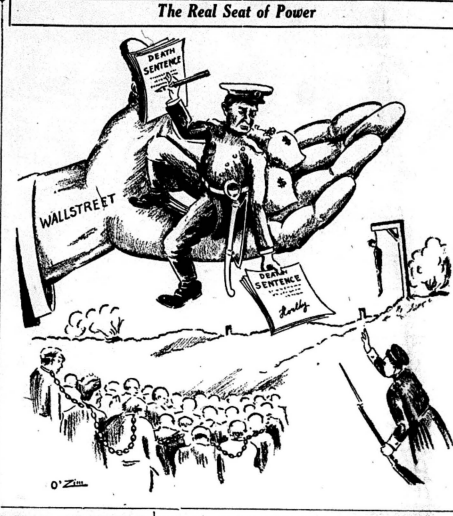

## BANK CLERKS EXPEL JOSEPH SHAFIR

Members in Fear of Losing Jobs

At a meeting at which less than half of the membership of the Bank Clerks' Union was present, Joseph Shafir, president of the Bank Clerks' Union and a clerk at the Amalgamated Trust and Savings Bank, was expelled from the union thru the activities of the renegade Communist, Oscar Smith, now publicity director and business agent of the Amalgamated Trust and Savings Bank, and Nat Yelchin.

The meeting which was called to expel Shafir for introducing a resolution for the recognition of the Bank Clerks' trade union only and against close collaboration at the American Federation of Labor convention at Atlantic City was held in the Amalgamated Trust and Savings Bank building, held at the Federation Building, where meetings were held on the 11th, at 8 o'clock making it impossible for any of those who had never attended other meetings to attend. Members of the union that had never attended a meeting since they joined the union were on hand instructed to cast their votes for Shafir.

Many of the workers in the Amalgamated Bank who were with Shafir did not attend the meetings as rumors were thick and fast that anyone voting with Shafir would find themselves out of a job.

Several signers of the complaint against Shafir were Duane Swift, Sam S. Jacobson and others. They alleged the complaint one of them was a member of the union. They were upon being questioned why they signed the complaint answered: "Well, they gave us to me, told me to sign it and I did."

The other signer did not know why Shafir was to be thrown out of the union and on the floor asked the chairman of the meeting, Duane Swift, what the resolutions were.

The chairman of the meeting ran the meeting to the benefit of the resolution of violation of the American Federation of Labor constitution was read as an item that appeared in the meeting. The public relations man came up as conclusive evidence that Shafir had violated the constitution of the Bank Clerks' Union and the American Federation of Labor.

## CHINESE WAR MAY INVOLVE WAR ON SOVIET

Japan Desperate, May Open Big Conflict

(Special to The Daily Worker)

(PEKING, China, Oct. 22)—The entrance of General Gao Peifu into the area as a challenger of Peking and the chief supporter, Chang Tsao-lin, invited the delegates to the tariff conference due to start here next Monday, with grave doubts that their decisions will give any "possible good" to China.

For exactly opposite reasons, Yelchin agreed with them, he having declared from Hankow that the custom conference would "do China no good" until the country has been united and Chang Tsao-lin, the "war lord of Manchuria," driven back to Manchuria. An Wu has now claimed that the Chinese provinces of Chihli, Shansi and 20,000 or more soldiers in front of him, but on the trial of Chang's fleeing troops, his gun is good as the guns of the government.

Japan May Declare War

The grave complications now on the horizon in China is driven back to Peking by the news of the revolution in Manchuria, which would include all three elements in a drive against Peking and their preparation to intervene in Manchuria to hold on to the big interests there particularly the South Manchurian railway and Port Arthur.

Japan is fully anticipating that if the door into Manchuria is left open, she will be charged with "meddling in China." Therefore, Japan is likely to give the best reason for the invasion—that is—she is to declare that Bolshevism threatens to engulf China, and Japanese abolition money must be sent to the rescue.

The Old Enemy

Not in Japan only to stop, even, to justify her invasion she has to declare war on Soviet Russia, even to protest the extent that Soviet Russia and the Chinese revolutionaries have an alliance.

This possibility was pointed out long ago as well by Count Michail Semenov, who spoke at the League of Nations in Geneva in 1919, in Chicago, predicting a war with Soviet Russia. It is significant, too, that this came at a time when France, Holland, Germany and other European nations, have joined in a so-called "security pact" aimed in principle against themselves, and a war on Soviet Russia.

Hard Problem for Japan

Japan is hard hit, even as it is, by the civil war now going on. This is short-lived, it is certain to continue for a number of years in just trade. With business in a state of paralysis, it would be a hard blow, and Japan would have to have to risk a war on Soviet Russia, which her interests are not only at stake, but the fact that it would not be a popular war.

End Martial Law

SOFIA, Oct. 22—The cabinet has decided to suspend the state of martial law which has been in force since the Bulgarian revolution of 1923 (Cathedral) on April 16, in which more than 150 persons were killed.

## Press Fanning the Flames of Hatred in Balkan Strife

VIENNA, Austria, Oct. 22—Official announcements from Sofia, Bulgaria, state that the Greek forces crossed the Bulgarian frontier this morning, bombarded the city of Petritz, killing five, and occupied frontier posts No. 9, 10 and 11.

The Bulgarian soldiers resisted with all the power at their command, but were outnumbered and after five soldiers were killed, retreated.

"At first, reports were to the effect that the origin of the trouble was the unprovoked slaying of two Greek soldiers on the frontier. The Sofia dispatch now charges the Greeks with appealing Bulgarian from Greek Macedonia and Thrace.

## DEBS PROTESTS AGAINST HORTHY REIGN OF TERROR

New York Police Arrest Five More Pickets

NEW YORK, Oct. 22—Eugene V. While picketing the Hungarian consulate five workers were arrested by the New York police who apparently are deeply concerned over the unauthorized activity received by the union committee of the workers. "This is the second batch of arrests made by the police in this case. Fifteen others having been taken to the police station last Saturday.

Especially in the case of Greece, where since the war has ended, we have had over a half a dozen changes of government, each of which tried to kick the others some fairly into the weeds of the working class.

Both governments feel that any such war would weaken, notwithstanding the mistakes in Bulgaria and the improving and falling of the Communists and militant workers.

DAMASCUS, Syria, Oct. 22.—Gen. Marshall, the French High Commissioner in Syria under the league of nations, has sent an urgent appeal to Paris for 150,000 soldiers to help the uprising of the native in Damascus against the ruthless repression of the French carried on against the persecuted Syrians.
