INDUSTRIAL UNIONISM

Below will be found the full text of the article on "Industrial Unionism," contributed by Eugene V. Debs to the new Editors' American Encyclopedia now in course of preparation, and here published for the first time.

The term used to express a modern form of labor organization whose jurisdiction is not confined to any particular trade or craft, but is co-extensive with the industrial development, and embraces the entire working class.

The industrial union in its present form came but recently into existence, the trade union having preceded it, the latter dating back to a time near the beginning of industrial life in Great Britain, about the middle of the eighteenth century.

The earlier unions were confined principally to the skilled trades, and hence were called trade unions. These unions were built up on the basis of the skilled use of the tools used in the several trades during the period of handicraft industry, and later on were loosely joined together in a federation of trades.

The trade union rose with the modern trade and flourished with it. The foundation of both being the skilled use of certain tools in the making of certain commodities for market use.

As the industrial development prevailed for many years, but has now been largely superseded, and is rapidly declining before the march of industrial evolution, made manifest in the concentration of capital, the displacement of the small shop by the great factory, the handicraft tools by steam-driven machinery, the segregated trade by associated industry and competitive effort by co-operative labor.

Industrial unionism, having evolved from the lower primal forms of trade unionism through the successive stages of the industrial development, and adapting itself to present industrial conditions and their tendencies, has encountered serious opposition on the part of trade unionists as well as the employing class, the former tenaciously adhering to the craft form of organization and resisting all attempts to materially change its character.

It is in this fundamental principle that industrial unionism is most radical and revolutionary in contrast with the earlier trade union forms of industrial organization.

The concentration of capital and the highly complex productive mode of the present day, grouping in vast industrial establishments thousands of workers engaged in scores of different trades, and forcing them into closer and closer cooperation, based upon the minutest division of labor, have tended to obsolescence, or perhaps totally obliterate, the lines that once so sharply defined the skilled trades, and in this intertwining of the trades the jurisdictions of the several unions based upon them have overlapped each other, and this has been the prolific source of the increasing friction between many of the larger unions which have approximately reached their maximum of growth and are fearful of maintaining the prestige of an expanding membership regardless of the effect upon a rival union which may claim to have jurisdiction over the same craft, or division thereof.

EUROPEAN NOTES

Campbell, the noted English clergyman who recently caused such a sensation in international theological circles through his advocacy of what is called the "New Theology," seems to have entered politics, at least the labor party of Great Britain has asked him to become a candidate to fill the next vacancy in the parliamentary representation of Cardiff.

Madam Franska Formkins was hanged at Moscow, Russia, Thursday, for having tried to kill several prominent Russian tyrants, although she failed in every attempt. The government urged her to appeal to the czar for clemency, with the assurance that it would be granted, but she steadily refused to do so.

A Yarmouth, England, news dealer who was formerly a member of the board of guardians, has declared in court that his reason for failing was because he had socialistic views and lost patronage on this account.

The "Rodnoje Djelo," of St. Petersburg, presents us with a modern case of Lazarus and Dives by publishing a receipt held by a peasant for \$25.00 "in full payment for my future place in heaven, which, in consideration of my present homeless poverty, I hereby cede and bequeath to the wealthy landowner, Makar Selensky."

The report of Dr. Charles J. M. Bushnell, of Washington, D. C., is a convincing and valuable comment in Europe. He states that the United States spends six billion dollars annually on the criminal, pauper and vicious classes. This figure is based on what he calls "an extensive study of the social illness of the country."

The Russian government has amended its code of procedure in court-martial trials by reducing to seventy-two hours the time between indictment and execution. This action coincides with the reported sudden increase in the number of executions throughout the country.

Such indignation has been caused throughout Germany by the treatment meted out to Herr Wicky, editor of the Socialist "Volkszeitung," in Muelhausen. Herr Wicky was in jail undergoing a sentence of seven days' imprisonment for writing an article that the government took objection to.

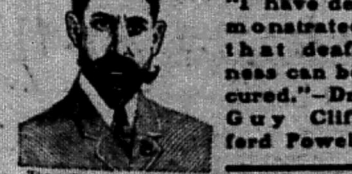

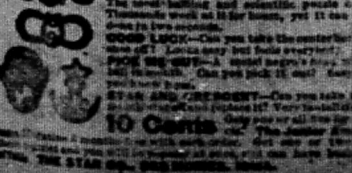

Capitalistic Calumny.

