Wilson Still Considering From Press Dispatches. Washington, Oct. 29.—President Wilson is seriously considering whether he has authority to close Colorado mines involved in the strike if the operators refuse to accept the plan of settlement already accepted by the miners.

Attorney General Gregory conferred with the president and it was understood Mr. Wilson had asked him regarding his right to close the mines if public necessity, in his opinion, required that step. Mr. Gregory refused to discuss his call.

Ammons for John D. From Press Dispatches. Denver, Oct. 29.—"I see no occasion for closing the Colorado coal mines and imposing an industrial burden upon the state just at a time when the greatest demand for fuel is beginning," was the statement of Governor F. M. Ammons today when told of a Washington dispatch indicating that President Wilson was considering whether he has authority to shut down the properties owned by operators who have refused to accept the Davis-Fairley plan of settling the miners' strike.

I have understood that the president would withdraw the federal troops about November 15. In my judgment he can safely do so, and the state will be prepared at that time to assume responsibility for keeping order in the strike district. Referring to the visit of Mother Mary Jones and James Lord of the mining department of the American Federation of Labor to the president, Governor Ammons said: "I cannot believe that Mr. Wilson will pay any attention to the representations made by such persons, who are not residents of Colorado and are not qualified to speak for the people of the state. If the president seeks advice regarding the coal strike, he can obtain plenty of it from Colorado people."

Rockefeller Interests Back of Cotton Crisis in South

It is becoming more and more clear that the cotton crisis in the south is not entirely due to the European war; neither is it because the American people do not want every pound of cotton that has been produced, if they had the money with which to purchase it. It is the culmination of a long fight for control; and the king of America, John D. Rockefeller, has merely laid his wires so that he will make millions off the cotton slaves of the south, and the stock slaves of the north, though stock jobbery in which the government is aiding him.

"According to the attorney general all of the cotton mills in these states have been in a combine since 1900. The oil mills may be divided into two classes—"trust" mills and independent. The trust mills, it is contended, consist of Procter & Gamble of Cincinnati, with subsidiaries, the Buckeye mills; the Southern Cotton Oil Company of New York, owners of the Refugio Mills in Mississippi; the American Cotton Oil Company of New York, controlling mills in Mississippi, Arkansas, Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee and all other southern states; the mills being designated by the name of the state in which they are located.
