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21 Years After The October Revolution

On November 7th, 1917 the workers of Russia established the first Workers State. Under the leadership of the Bolshevik Party and Lenin they were the biggest thorn in the side of the imperialist powers in the World War. When the Russian Revolution began to spread to Germany, Austria and other countries, the imperialists were forced to call the war off to defend themselves against the greater menace — for them.

Twenty one years later — 1938 — a new Imperialist War is brewing. The first Workers State, under the revisionist blows of Stalinism, is isolated, moving back towards capitalism; striving, not as Lenin did, to spread the proletarian revolution, but to check it, to manoeuvre instead with the capitalist powers for "peace pacts" and "collective security."

The 1871 Franco-German war brought on the Paris Commune. The Russo-Jap war at the beginning of the new century brought on the first Russian Revolution in 1905. The World War ended with the victorious October Revolution and more than two dozen revolutionary struggles.

If the proletarian revolution does not check the coming imperialist war then the world war will end in a series of revolutions. It is up to the revolutionists to organize a Communist Fourth International to be able to transform these revolutions into a successful revolution — to extend the October Revolution.

WORKERS VOTE AGAINST BOSS Raw Deal

November 8th is election day in the United States. It concludes a hot campaign. But while millions of words of usual election palaver are being peddled about, what is really significant is not discussed: WHO is going to vote in this election, and for WHAT?

MILLIONS CAN'T VOTE

According to "our" good President himself, two-thirds of the WHITES of Virginia won't be able to vote because of poll taxes. That probably means not more than 1% of the Negroes will be able to vote. Millions of Negroes elsewhere in the South and North won't be able to vote. In thousands of small towns dominated by steel mills, or textile mills, or coal mines the bosses have posted lists of candidates to vote for. Those who don't take the "hint" had better look for work elsewhere.

World Wide Protest for Negrete Grows

The campaign to free Rosalio Negrete American Revolutionist held in Loyalist Spain on frame-up charges, after once being freed, is continuing not only in the United States but all over the world.

UNITED FRONT GETS UNDER WAY AGAIN.

Chicago — The Negrete Defense Committee held a successful protest meeting at the Plebian Forum on So. Peoria Street, Wednesday October 12. Picketing of the Spanish Consulate by the R. W. L., and its sympathizers has been started for Saturday mornings.

Washington — Comrade Jack Reid of the Central Committee of the R. W. L. was sent to the State Department from New York to again check up on action. The Washington unit organized an affair, proceeds to the Negrete Defense.

Columbus — A United front of the Trotskyite YPSL, the RWL and the YWL held an affair and sent in \$10.00. Word has come however, that the Trotsky leadership has instructed its members to pull out of the united front.

New York — A united front of six organizations for the Negrete Defense have invited all other workers organizations to join with them. The six organizations are: League for a Revolutionary Work-

ers Party, Leninist League, Marxist League, P. U. P., an anarchist Group, and the Revolutionary Workers League.

We ask the New York sympathizers to watch for their announcements, and to give this committee full support.

Picketing of the Spanish Consulate by the RWL continues.

C.N.T. of Spain Gives Aid

The powerful C. N. T. of Spain has taken a hand in the Negrete case and will do everything they can to help obtain his release. The Spanish anarchists also suffer under the assassinations and arrests of the Loyalist-Stalinist capitalist government. In the past the C. N. T. did everything possible to obtain the release of the other American and international prisoners after the May 1937 uprising.

Scottish Workers Help

The Leninist League of Scotland has protested to the Negrin Government and the British imperialists who allowed Negrete to be taken off their ship on his second arrest. Their cable to Negrin reads: "Glasgow workers protest arrest of American citizen, Rosalio Negrete Blackwell on trumped-up charges. Demand his immediate release."

'Peace' of Munich Aimed At The Soviet Union

For the sixth time since the World War the four big capitalist powers of Europe have again established "permanent peace". The Spanish, Italian and German workers being killed and wounded in Spain, the Chinese, and Japanese workers slaughtered in China, the Ethiopian masses in Africa, still conducting a guerilla war, are no doubt deeply impressed by this great "peace". The four or five hundred Arabian people massacred by "peaceful" Britain in the past weeks, undoubtedly went to their graves comforted by the news of this peace. In fact it was such a glorious peace that on its morrow Chamberlain, Roosevelt, and every ministry in Europe announced new re-armament moves.

