Dear Comrade Hillquit:

I am informed that you will receive an invitation to attend a conference in St. Paul on November 15 called by the FLP of Minnesota. Invitations are being sent out to all the existing farmer-labor groups and labor political organizations to send a representative to this conference for the purpose of endeavoring to come to an agreement on the question of calling a national convention for the nomination of a presidential candidate and the adoption of a national platform.

I will be in New York on Thursday, November 8th and I should like very much to have an opportunity to talk with you in regard to this invitation before you take any action in regard to same. I think that it contains prospects which will be of interest to the SP as well as other groups which I would like to present to you before you arrive at any decision in regard to the matter.
