**TRUCKMEN STRIKE**  
Following the demand for a 42-cent day, the Truckmen of New York City, the Pittsburgh and Lake Erie Railroad went on strike recently. Two hundred construction men also laid down their tools. The strikers number about 500.

**MOLDERS ON STRIKE**  
Members of Local Union No. 255, International Iron Molders of North America, in Birmingham, Ala., are on strike in that district for a nine-hour day and a 62.25 minimum wage. Nine foundries out of seventeen have already granted the increase and the prospects are that the balance of the firms will soon capitulate.

**POSTED TO WORK OVERTIME**  
Charles Treacherly has by an attorney that women employees in certain hotels in Boston have been compelled to work more than fifty-four hours a week in violation of the State laws. The matter has been taken up and is being investigated by the grand jury shortly, announcement to this effect having been made from the office of the District Attorney.

**RAISE FOR STREET CARMEN**  
Division 594, Amalgamated Association of Street and Railway Employees at Springfield, Ohio, a local recently organized, has secured an agreement increasing the schedule of wages 1 cent and 2 cents per hour. This agreement will be in effect from October 1st and is the first of its kind in that city, and while the officials of the Transit Company have not commented on the result of the experiment, it is said that they are pleased with the results.

**WOMEN CONDUCTORS**  
A new line of work has been discovered for women. The Rapid Transit Company of Philadelphia, is experimenting with women conductors on the new pay-as-you-ride system. The women have been detailed as conductors on the new cars, and while the officials of the Transit Company have not commented on the result of the experiment, it is said that they are pleased with the results.