PRELUDE TO WAR

A similar "peace", we may add, was accomplished by a British-German conference in 1912, with similar pledges and vows. Two years later the great slaughter-fest began.

The present "peace", for all powers concerned, including our "own" American imperialists, is merely a lull before the war, a short breathing spell for better preparations. The outstanding factors of this "peace" were:

FEAR OF REVOLUTION

The fear of proletarian revolution that will occur during the war. The workers of the world, especially in Russia and Germany, put an end to the last war by rising up against their capitalist enslavers. In Russia they succeeded in establishing a Workers State. The imperialist powers have seen two dozen revolutions since that day. Even though world capitalist decay and contradictions will inevitably drive them to war, unless the revolution intervenes, the threat of proletarian insurrection has been a primary factor thus far in restraining the imperialists from the final plunge.

Hitler took advantage of the Anglo-American antagonism. U.S. imperialism refused to commit herself to aid or even give

"moral" support to Britain in case of war; just as she refused to support Britain's sanction program against Italy in the Ethiopian struggle. Behind her "friendship" for Britain she was trying to weaken Britain as much as possible.

In a war with Germany, whoever the nominal "victor", both sides would lose. Even if revolutionary upheavals could be momentarily derailed the imperialists would exhaust themselves and the U. S. probably gain at the expense of all.

England wanted a war directed at the Soviet Union, with Nazi Germany as the spearhead under British hegemony. To this end she was willing to make concessions, especially at Czech and French expense.

FASCISM STRENGTHENED

The "Peace" of Munich will result in the dismemberment of the Czech republic, which is already taking place to an extent, and the Fascist suppression of the workers and oppressed peoples in the Balkans. The struggles of the Spanish workers will next be liquidated by the "democracies" and fascist powers, and the world will see new moves to the right. The Spanish "solution" will be at the expense of the Spanish masses.

Germany will replace the Anglo-French bloc as the dominant power in middle Europe. The "Peace" of Munich has strengthened Hitler in his march toward the East, the Ukraine wheat, Rumanian Oil, and eventually the Asiatic markets.

LOYALIST FRAME-UP TRIAL BEGINS

Prominent members of the Workers Party of Marxian Unification (POUM) in Loyalist Spain, are on trial for their life in Barcelona, on frame-up charges of aiding the Fascists.

It is certainly significant that while the "Democracies", which the Loyalists and the Stalinists in Spain relied on, are preparing for a sell-out to the Fascists, these revolutionaries are being tried for treason. The biggest traitors of the working class in Spain are the Negrins, Caballeros and Hernandez's. The frame-up against the working class revolutionaries — who, in the main, pursued centrist and false policies of capitulation to their present accusers — is another blow against the work-

I.L.P. Protests

Fenner Brockway of the Independent Labor Party of Great Britain, informs us that they have protested to the Foreign Office of the British imperialists on the second arrest of Rosalio Negrete when he was taken off a British Ship by the Spanish Stalinist Secret Police. They will give the defense publicity in their press along with the other Spanish class war prisoners.

TRADE UNION NOTES

Franklin Roosevelt last month appealed directly to the AFL Convention in Houston Texas for "peace" in the labor movement. The movement for peace, has powerful support, including Tobin, Dubinsky, Garment Workers president in the CIO, Homer Martin of the Auto Workers in the CIO and many others.

Roosevelt's interest in "peace" is simple. The struggle between the AFL and CIO on the political field, with the former frequently supporting anti-New Dealers; the various strikes called by one federation against the other are a thorn in the side of Roosevelt's attempt to consolidate his political machine and further his centralization plans in industry and above all for Roosevelt's war plans.

DISUNITY HURTS ROOSEVELT

Furthermore the disunity of labor has had the result of an AFL struggle against Roosevelt's Labor Relations Board and other New Deal agencies and legislation. It has been an important factor in the loss of prestige and strength that the President has experienced in the last year.

If the New Deal is to succeed, if capitalism is to be further centralized and controlled under the present "economics of scarcity", and the "nation" prepared for the coming world war, labor must be united on a class collaboration program, behind the administration. Needless to say such a "unity" can be accomplished only at the EXPENSE of labor. Against it, workers must fight for unity of the labor movement on a class struggle program.

Preparations for the CIO Convention, November 14, have been going on for some time. Lewis intends to establish a new Federation of Labor at this time. A struggle over the question of the autonomy of the International Unions in the CIO is bound to break out at this Convention.