It has become the habit in the mountain states of the west, especially Colorado and Idaho, to charge every crime of unknown origin, as our readers well know, upon the alleged "inner circle" of the Western Federation of Miners.

Hundreds of crimes of all kinds have been charged by these organs of Standard Oil upon the Miners' Union, with which that organization had no more to do than the ghost dancers of Arizona.

A few days ago the assassination of Harvey K. Brown, the ex-sheriff of Baker county, Oregon, was reported. Instantaneously the report was spread broadcast by the vultures of capitalist journalism that the "inner circle" had again gotten in its deadly work.

It has been shown that Brown had bitter personal enemies among his own people and that these were in no way connected with the Federation, but all this avails nothing, for it is a foregone conclusion that the "inner circle" committed the outrage and there is where the culprit must be sought and the crime lodged.

Now comes the climax of this tirade of false and vicious accusation. A week ago the capitalist papers of Denver reported under great scare-heads that the police had thwarted an awful plot to dynamite a wealthy citizen; that they had discovered a huge quantity of dynamite in an adjacent lot and that Governor Buchtel, President Moffat, the multimillionaire banker and mine owner and other plutocrats, had received infernal machines by mail.

But, alas! Instead of the Federation it proves to be but a simple-minded blackmailer who wanted to extort a few kopeks from the plethoric pockets of his wealthy townspeople. He has admitted it all. His name is Kemp V. Biglow. He ought to be in an asylum for the feeble-minded.

What a misfortune that Biglow was caught! What a fine story against the "inner circle" has been spoiled! What capitalist hopes are blasted!

ECONOMIC CLASSICS

Wages and Revenue.

REPEAT that wages, interest, rent of land, profits of capital are social facts and concepts, i. e., facts and concepts which exist only because the individuals who participate in them are joined by the division of labor into a society; that from the very start one sets out from a false standpoint if one attempts to explain the principles which underlie those facts from considerations referring to the individual participants, from the standpoint of one of the many laborers, and so on; that one must, on the contrary, in an explanation of principles understand by wages, interest, and so forth, the aggregate wages accruing in the society, or think of the whole of the society as represented by one laborer, one land owner, and one capitalist.

Revenue, according to this theory, includes all income which is derived, without one's own labor, solely from one's possessions. The existence of such an income in society no one will deny, even though it be asserted that this possession is the product of the possessor's own labor.

As there can be no income which is not produced by labor, revenue depends upon two indispensable preliminary conditions: First, there can be no revenue unless labor produces at all events more than the laborers require in order to continue their work—for it is impossible for anyone not laboring himself to continue regularly to draw an income without such a surplus.

Originally it was slavery, whose beginning is coincident with that of agriculture and the ownership of land, which exercised this coercion. The laborers, who by their labor produced such a surplus were slaves, and the master, to whom the laborers and consequently the product also belonged, gave them only as much of it as was required for the continuance of their labor, keeping the rest or surplus for himself.

There is honor among thieves, but none among the betrayers of their trust. The thugs and plug-uglies that have been doing service as detectives for the mine owners and doing the people of Idaho ever since the Steunenberg assassination are not detectives at all, but simply bum hold-up men who find it easier and safer to do a job in the capacity of a detective than to take the chances of getting caught as a plain criminal.

"Incidentals Seeking Information"

The Haywood trial has added at least one suggestive item to our vocabulary of expression. It forms the caption of this article. No one need be told what it signifies or what it stands for. "Incidentals seeking information" is the sleuth vernacular for Pinkerton graft.

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But Biglow, a harmless clerk and not the Federation, is the guilty party. So, in the case of ex-Governor Steunenberg, it was Harry Orchard, a miserable degenerate, who murdered him and not the Federation. And likewise in the case of Harvey K. Brown, of Baker City, it was some individual miscreant, whatever his motive may have been, who committed the deed and the Federation had no more connection with it than the bushmen of Australia.

There is an object lesson in this Biglow incident. It totally and everlastingly discredits the capitalist press and henceforth its indiscriminate charges of crime against the Western Federation of Miners will be repudiated with indignation by all honest men.

The proprietors of the Acme went to the courts and a friendly judge issued an injunction against Lockwood restraining him from conducting a school of drawing, or selling his labor to anyone else or disposing of his drawings, or to correspond with his former pupils. In fact, he was restrained from doing pretty much everything except breathing. After many weeks of delay, involving a big expense, Lockwood's case came to trial—and he beat his persecutors. He will at once proceed to re-establish his art school, and I hope APPEAL readers who are interested in work of this kind will write to him for information, terms, etc. Address G. H.
