousness of the present Soviet Im-Of greater important, however, than the covetousness of the present Soviet im-perialist ruling clique is their need to have counters to bargain with US imperialism. They need something to distract attention from their naked colonialism in Czecho-alovakia and other east European countries and to be used as the price for some con-cession to be gained from the US im-perialiste. The 'containment' of China, the sell-out of national liberation struggles especially in Vietnam, concessions over East Germany - these would be important gains to the Soviet traitors in their horse-trading with US monopoly capitalism. But, like the US ruling class, the Soviet renegades will have to learn the hard way that the great socialist bastion of China is invincible.

RECENTLY some of us had the privilege of meeting Mrs Nguyen Thi Chon, a member of the Provisional Revolutionary Govern-ment of the Republic of South Vietnam, now a member of the P.R.G. delegation in Paris, when she visited London. We print our interview below,

MRS NGUYEN Thi Chon, a delicate, pretty woman, once a teacher, mother of two children, told us of here experiences as a member of the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam. "Relying on their own strength," she said, 'the peoples of Vietnam mere increasing their struggle and with the sympathy of the peoples of the whole world, including the USA, they will win.' but they know they have beendefeated. They can never conquer the people of Vistnam. The people of the world are demanding an end to the aggression of USA.' Listening to the gentle voice, not drama-tising but describing the borrors of this inhuman war, the lifelong separation of families, the brutal behaviour of Common-wealth as well as US troops, degenerate as soldiers fighting an injust war always are.





FIVE YEARS HARD LABOUR

AFTER FIVE years of the Labour Govern-ment; after the strikes for higher wages and better conditions . . are the workers better off in terms of actual improvement in purchasing power? The answer given from the Government's own statistics proves that the answer is NO.

In purchasing power? The answer server the Government's own statistics proves that the answer is NO. From October 1964 to May 1969 the cost of living had increased on the Governments' own phoney cost of living scale by 21.9 per cent. The average industrial wage had gone up by 27.3 per cent. So that on paper the wage increase outsirips the cost of living increase. But this is where the phoney statistics come in. The cost of living indexs does not take any account of increase in taxes.

does not take any account of increase in taxes. Every time you get a wage increase, you go into a higher income tax bracket so that your coding remains the same through intornal adjustments in the Inland Revenue computations. But in practice this means that more of your pay is taxed on a higher income rate. The 'avergae' industrial wage has gone up in five years from £18 to £23, but the tax paid by a married man with two children has gone up from 14/2d a week to £2.1.0, an increase of 189 per cent and no increase of pay allowed in the five years has been on that scale. 
THE POUND
