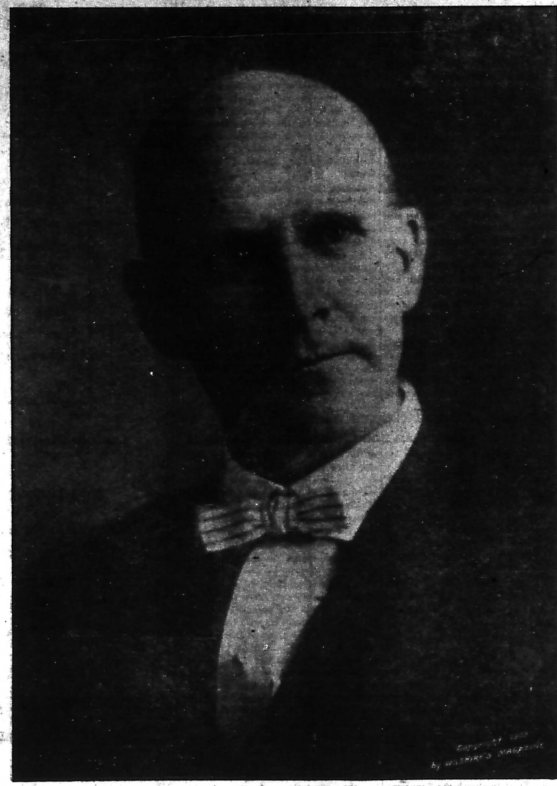

WHO PAYS THE BILLS?

Whoever pays the campaign funds of a political party will own that party, body, boots and breeches.

Do you suppose that the Morgans, the Fricks, the Perkinses, the Archbalds, the Vanderbilts, the Twomblys and others of their ilk are putting up hundreds of thousands of dollars for the sake of giving you "social and industrial justice"?

The Socialist party will have none of their dirty dollars. The Socialist party is financed, owned, controlled and managed also by the people who pay its campaign funds. THE PEOPLE WHO PAY THE CAMPAIGN EXPENSES OF THE SOCIALIST PARTY ARE THE MEMBERS OF THE WORKING CLASS.

The Socialist party is just as thoroughly owned, controlled and managed by the working class as the other three parties are owned, controlled and managed by the capitalist class.

Every plank in the Socialist platform, every nominee of the Socialist party, every activity of the party as a whole, is directly governed by the dues-paying members of that party who number approximately 150,000 in good standing at the present time.

The politicians who are in the "social and industrial justice" until they are black in the face. We workers will get nothing until we GO AND TAKE IT!

If the Democratic party means to do anything for the workers, WHY DOESN'T THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY BEGIN IN THE SOUTH? There it has had control for countless years.

If the Republican party were willing to do anything for the working class, why doesn't it begin right now? It has complete power.

If Roosevelt were going to do anything for the working class, why didn't he do something during the seven years that he had full power?

Have'n't they fooled you about long enough? Are you going to be always the football of these capitalist politicians who can't even see you on the street, except for a few months before election? Even then, they can hardly keep their faces straight while they are telling you what "doble sovereign citizens" you are and all that sort of thing—when you know, and they know, that the working class which would vote their enemies into power year after year are simply a lot of chockle-headed clumps.

How long are you going to stand for it? When are you going to begin trying to understand what ails you? When are you going to vote for YERSELVES for about once every year, but you creatures of the capitalist class which is grinding your faces in the dust?

Don't jaw about the trusts. Take possession of the trusts. The issue is in your hands. Use your power in the interests of yourself and your babies. Vote the ticket of the working class—the Socialist ticket.

That man loses his vote, who votes for what he doesn't want and gets it. No man loses his vote who votes for his principles.

The Socialist party does not aim at a bloody revolution. It proposes to save off a bloody revolution by doing peacefully what must ultimately be done, one way or another.

At the last session of Congress, over a billion dollars was voted for the expense of the country; and not one nickel of that amount will go to make life easier, pleasanter or happier for the great working class which produced it all.

The capitalist papers will tell you that the Socialists are against private property. The capitalists have abolished private property for the majority of us. The Socialists are against private property for the means of production. You own your own home but you, against anybody owning your home but you; against a few owning all of the private property. We say it's about time for the working class who produced it all to get a little of the private property.

