
Gravest Step in League History

The action of the powers in in voking Article 15 of the Covenant posed by the banker clique which implies that they are ready, necessary, to proceed to Article 16 the grave section which provides for a collective international boycott and military action. Dynamite, i contained in Paragraph 2 of that Article, which is worth quoting. It follows:

"It shall be the duty of the Council to recommend to the several governments concerned what effective military, naval or air force the Members of the League shall severally contribute to the armed forces to be used to protect the Covenants of the League."
