FIGHT FASCISM

Fascist successes in the European elections are a wake up call to the working class and the left. They show the potential for fascism to grow in the months and years ahead.

New Labour is responsible for this growing threat: it's love-in with the global corporations means increasing deprivation, poor housing and crumbling services, breeding despair among the poorest workers.

The economic crisis gripping the world threatens to turn us against each other instead of against the main enemy, capitalism.

The Labour party, pro-capitalist and unable to solve the crisis of their system, is whipping up racism. It has scapegoated refugees for the cuts in services and lack of affordable decent housing. Brown recently used the term 'British jobs for British workers' and now we see it taken up by some sections of workers terrified of losing their jobs. It has accused the Asian community of not doing enough to assimilate, while it is the Labour-

controlled councils in Burnley and Oldham that have segregated whites and Asians into separate communities and then forced them to compete for ever-shrinking funding. Fascism thrives on racism and New Labour is making racism respectable. Labour's policies are helping the fascists.

But despite the big votes the BNP got the fascist movement is still tiny. We can smash it to pieces before it grows bigger. The Asian and black youth united with thousands of workers - black and white - has the ability crush the BNP on the streets and their counterparts in the NF.

Our immediate aims in the months ahead should be

geared towards achieving this.

The protest against the England Defence League in Birmingham in August 2009 show the way forward - mass protest to drive them and other fascists off the streets.

First off, we need a workers' united front against fascism as the basis of the movement. Anti-fascist, anti-racist, community, trade union, youth and anti-capitalist organisations must come together into one mighty force to throw back the fascists every time they try to meet, march, campaign or stand in elections. We must deny the fascists any platform to spread their views. Even allegedly harmless 'family festivals' like Red White and Blue are dangerous organising centres for reactionary racists and fascists, this is why it must be shut down.

Second, we need well-organised teams of stewards capable of dealing physically with the fascists - only this can make the slogan "no platform" really mean no platform. BNP leader Nick

Griffin plays 'Mr. Respectable' for the cameras while his storm troopers are out ambushing Asian taxi drivers and battering them with baseball bats, fire-bombing Asian shops and organising racist attacks.

The fascist gangs can and must be stopped - by any means necessary. We can drive them back into their sewers by teams of stewards organised by the movement and accountable to it.

Finally, we need to support community self defence. Racist gangs are emerging who are hell bent on terrorising muslim and asian communities. Well organised and vigilant community defence is essential.

What is fascism?

Too many "anti-fascists" are quick to throw the label of "fascist" at any right-wing politician or figure of authority that they dislike.

SELF DEFENSE IS NO OFFENSE!

On the big anti-war demos that took place around the country last year, some people even called Tony Blair a "fascist". The threat posed to ordinary people by a pro-business Labour government is not the same as that posed by an organised fascist movement led by the likes of the British National Party (BNP).

Fascist parties use reactionary ideas that are prevalent within society as a whole - such as nationalism, racism, religious sectarianism, and homophobia - to provide them with a unifying ideology. But

Fascists don't just try to win elections - they try to build a movement that violently attacks, terrorises, intimidates and harasses convenient scapegoats for the failures of the capitalist system. It is out of this movement that fascism hopes to construct fighting squads to attack the organisations of the working class as a whole - such as trade unions, anti-racist organisations, socialist and communist parties.

Fascism needs to be seen on the streets and project an image of "strength" to be able to grow. As BNP leader Nick

so do many other parties - meaning that you cannot, for example, identify a party as "fascist" solely on account of its hostility to immigration or its promotion of "traditional family values". It is what fascism does, and not just what it says, that makes it dangerous.

To take immigration as an example - racist politicians of the mainstream parties whip up anti-immigrant hysteria and then propose the "solution" of restrictive immigration laws to deal with the "problem". Fascists conduct and/or encourage a guerrilla war against immigrant communities by individual racists and gangs of racist thugs.

Griffin said in 1993: people backed "what they perceived to be a strong, disciplined organisation with the ability to back up its slogan 'defend rights for whites' with well directed boots and fists."

The BNP have started to march on the streets more, new fascist gangs like the England Defence League are emerging, and we need to fight back. What is needed is a new anti capitalist party that can unite the resistance to the crisis, against war and racism and fight for socialism. Only a revolutionary alternative to the despair of capitalism can finally end racism and fascism.

We would destroy the poverty that causes crime with a massive programme for jobs, education, housing. Capitalism can't do any of that - it can only give us more police in order to keep us down.
