Debates concerning an increase in the Indian army because of the growing menace to British power by the revolutionary movement in India, have taken place recently in the house of Lords, according to British Blue Books, just received, Lord Sydenham, formerly Governor of Bombay

"No one can possibly say what form the government of India will take, or India. The only policy that I can discern seems to be to do nothing and to wait until something turns up. I believe that before long something will turn up, and that it will be a great surprise to the British people, who have been kept in the dark, and that it will be a very unpleasant surprise. Since the Committee reported, agitation has been growing at a great pace and it has greatly increased in its violence and scope. It is more than ever necessary that we should have a contented native army in India"

Lord Sydenham recomended an increase in the pay of the Indian sepoy from 15 to 18 or 20, rupees a month with pensions for widows of the Indian soldiers amounting to 8 rupees a month for the mother and 2 rupees each for each child: One rupee amounts about thirty cents. He then continues:

"The need of a contented army in India was never so great as it is now, because never was agitation so dangerous as it is at the present moment. . . .