Strange as it may seem, bureaucrats such as Homer Martin and David Dubinsky, who have fought against every vestige of autonomy in their own Internationals, will be the ones fighting for their autonomy within the CIO. In that respect Lewis at least will be consistent. In his own Union, the Mine Workers, no Local has a bit of democracy. Those who oppose the administration are not only fired from their jobs (on the recommendation of Lewis' flunkies) but are beaten up and terrorized.

Despite the machinations of all the bureaucrats at the CIO Convention, the new hundreds of thousands of workers recently recruited into the union movement will be exerting enormous pressure, despite the fact that they will not be represented. Lewis, Dubinsky, Hillman, Martin, Bridges and Co. will have a difficult time finding a formula for derailing the natural instincts of the working class for unity in the labor movement on a policy of militant action against the bosses. In order to derail the pressure of the class, and in line with Roosevelt's plea for "peace", Lewis will probably leave the door open for unity with the AFL.

Shall Workers Support A Labor Party?

ROLE OF THE LABOR PARTY IN THE U. S.

A Labor Party movement in the United States, today, plays a far more insidious role than Labor Parties in the past. American capitalism is in decay. The working class is being roused to greater struggles. Millions of its members are unemployed; millions only semi-employed; wages are being cut again, while prices

remain at practically the same level. American imperialism, like the rest of world imperialism can find a temporary solution for its ills only in war. In order to exist it must reorganize the whole world. It is the biggest driving force towards war.

LABOR PARTY PREPARES WORKERS FOR WAR

But no war can be started, and no war kept up without the complete subjugation of the working class. In the last world war the American Federation of Labor played the key role in stopping the working class from striking, in keeping it patriotic, in gaining its support for Wilson's war program.

The narrow AFL is no longer big enough or suited to play that role in the next world war. A new and much broader instrument is needed. The first step towards the forging of this instrument was the creation of the Committee of Industrial Organization, the drive to organize vaster layers of the American Working Class on a class collaboration program. Based on this CIO and the various reformist parties in the U. S., the new Labor Party is taking form.

It is precisely this Labor Party which will be the capitalists' biggest weapon within the ranks of labor to keep the proletariat tied to the war chariot. It is no accident that the Labor Party has as its most powerful advocates such war patriots, such social-patriots, as Lewis and the Stalinists. No accident that it has received support from the beginning from the treacherous 2nd International Party, from outright bourgeois politicians. No accident that it can form blocs with the Republican Party in N. Y.

REFORMISM THE BIGGEST DANGER

War and fascism, these are the twins of capitalist decay, of the naked dictatorship of finance capital. Both are already looming on the horizon in the United States. Both are last desperate attempts by the bourgeoisie to stop proletarian revolution. Any party that supports capitalism — no matter how far to the "left" — supports capitalist war plans. The Labor Party is such a party.

Worse than that, however: because of its reformist role it will pave the way for fascism in the United States. By breeding in the working class illusions that capitalism can be patched up, that the working class can solve its problem by legislative manouvers and faith in capitalist politicians, it paves the way for fascism, just as the German Bruenings, Von Schleichers, etc., played the same role in Germany in paving the way for Hitler.

The biggest immediate danger for the working class in the U. S. today, is reformism generally and the Labor Party in particular.

WHAT KIND OF UNITY?

The Revolutionary Workers League is opposed to building or supporting once it is built, a Labor Party or any other capitalist or reformist party.

What kind of unity, then, do we support?

The R. W. L. is for the unity of the working class in ACTION against the class enemy. Not the "unity" on the parliamentary sphere for legislative manouvers — the split of labor's ranks and unity with the capitalists that the Labor Party achieves — but the unity of the working class in the trade union movement, etc., on a CLASS STRUGGLE PROGRAM against the bosses and their agents within the Union. We are for a national left-wing force within the trade union movement — AFL, CIO, independents, etc. — on a class struggle program of immediate demands.

Where revolutionists and Marxists are members of Trade Unions that have affiliated to the Labor Party, automatically making the revolutionists members of the capitalist Labor Parties, these revolutionists work inside these Parties (and the trade union) presenting the correct position in theory and action for a real working class unity.

