Publicity Agent for Graters

Revelations at the trial of Colonel William Mitchell emphasize the fact that the exploit of the interests of the masses of patriotic jays who are engaged in any other business—for profit. Not the profit of the whole capitalist class, but each group of capitalists trying to lead the government treasury before other groups beat them to it.

It is primarily the business of a capitalist government to serve the interests of the entire capitalist class. It is the executive committee of the capitalist class as a whole. But occasionally it breaks down as various groups of venaal officials try to gain peculiar advantages for one group of exploiters. The interests of the masses of the capitalist class the government should be able to step in and force any given group to yield to the welfare of the whole capitalist class. Such action frequently aligns powerful interests against the policy of a given group in respect to the present future of the people of aircraft in warfare.

For years the aircraft trust had been pillaging the government through fraudulent contracts. Involving millions of dollars, admitted by the war department itself, have been awaiting prosecution, but the department of justice, under the notorious corrupt Daugherty, after successful investigation, refused to prosecute, for reasons best known to themselves.

In their desire to continue their looting the aircraft trust started a campaign with Colonel Mitchell as its principal agent in a stage play. In his zeal to serve the interests of his masters, Mitchell came in contact with the general staff of the army and is now being courted. So powerful is Mitchell's position, that he has become a melodramatic hero. Everything was going splendidly as long as testimony in favor of Mitchell was being presented. The Hearst papers whooped it up for Mitchell and a separate article.

It is interesting to note that the wind which was blown up from the sails of the "herb," fondly referred to by the aircraft graters as "Colonel Billy." Evidence was presented by Mitchell that Mitchell had indulged in excessive drinking, excessive excesses, sending men to certain death as they flew over territory defended by the anti-aircraft guns of Germany.

The claim of the aircraft trust that the anti-aircraft guns are ineffective is refuted by this evidence. Out of a total of 6,002 allied balloons and planes wrecked during the war 911 were brought down by anti-aircraft guns. This squabble of one branch of the so-called national defense against the rest, because of the greed for profit, is one of the reasons why capitalist forces and anti-capitalism can never hope to reach that stage of discipline realized by a revolutionary government.

In the United States each capitalist group strives for advantage for its share of profit. In the service of the masses, the lives of men are not being wantonly sacrificed in the scramble between groups of manufacturers fighting to log the graft.

In contrast to the United States, in the Soviet Union, where the element of profit is eliminated and where the one impelling motive is the defense of the revolution no such scandal as the Mitchell episode can ever arise. That is also one reason why the Soviet forces are so much more indomitable in the face of the red army soldiers know they are not pawns in the game of profit, but they are protected by every device known to modern warfare.

Hunger Strike Against Imperialism

Julio Antonio Mella, general secretary of the Communist Party of Cuba, organizer of the student's federation and editor of the *Cuba Youth*, which also represents the All-American Anti-Imperial League, is trying to lead a hunger strike in the American and other countries and of the United States against the fierce despotism prevailing in Cuba by a hunger strike in jail.

Students fighting against imperialism and for the liberation of the workers from the thrallhold of imperialism, Mella was chosen a victim of the vengeance of the American capitalists exploiting Cuba. He supported workers in their refusal to slave on the sugar plantations at sixty cents a week and was arrested. This interfered with the interests of the Havemeyer sugar trust, which, with the American Tobacco company, incited the war against Spain. Mella has since been in the service of the American empire. He planted two bombs near a factory and then arrested and accused Mella and eleven other workers of the crime.

Mella was generally regarded as a brilliant young ambassador. General Enoch H. Crowder, is exerting pressure to keep Mella in jail.

Today is the eleventh day of the hunger strike and the Cuban government shows no inclination to relent in its persecution. The outcome rests with the working class.

Profits have already been made by the All-American Anti-Imperial League in the United States and in the American government department. Also communications have been sent urging the laboring masses of Central America to act. Workers everywhere should protest against this crime. Mella and his fellow workers should be urged to call a general strike, thereby stopping production until the agents of imperialism release this valiant fighter for the working class.
