'FREE INDIA' HAS MARTIAL LAW

(SPECIAL TO THE DAILY SOCIALIST.) Calcutta, Dec. 12.—So strong and so insistent has become the agitation for a "Free India" that the English government has been compelled to pass what is known as a "summary justice bill," which practically gives the government officials power to stamp out all the associations opposed to British rule without any process of law whatsoever.

Bill Passed Arming Official With Individual Power to Suppress Agitators

The bill as passed is practically a declaration of martial law throughout the country. It is aimed directly at the Bengalee agitators and societies, chief of which is the society known as "The Volunteers of India," which has a membership in Bengal alone of more than thirty thousand.

Bengalee Agitators Aimed At

The passage of the bill was provoked by the enormous demonstration held at the funeral of the young Bengalee who shot an English official at Arim-pur. Thirty thousand people took part in this demonstration.

Government's Version False

With its customary thoughtfulness, the English government has caused to be sent broadcast through the capital press of the world the news that the new act is aimed at the "anarchists." This is nothing but bare falsehood. There are not fifty anarchists in the country among the whole 250,000,000 people.

2,000 CITIZENS DOOMED TO DIE

Pneumonia to Claim That Many Before Middle of April, Says Report

Pneumonia has passed death sentence on 2,000 Chicagoans, who are to die before the middle of April. The current bulletin of the Chicago board of health calls this a preventable disease and says that it is chiefly contracted through the breathing of impure air.

Health Good This Week

Following the prediction of the pneumonia fatalities the health bulletin states that for the week just closed Chicago's health was good, at least comparatively so. There were 530 deaths, just the same as the week before, and just 25 fewer than the same week of last year.

IS "PROFIT ON EARTH" NOW

"Peace on Earth, Good Will to Men," Motto Has Been Changed. "Peace on earth, good will to men," has been changed. "Profit on earth, idleness for men and work for children," is the new Christmas motto.

Factory Inspector Talks

Assistant Chief State Factory Inspector Barney Cohen, formerly president of the Illinois Federation of Labor, puts the matter in terse phrase. "Improved machinery in factories means, more and more, that the father stays at home jobless and the mother and children work."

One Gay Feature of Winter

One of the gay features of the winter season is to be found in the millinery trade in which young girls are paid \$1.25 a week and work from eight in the morning till eight at night. The official report on the busy state street department stores will be ready soon. The pillars of Chicago's business world, whose specialty is the underpaying of employees, especially women, will be compelled to cease working their employees between the ages of 14 and 16 over eight hours a day.

Night Working Begins

Night work is on for the Christmas rush, the great profit grind. Places which are working at night are being inspected to see that children under the legal age are not being employed. It is a merry option these children have: Hunger at home, hunger at school, hunger at work.

\$500,000,000 FOR WATERWAYS

Washington, D. C., Dec. 12.—The national rivers and harbors congress, at its concluding session placed itself on record in favor of the issuance of government bonds for the improvement of the waterways of the country. The congress declared for an authorized issue by the national congress of \$500,000,000 worth of bonds, the proceeds to be used in the payment exclusively for rivers and harbor work, provided for the issue to be similar to the Panama canal bonds.

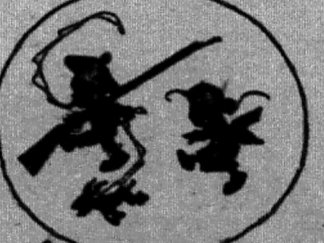