In the Political field, we are for the unity of the working class behind the Marxian program, for the building of a revolutionary Marxian Party. **THAT IS THE ONLY TYPE OF UNITY THAT CAN SOLVE ANY OF THE WORKERS' PROBLEMS. THAT IS THE ONLY KIND OF PROGRAM THAT CAN UNIFY THE WORKING CLASS FOR ACTION AGAINST THE ENEMY.**

On the basis of the Marxian program real unity of the working class can be effective. On this basis the struggle can be waged for socialism, for Workers Control of Production, for a Workers Council Government, for permanent solution of all the immediate demands and needs of the working class.

But the Marxian forces in the U. S. are small, isolated from the working class — we hear that everywhere. What shall the workers do NOW? Isn't it better to unite just for the time being in a Labor Party? Our answer is, better a thousand times to have fifteen workers united on a program for proletarian revolution, than to have fifteen million united (as they were in Germany, England, Austria, etc.) behind a program of class collaboration.

The reformist program can only, in the final analysis, cause greater demoralization, confusion, and DISUNITY in the ranks of the proletariat.

Those who are looking for short cuts to the proletarian revolution can only end in the swamp of capitalist counter-revolution. The Marxists fight for their program patiently. Victory is theirs no matter how small they are or how isolated today.

"In twenty years nothing is done; in the course of a few weeks the work of twenty years is done."

Trotsky Committee Hinders Negrete Class Defense

After consistently fighting against a United Front of Workers Organizations, the Trotskyites have sent out a letter signed by 24 individuals (of whom 16 are known Trotskyites and sympathizers) as the "Provisional Russell Negrete Blackwell Defense Committee."

Comrade Negrete is a member of the Revolutionary Workers League. A similar Cannon-Stamm committee of individuals knew of his first arrest in April, kept it a secret from THE WORKING CLASS until the RWL, after receiving a postcard from Negrete at the end of June began a class struggle campaign, informed and secured the cooperation of organizations throughout the world. Working class pressure secured his first release within one month. Later Negrete was re-arrested while leaving Spain on a British ship. The American Consulate naturally did not give a worker revolutionist the same protection it would give a representative of the bourgeoisie.

FAVOR BOURGEOIS DEMOCRACY.

In their last pre-convention documents the Trotskyites stated that bourgeois democracy is a lesser evil to fascism, and came out for a "left" capitalist government, a Caballero-CNT government in Spain. The Trotskyite class collaborationist line on labor defense is directly related to their policy of material aid (and "political criticism") to the capitalist Peoples Front Government in Spain.

This new Trotskyite Committee of individuals, working only through the State Department, putting its dependence on the bourgeois state, as did the last Committee, will not embarrass the Loyalist Government and the Roosevelt regime too much.

The Stamm Revolt group has capitulated to this Trotsky line on Labor Defense. At the N. Y. united front meeting of six organizations, Stamm requested this Negrete Defense Committee — as another Revolt member proposed in Chicago — to dissolve into the committee of individuals. The Defense Committee rejected the Stamm capitulation and went ahead with plans for independent class action.

For Stamm's capitulation to the Trotskyites in not taking the case to the working class, the Trotskyites signed his name among the 24 listed.

CLASS CASE TO CONTINUE

Negrete will continue to have the CLASS support of the united fronts and world wide workers' protest. The RWL will devote its energies to this task. The support of individuals and liberals AS AN AUXILIARY to class pressure can be useful. But to counterpose "committees of individuals" against working class united front action is fatal.

Millions of foreign born workers won't be able to vote. "Citizens" of the District of Columbia won't be able to vote for national candidates. Army and Navy men won't be able to vote. Migratory agricultural workers won't be able to vote. Young workers, under 21, will be excluded. Hundreds of thousands who have moved from one city to another or one district to another in an effort to get work, or who like the Flint workers are being deported, will be kept from the polls. Paupers in many states won't be able to vote.

BOTH RAW DEALS

Answering the question of WHO is going to vote is really a good indication of WHAT those who can vote will vote for. Not one of the bourgeois candidates—Republican, Democrat, "Labor" Party, or Progressive Party—have pointed out the wholesale exclusion of millions of workers from the poll. In fact the two last named Parties have not even organized a propaganda campaign to show that it is almost impossible to get on the ballot as a Party in more than half of the States in the Union.

WHAT the workers will really be voting for, is candidates for two factions of the capitalist class, two different methods of keeping the working class oppressed — the methods of the Old Dealers, and the methods of the New Dealers.

