ATTACKING SOCIALISM.

Before the war in Europe started the newspapers and magazines of this country, owned or subsidized for the purpose of conducting the growing strength and solidarity of organized labor, spent much energy in attacking Socialism.

It was not to be expected that the European war would bring this campaign of misrepresentation to an end. The war only furnished the anti-Socialist with new texts. It afforded the writer for gain an opportunity to invent arguments to outwalk the citadel of the big business interests that hire him.

While carrying on its propaganda to enlighten and educate the masses the Socialist movement must halt occasionally to reply to a lie or to correct misrepresentation.

No one can regret more than the Socialist themselves that the Socialist movement was not able to prevent the war in Europe because it held upon the people of Serbia, Austria-Hungary, Russia, Germany, Belgium, France, England and Japan such powerful force enough to stop the headlong plunge into the bloody shambles. Yet Socialism, young and hopeful, continues to grow and will achieve the final victory over militarism.

Perhaps the most insidious campaign against Socialism in that being conducted by the Catholic Church through Catholics who are members of trade unions. For this purpose the so-called "Militia of Christ" was organized. It is the offspring of the Social Service Committee of the American Federation of Catholic Societies. Now we find the weekly press service, used to promote this anti-Socialist campaign, circulating an article entitled, "Socialist Peace Doctrine Falls."

There is no word of the failure of Christianity to stop the war. Catholicism had a place on the royal throne of Austria-Hungary while Socialism was but a militant minority. Emperor Francis Joseph, whose being alone is able to guide the destinies of the dual monarchy and the Church of Rome, is the incarnation of anti-Socialism. No less the Greek Catholic "zar of Russia."

Socialism in the Catholic countries of Europe has received no support from Catholic rulers in its war against war. CAPITALISM has done its worst. For each and every one of these evils Socialism comes with a message of relief, and the only message of relief.

For the unemployed the Socialist offers work and the product of that work, by methods whose ability to solve the problem no one questions, and which is opposed only because they would make it impossible for anyone to live in idleness upon the labor of others.

For high prices Socialism offers a remedy which the bitter enemies of Socialism have seized upon in the midst of war and used with a success that proves that before this remedy high prices disappear.

For war itself Socialism alone presents a program that renders international conflicts impossible in the future, and that offers the only reasonable prospect of stopping the present wholesale shedding of blood.

Surely in view of these facts, unless reason has fled from the minds of men, unless ignorance and prejudice and slavish following of blind leaders are alone to determine elections, this should be Socialist year.

greed, turned thousands of square miles of green, velvet-like pasture into barren black desert.

"It has arrogated unto itself the mineral deposits, worth millions; it has debauched the public officials, from the lowest to the highest; it has enslaved the people; it has sapped the vitality of their children; it has debauched the morals of its daughters on the altar of profligate luxury."

"Time and again have the suffering citizens tried to protest themselves against the tyranny of this cruel, hideous monster, and as many times have they been crushed, beaten and murdered."

"The longer the soldiers stayed, the more friendly became the relations between them and the strikers. It was a common sight to see them playing a friendly game of cards, baseball and other games on the barren hill sides, with the strikers. Tons of food were split out of the soldiers' camps to feed the hungry."

"Surely such a soldiery could not be depended upon to create disorder, incite violence and rash and give an excuse to create heads of murder where whom the bosses hoped to provoke to disorder and thereby create public sympathy for 'The Master of Bread.'"

The state guardsmen had their eyes open and could no longer be used by the octopus to do its hellish work.

"A new labor-crushing device must be created; therefore, the state police was organized. These police were given little about the trials and sufferings of the workers. The men selected, wherever possible, were ex-United States soldiers, trained in the art of murder and who came in contact with the workers only when called upon to beat and kill them. Well-fed, well-kempt in every way, and cloaked with the power to override all civil authority, the constabulary was fastened upon this state in 1905."

But the growing power of the organized workers in Pennsylvania will soon drive the constabulary out of that state forever. While the Pennsylvania toilers are doing heroic work the question that confronts the toiling masses of other states is: Do you want the American Cossack? to be fastened upon your state?

MR. GOMPERS: I have already replied, and I now repeat, upon honest investment, yes.

MR. HILLQUIT: Mr. Gompers, assume that I purchase to-day in the open market and pay the full price for, say, 100 shares of Steel Corporation stock. The next quarter year I get my dividends on it. Am I entitled to such dividends?

MR. GOMPERS: No, sir.

CHAIRMAN WALSH: I think that is a proper question and pertains to this inquiry, but if you cannot answer it, you may say so.

Now, I am referring to the dividends on stock, which is paid to stockholders by virtue of stock ownership, and regardless of any activity on the part of the stockholder.

MR. GOMPERS: I am speaking of honest investment, too, which you did not include.

MR. HILLQUIT: Will you please answer that question with such qualifications as you may deem proper to make?

MR. GOMPERS: I have already replied, and I now repeat, upon honest investment, yes.

MR. HILLQUIT: Mr. Gompers, assume that I purchase to-day in the open market and pay the full price for, say, 100 shares of Steel Corporation stock. The next quarter year I get my dividends on it. Am I entitled to such dividends?

MR. GOMPERS: No, sir.

CHAIRMAN WALSH: I think that is a proper question and pertains to this inquiry, but if you cannot answer it, you may say so.
