1. Discovery of a Rival Organization within the Young Socialist Alliance

Finkel reported on the findings of the Control Commission of the Socialist Workers Party. Since these findings reveal grave violations of YSA discipline, they were made available to the NEC upon our request by the SWP Political Committee. The SWP Control Commission findings and documentary materials gathered by it in the course of its investigation prove that the Internationalist Tendency is a separate rival organization conducting entry work within the YSA while organizing its own independent outside work — both under its own discipline, superseding the discipline of the YSA.

Motion: That the Internationalist Tendency's status as a separate, rival organization to the YSA be recognized and that members of this rival organization be informed that this status places them outside the constitutional provisions for membership in the Young Socialist Alliance.