The Old Deal will best be remembered for the shootings of the war veterans under Hoover. The New Deal, no less will be remembered, for its blindness to the slaughter of 11 steel workers on Memorial Day two years ago in Chicago. Under Old and New Deals, the same amount of workers are out of work — about 15 million. Under both mis-Deals, billions were pumped into banking and industry by the government, and starvation crumbs were flipped to the working class to keep it quiet.

THE WORKERS VOTE

Both Deals vary only as to method. Both serve capitalism. The working class must use the elections as a protest against capitalism. Vote only for those candidates and programs — the candidates and election program of the Revolutionary Workers League — which pledge to fight for the complete overthrow of capitalism.

Unfortunately this year the R. W. L. is able to run candidates only in Pennsylvania and Illinois Workers in Pa. are asked to write in the name of Bob Campbell for Governor; and in Illinois the name of Joe Hadley for Congressman-at-Large.



Sixth Plenum in Cleveland

The sixth plenary session of the central committee of the Revolutionary Workers League will take place in Cleveland over the Thanksgiving week-end. Over two dozen functionaries and Central Committee members will participate in the deliberations.

On the agenda are: the war situation, the role of American imperialism in world politics, the internal crisis in the U. S. and the new class relations, the defense of Rosalio Negrete — member of the Committee, the Workers Vote, Trade Union and unemployment, Press, etc.

Trotskyites Set-up Paper «Fourth»

The Trotskyites held a conference recently to establish the "Fourth International". After excluding all Marxian Fourth Internationalist organizations, against the advice of some of their groups; after throwing out some of their already far too meager sections, they proceeded to establish the "New International."

But on what a program! The "New International" is being built on the program of "transitional demands" listed by Trotsky recently, which includes as cardinal points such moves as liquidating into the Labor Party, preparing a new liquidation into Pivert's Party, in France, support of left capitalist governments, rejection of Lenin's position on revolutionary defeatism, and so on.

JUST ANOTHER CENTRIST GROUP

Trotsky's "Fourth" International is a caricature. He has captured all of his little servile groupings — none other were there to re-establish his centrist grouping as a more potent force against other centrist groupings, such as the London Bureau. Giving a thing a name — Fourth — does not make it so in reality.

The Fourth Communist International will be built on the basis of a Marxist program and as part of the actual struggle of the workers of the world against capitalism — instead of the meeting of a sterile clique on an opportunist platform.

The "Peace" was accomplished directly at the expense of the Soviet Union. The French bourgeoisie did not hesitate a minute in betraying their Soviet "ally", as all bourgeoisies would not hesitate a moment in betraying the Workers State. The "Peace" of Munich showed the bankruptcy of the "collective security" position of the Stalinists, the treachery of the Franco-Soviet pact and the slogan of defend democracy against fascism.

As a result of her isolation the Soviet Union under Stalinism will be driven to further capitulations to imperialism and a further shift to the right, new purges and concessions to capitalist elements inside the S. U. Stalinism's vain attempts to get around the isolation by deals and pacts with capitalist governments, instead of relying on the working class and a revolutionary Marxian line of extending the October Revolution, an impossibility for Stalinism — will only increase the isolation and danger for the Workers State.

FRANCE MOVES TO FASCISM

The "Peace" will sharpen the class relations in France. The weakened French position in world politics will force her to new "economy" measures, and new onslaughts on the wages and conditions of the French workers.

The bonapartist Daladier is a big step towards a French Hitler and a sure sign of the discontent of the French workers.

The "Peace" revealed the process of economic decay in the capitalist countries, with Fascism forced to take aggressive military measures in order to survive, and bourgeois democracy forced to concede points because of their own internal weakness.

On a world scale the "Peace" showed bourgeois democracy crumbling before fascism, moving ever closer to establishing class peace, preparing the way for fascism, taking the first steps of open dictatorial powers as Daladier and Chamberlain both did in relation to the munitions and other workers. The world capitalists are finding they can no longer rule by the "old" bourgeois democratic means. That includes the United States.

FIGHT CAPITALISM TO FIGHT FASCISM

Only independent working class action, not "peace pacts" and "collective security", but the proletarian revolution, the overthrow of capitalism, can successfully combat Fascism and end imperialist war. The solution for Europe is the United Socialist Soviet Republics of Europe. The weapon for organizing and leading the class to the revolution is and can only be a new Fourth Communist International. Check Fascism by working in the class struggle for the social revolution!
