HERE IS A GOOD CHANCE TO BRING RAILROADS TO TIME

Those who were so anxious to enforce the Law With Union Street Car Men May Make Heroes of Themselves by Arresting Railroad Officials—Railroads Break Law Every Day and Authorities Dare Not Punish Them.

When the law compelling the Railroads to employ townsmen and dispatchers no longer than eight-hours in twenty-four was passed every townsmen of the New York Central was put on an eight-hour basis, an extra man being given employment in each tower.

Many accidents were occurring and the traveling public demanded an investigation. It was found that the men were not in a fit physical condition to do work that needed an alert mind.

As a result of the investigation car lawmakers finally passed a law limiting the number of hours of "any telegraph or telephone operator who spaces trains by use of the telegraph or telephone or what is known as the block system."