WHY WORKERS HONOR DEBS

The superficial, who note the enthusiasm with which Debs was greeted in New York, where 40,000 people stormed Madison Square Garden to hear him speak; in Philadelphia, where 30,000 fought for a chance to hear him, and at Buffalo, where preparations have been made to enable 20,000 to listen to him, will say that he is a great popular hero; that Socialists in effect are hero-worshippers as well as the capitalist-minded. They will say, "This man Debs has many followers."

They will say so, partly because they are superficial, and because it will be partly so. It will be one of the numerous half-truths with which capitalism abounds, particularly in its discussion of Socialism.

Socialists are not hero-worshippers. The general public outside of the Socialist party will furnish many hero-worshippers at the big Socialist demonstrations at the Broadway Arsenal, October 22. The Socialist party will furnish no hero-worshippers.

The Socialist party delights to honor Debs for two reasons: The first of these is the fact that he has never failed the working class in its struggles. If there be need of a martyr to languish in jail for the cause of the workers, as was the case when he was leading the famous struggle of the railroad men in 1904, Debs does not hesitate to offer up himself as the victim.

If there be need of a leader to rouse the working class to immediate action, as was the case when Meyer, Haywood and Pettibone were in danger of death at the hands of the masters of the bread in 1907, Debs never temporizes. He acts and leads.

Not that Debs is the only one who is willing to do these things. We should take shame, indeed, to say that the Socialist party ever lacked brave men anxious to meet any situation where the working class is imperiled. But Debs has done these things. To him has been given the opportunity, and the world has come to see in him the working class militant.

The other reason is the fact that none excels him in presenting the working class indignities of the capitalist class and the working class challenges, as from his lips stream the words of molten lava, the burning words of working class revolt. The tender impulses of working class solidarity find expression in his velvet phrases when he dwells upon that theme. His tense, astatic features reflect the stern, indomitable courage of unflinching loyalty and unwavering purpose. The working class loves to honor Debs because it sees itself reflected in him. When Debs speaks he rouses the woe, the wrath, the hopes, the enthusiasm, the all-conquering zeal of the working class marching to the conquest of the world.

In Debs the working class sees itself personified—and it is glad.

"Before the trial is over, we know that the infamy of the Broom, the Woods and their kind, will have been thoroughly exposed; and we know that it will be long before your troubles and vindication in a court will mark another step in the growth, progress and solidarity of the workers."

CAPITALISM IS DOOMED

Nobody doubts that Capitalism has had a halcyon in time, but there are not a few who seem to believe that it will never come to an end...

You know of many people who have died, but you also know of many who are still living, like yourself, and seem to be in no hurry to depart. Does the fact that you and they are living and enjoying life prove that they and you will never die? Are we, all of us and who still breathe the earthly air, immortal? Are we exceptions to the rule? Yes, not so silly as to believe such nonsense; on the contrary, you are convinced that all men must die. The fate of those who have gone before you will be your own fate, for now what has happened to them will happen to you.

But why should the well established and universally recognized logic of every day life not hold good when applied to social phenomena? Are the collective experiences of men of less value than their individual ones? Does not the fact that many economic systems and social forms of social order have passed away and were, each in its turn, replaced by others, justify the conclusion that our present capitalist system of economics and social order will share their fate and join them in their way into the realm of the "has-beens"?

And the dying off of the old and the forming of the new is going on under our own eyes. Private ownership is changing into collective ownership, representative government is being modified by the initiative and referendum, and many other things that until recently were considered private affairs, such as education, sanitation of dwellings, hygiene, the combating of disease, the care of infants, and the like, have become more or less public matters.

The world is ever changing, and our present order of society is no exception to the rule. But while the physical face of the earth is changed by the impersonal forces of nature, society is changed by the hands and brains of men.

Not even in the upward, onward, course of the race was ever fraught with such portentous meaning as is the emancipation of the womanhood of the world.

And the Socialist of the world would see their sisters in revolt: with souls and hearts aflame we face the dawn of a new civilization, and the welcome woman's emancipation as the harbinger of the glad new day.
