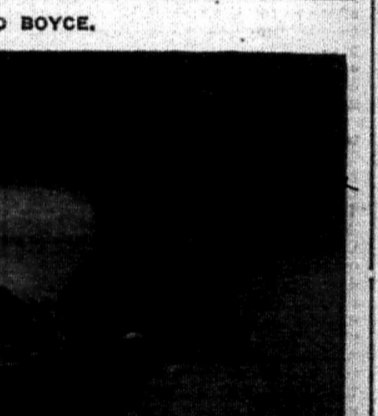
Further, you say: "The right to own, to possess property as individuals has been the base of all social and economic order; that this right has been extending and accentuating itself."
