

W. N. Y. POST OBJECTS TO TRUTH OF GOULD STRIKE

The Western New York Post, in its issue of March 15, published an article appearing in the March 7th edition of the Buffalo Socialist, entitled, "Facts from Inside the Gould Coupler Works," which article it brands as "highly colored, untruthful and untrue."

How does the Post know? Our report was the only one coming from a representative of the press who had been inside the plant incognito. Does the Post expect its readers to believe that it can secure more favorable information by simply interviewing Mr. Hayden?

Was it "untruth," Mr. Editor of the Post, because it mentioned the terrible condition of the workers? We know in some quarters it is considered vulgar to refer to filthy living conditions, but in the interests of truth, we will continue to do so.

And was it soiled by a paper that would tell the truth, without casting "bugging eyes at the world pure and simple," in order to mingle with the wrecks of capitalism, smell their filthy bodies and taste their rotten food—in short, get accurate information at first hand!

The way of the capitalist editor, is to sit serene and comfortable in the editorial chair, and with the editorial nose assailed by nothing more noxious than the aroma of a cigarette, delegate a reporter to interview Mr. Hayden, gracefully blue pencil anything said reporter might say, and then, with the Coupler Company and elegantly, gracefully, but none the less insidiously, get the advertising arrangement of appearing of the master at whose feet the advertiser had gracefully and elegantly fawned.

Par from being highly colored, the article in question did not give all the evidence of mismanagement our representative secured. Having some regard for the stomachs of our readers, for instance, we did not fully describe the filthy manner of the workers in the plant. For want of space, a number of other facts were omitted.

MOTORCYCLE FIRM UNFAIR TO METAL POLISHERS

The Metal Polishers, Buffers, Brigs and Silver Workers' Union of North America, on strike against the manufacturers of the following warning to all members of the working class:

To all Unions, Members of the Buffalo, N. Y. Metal Polishers, Buffers, Brigs and Silver Workers' Union, kindly appeal for financial but for your moral support in the Indian Motorcycle Co. of Buffalo, which firm was placed on the unfair list by the Central Labor Council of Buffalo and vicinity.

On Jan. 5th, 1914, 125 members of our union were forced to strike, following a reduction in wages which amounted to as high as \$1.00 per day.

On Feb. 2d, the Massachusetts Board of Arbitration decided in favor of our brothers and ordered them back to work, but the officials of the company refused, saying: "We have nothing to arbitrate," and refused to deal with them in any way.

We therefore on these grounds ask you to help us to buy Indian Motorcycles until the affair is settled; also tell all your friends to do the same. It is the economic system that is wrong, and we are not asking you to do anything that is in your power to help us win this strike. Tell everybody that the Indian motorcycle is made under unfair conditions. Thanking you in advance for your support, we remain, S. HOFFMAN, Secretary.

BACK PAY AWARDED
Boston—Conductors, motormen, shop hands and other employees of the local street car company have been awarded their back pay under the order of the arbitration board, which recently raised wages also to \$2.00 per day for the year. The company states that \$243, 510 was distributed to 10,140 persons, some of whom had left the company's employ, but who would be given their wages on demand. The amount was drawn from \$6 cents to \$154. To pay the expenses of the arbitration proceedings each man was assessed a percentage of his back pay.

The subject of the lecture was the conviction of the people today, and showed that instead of information and education had made the movement a strong anti-war force, so that the last measure of profit through military, that of building warships and furnishing ammunition for battles not to be fought, was becoming precarious, and would soon be abandoned. He made it plain, too, that the common people were growing suspicious over the formation of a standing army, as they felt it a menace for the future of the rights of labor, and were in active opposition to it in every way.
