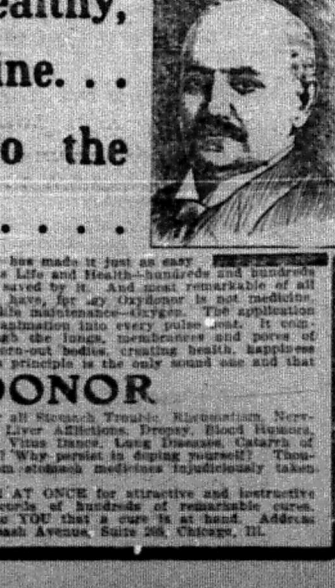

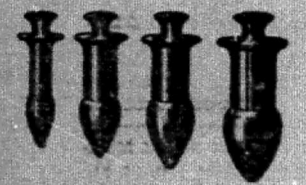

Still the trusts are undisturbed, a whiffet excitedly barking at the heels of a grizzly bear might be annoying, but never a menace, and it matters little to the bear whether the whiffet's name is Fido, Ponto, Rover or Tige.

Under Roosevelt's administration, covering a period of over six years, there has been a veritable honeymoon for the trusts, despite the fact that he has waged a constant war of wordy messages against them, haled some of them to court and imposed fines that have never been paid and never will.

Millions of Americans hold Roosevelt in reverence as a demigod, and when he declares and reiterates with his copious speeches and messages that there is a rank rottenness in the bones of business and politics, there is a great sitting up and taking notice all along the line.
