THE trial which has attracted the attention of all the civilized world is now drawing to a close. It is universally admitted among people of fair mind that the prosecution has utterly and wretchedly failed.

Indeed, so completely has the fact of this wretched conspiracy and the innocence of the defendants taken possession of the working class and the public generally that the collapse of the case and the acquittal of our comrades is generally accepted as a foregone conclusion.

Just here the APPEAL feels prompted to issue a warning note. There is possible danger in over-confidence.

It is quite true that our comrades are absolutely innocent. We said this from the beginning and the trial has confirmed it beyond all doubt.

Remember that the interests of the most powerful corporations and combinations in the nation are at stake. Not only the Mine Owners' association, backed by the Standard Oil monopoly, is involved, but the powerful political representatives and public functionaries who serve these giant predatory aggregations.

PROOF OF INNOCENCE.

It is rumored that the failure of James McPartland to deliver enough manufactured evidence in the Haywood case has so strained the amicable relations that formerly existed between the gum-shoe gentleman and Governor Gooding, that they no longer speak.

MR. HARIMAN is being commended by the capitalist press for his statement that hereafter all accidents on his railroads should be carefully and impartially investigated by boards whose findings will be made public.

THERE is an old and true saying that "an equal exchange is no robbery." It is evident that so long as each gives an equivalent for all he gets nobody can be considered as a robber.

PRESS dispatches tell of the death of over a million people in India in the past six months. The cause of their death is given as the "plague." Judge Wood's ruling in effect says the state does not need to prove Haywood guilty, but that the defendant must prove himself innocent of the crimes alleged against him on the unsupported testimony of Orchard.

THE efforts of the prosecution to corroborate Orchard's charge that William D. Haywood and other officials of the Western Federation of Miners hired him to kill ex-Governor Steunenberg have amounted to nothing but a flat failure.

In addition to this, crimes committed in other western states were brought forward as proof of the general conspiracy alleged to exist.

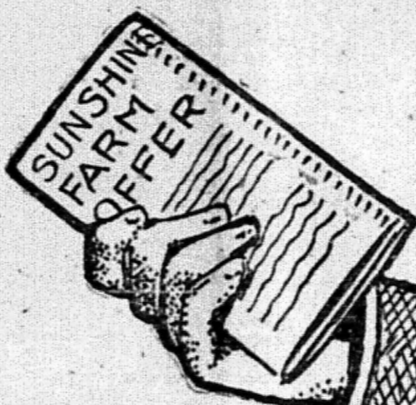
