- 35 Prospects for Freedom in 1965, a speech at the Militant Labor Forum in New York, Jan. 7, 1965. Two hours. The speech and most of the discussion period are contained in Malcolm X Speaks.
- 228 Interview by the Young Socialist, an interview in the OAAU office in Harlem, Jan. 18, 1965. Around 45 minutes. A slightly shortened transcript, approved by Malcolm, is contained in Malcolm X Talks to Young People.
