The judge decided that Mahoney was guilty, but he suspended sentence. It shows to the unthinking how easy it is for the capitalist class to dig up an excuse to deprive the working class of their right to free speech and their right of assembly.

The men were receiving the enormous sum of \$12.00 per week and the management were placing girls at the work for the miserable sum of \$2.00 per week.

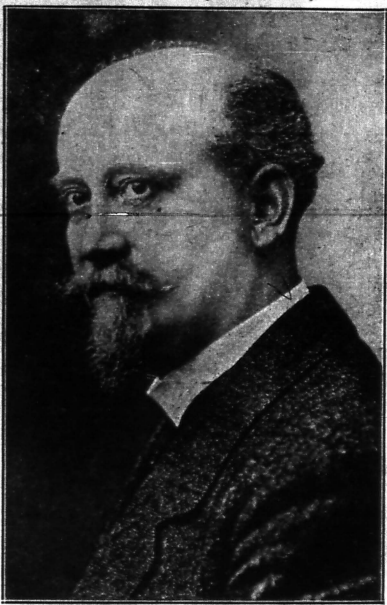
Of course the girls liked the work and were just doing it for pin money.

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PLASTERERS ON STRIKE

The members of Local 9 of the Operative Plasterers' International Association have been on strike since October 4th. The demands of the men call for a 44-hour week, eight hours a day and Saturday half holiday. No increase of wages is demanded. The rate per hour is to remain the same.

Practically every plasterer in the city is out, about 150 men in all. Plasterers are on the job every day and a good strike is being conducted. Meetings are held every morning at Schwartz Hall, Goodell and Washington streets. A fine spirit is being displayed by the strikers. They have the bosses completely blocked and they are determined to stay out until they win. From all indications the bosses are on the point of breaking. The union has the entire well in hand and victory is certain.

CAPITALIST POLITICIANS GETTING VERY NAUGHTY TO INTERNATIONAL R.Y.

It is for the Buffalo Socialist to laugh at the attentions of the capitalist politicians and the hired press just at this time, especially in regard to their attempt to build up a campaign with a pretended fight against the International Railway.

We all know where "Louie" stands on the street car question, yet he has the nerve to pose as the friend of labor.

With Mr. Stodard as its candidate, the Republican Party through its press is trying to bunco the people with a lot of hot air just now on the horrible crowding, etc. of the street cars.

Don't you believe it, Mr. Working Man. If any of that outfit is elected, about the first thing that will happen will be a banquet to the incoming Mayor, and it is a safe bet that the International will be represented at the table.

We know that the International is taking off cars all over the city while at the same time the few cars that are left in the line are so crowded that it requires a gymnast to get aboard, and a person with a cast iron stomach to keep the last meal down when that feat is accomplished.

For the information of our readers we ask them to look up their file of the Buffalo Socialist and they will find out where Mr. O'Hanlon gets his argument on the overcrowding of street cars, also the kick on the delay of the high schools.

In our edition of December 28th, 1912, we register a complaint against the overcrowding of the cars and offer a remedy in the shape of a law which will carry out the following idea:

"Every public vehicle carrying passengers for a fee, must place a sign stating the seating capacity of same in a conspicuous place in each vehicle, and it is forbidden to carry a greater number of people than can be seated, under the penalty of a fine of \$100 for every offense. The failure on the part of the owners of vehicles to observe this law is equivalent to forfeiting the right to operate."
