No justice, no peace!

Across the country, young people, Black people, working class people, rebelled and demonstrated against the freeing of the cops who beat Rodney King. "No justice, no peace!" has been their demand.

Every working person must feel sympathy with this demand. Why give the ruling rich peace and quiet when they continue to lower our standard of living and take all the wealth for themselves?

The uprising by the people of Los Angeles is a struggle that must be defended by all working people. It was an uprising against the verdict freeing the cops who beat Rodney King. It was an uprising against the unemployment and poverty that the majority of working people of color are condemned to.

Why should all working people support the uprising in Los Angeles?

Because it was a conflict between a section of the workers and the ruling rich of the U.S. The question is: which side are you on? The single most important thing for U.S. workers today is unity. We must be united. We must support each other in struggle against the ruling rich.

That is why it is important for all workers and all workers organizations, like the unions, to demand:

Freedom for the 10,000 arrested in Los Angeles!

End the military occupation of Los Angeles!

Punish the racist police!

We must also learn from this struggle what we need to solve problems in the U.S.


The uprising in Los Angeles shows that the workers of the U.S. need a workers party to fight for a workers government.

What can be said about the entire governmental system in this election year?

The judicial system allowed the beating of King to take place and then allows the cops who did it to walk.

The Democratic Congress and the Republican president have allowed the standard of living to fall and fall and fall for 20 years. They have allowed the rich owners of the companies to bust unions.

George Bush, a Republican, and Mayor Bradley, a Black Democrat, both condemned the young people of Los Angeles and right now are continuing the

brutality against them by keeping them in jail and terrorizing their community.

The Republican program for Los Angeles is police and a tiny amount of money for small businesses to start. No jobs, no end to the police brutality. The Democratic program is police and a tiny amount of money for some temporary, low-paying jobs. No real jobs, no end to the police brutality.

A workers party and a workers government would turn things in favor of the workers.

A workers government could give the people of Los Angeles the money to rebuild the city. It could seize the assets of the rich who stole money through the

savings and loan scandal to pay for rebuilding Los Angeles and other cities. A workers government could re-open the factories that the rich owners of Ford, GM and others have closed and provide the people with high-wage, union jobs. A workers government could develop a public works program to rebuild the cities: fix the streets and the run-down houses.

Only in unity do workers have strength. That is why all workers must stand 100% behind the young people of color in Los Angeles. To solve the problems of the working people in the U.S., we need a workers party and a workers government.

Kroger workers: Do like the German workers!



430,000 German public service workers have been on strike for 11 days. The government and the union leaders have agreed to a 5.4% wage increase. The unions had demanded 8.9% to keep up with inflation. *All* public service workers stopped working. Workers blocked the trains from running.

No planes flew, no mail was delivered, no garbage was picked up, nothing. Nowhere. Now, it appears that the government is giving in. If you want to win your strike, Kroger workers, all the workers need to strike. Strike Kroger across the U.S. Strike all grocery stores in the Detroit area.

Justice for Black people and socialism

For many young people, the Rodney King verdict renewed the struggle for justice for Black people, in other words, the right of Black people to be treated equally in this society. Over and over again, Black people in the last years have seen themselves discriminated against simply because of their skin color. They are tired of it; they resent it and they are demanding that it end. Until it does, many are vowing "no peace." And they are 100% right.

Racism against Black people is older than the capitalist society of the U.S. But, racism is interwoven into the fabric of capitalist society. Racism is built into the institutions of the modern capitalist system in the U.S. That is why Black people talk of "institutionalized racism."

At the same time, the struggle for justice is not the same as the struggle for socialism.

What does socialism have to do with the struggle for justice for Black people, the struggle for Black people to be treated equally in all ways in this society?

First, socialism is a society in which they are no rich, no poor, in which all people receive all the things they need to live, in which all people are able to develop themselves to their full potential as human beings; a society in which there are all the freedoms of speech, assembly, religion, all without persecution. The only way to achieve socialism is for the workers to take all the social wealth — the factories, the banks — away from the rich owners. The workers will then and own the social wealth and use it to meet the needs of all the people.

Why can't we have the same economic system we have today, except that Black people are treated equally?

This economic system — capitalism — is dying. There is a world depression beginning around the world. Look at the closings of factories, the lowering of standard of living of all the workers, even the best-off white workers.

All rights cost money. The right of Black people to live free of police terror means that there must be neighborhoods as nice as the neighborhoods of the whites — parks, schools. The right of Blacks to live equal to whites means there must be good paying jobs for Blacks equal to

those of whites.

The rich owners are willing to lower the standard of living of the better-off white workers, and risk the social struggle that this is causing and will increase. They have no choice. Their system works only if they make profits. For sure, the rich owners cannot afford to provide these things to Black people.

The struggle for justice for Black people, for equality for Black people, flows into the struggle for socialism.

What do workers need to win socialism?

Workers need a revolutionary workers party. A political organization whose program is taking away the social wealth and putting it in the hands of the workers. A party that also defends the right of Black people to full equality; the right of Black people to self-determination, that is, the right of Black people to carve their own nation out of the U.S. if they decide to.


