Why We Demonstrate on August First!

SIXTEEN years ago the capitalist controlled nations began the world bloodbath which supposedly was to bring "world peace" and make the world "safe for democracy." Instead millions of workers lost their lives and uncountable thousands were maimed for life to make the world safe for capitalism and to pile up greater profits for a few fat-lipped coupon clippers.

Now sixteen years after the beginning of that war, we are on the verge of another war. Again under fake peace slogans the capitalist countries are arming for war. Billions of dollars are being spent for warships, military equipment, airplanes and poison gas. The factories are being put on a war footing. Wages are being cut; production is being speeded up. Workers in the war industries are being fingerprinted; preparations are being made in Congress for a "universal" draft, which means a draft for workers both in the army and in industry.

This new war grows primarily out of the struggle of the imperialists—the rich bankers and industrialists—for new and greater sources of profits. They want more markets for their goods, more sources of cheap raw materials, and fresh places for the profitable investment of their money. Actuated only by a desire for greater and greater profits, regardless of the cost in workers' lives, they are ready to make war against any nation or colony, if by it they think they can get a bigger slice of the world's territory and extract a few more dollars for themselves.

The Union of Socialist Soviet Republics, which arose during the last world war as a result of a workers' revolution against the despotism of czars and capitalists, is the particular object of the present war preparations. There the profit-hungry capitalists see a vast territory covering one-sixth of the world's land area, rich in natural resources, and populated by a people who can consume and pay for capitalist products. In addition they see their class enemies—the working class—not only in power, but rapidly proceeding with the building of a non-capitalist, socialist society in which profits will be abolished and all wealth will go for the benefit of the workers.

This is the explanation of the last few days' events. This is why Hoover, Stinson, Easley, Green, Woll and white guardist supporters of the former Russian ruling class can all unite in the war preparations against the Soviet Union. This is the reason for the talk of trade embargos and blockades. This is the reason for the Fish Committee, the wage cuts, the speed-up, and the bitter attacks against the American workers who are against imperialism and sympathetic to the workers of the Soviet Union.

To stop wage cuts, to stop the speed-up in the factories, to force the government to pay unemployment insurance, to win the masses for struggle against imperialism war and for the defense of the workers' fatherland—the Soviet Union, is the reason for the demonstration on August 1st!

Demonstrate on August 1st!
Not one cent for war; all funds for the unemployed!
Demand the enactment of the Workers' Social Insurance Bill!
Continue the struggle against imperialist war after August 1st!
Fight for the defense of the U.S.S.R.!

Hands Off China!

THE exploited and oppressed workers and peasants of China are rising to overthrow the militarist and imperialist oppressors. A new wave of revolution sweeps over China, joining its forces with the rising masses of India in a mighty, offensive against imperialism. Workers all over the world will rejoice in this magnificent advance, and will give enthusiastic support to the Chinese workers and peasants.

But there must be no illusions. Imperialism, and before all United States imperialism, is preparing war against the Chinese revolution.

Already at Changsha, when the revolutionary army took the city from the bloody bandit, General Ho Chien, it was American guns and American ships which attempted to rescue this militarist murderer of the people.

From Shanghai comes the news that the United States Consulate General has called upon the American Chamber of Commerce there for its advice to the government at Washington, and that this advice has been given in favor of "unified action by the powers to suppress disorder and to restore conditions favorable to the formation of a responsible government"—a government responsible to imperialism!

Workers, be on guard! In this development is another menace of war, which will surely engulf the entire world. Imperialism, watching the collapse of its tool, Chiang Kai-shek, and itself gripped by the creeping paralysis of crisis; watching the rise of the revolutionary masses in India and China, while at the same time millions of workers in the capitalist countries also demonstrate against hunger and war; watching the gigantic growth of socialist industry and agriculture in the Soviet Union, while capitalist industry plunges deeper and deeper into crisis—all these sharp contrasts and contradictions, are taken by the capitalist class as the signs deciding the necessity of their only, supreme, and desperate "remedy" which is WAR.

Workers! Rally to the defense of the Chinese and Indian revolutions! "Hands off China!" Withdraw the warships and soldiers!

Long live the revolutionary Soviet Government of the Chinese workers and peasants.
Long live the unity of the working class with the oppressed peoples of the colonies!
Down with imperialism.

READY TO SPREAD ORLEANS STRIKE TO MORGAN LINE

Workers Boss Called "Black Bastards" Are Showing Fine Fight

95 Arrested in 3 Days

Demand Raise From 25 Cents Hour to 50

NEW ORLEANS, La., July 31.—With 400 longshoremen on strike on the river docks here, preparations are made to call out tomorrow the many more who toil on the Morgan line docks. The river dock workers, organized into the Marine Workers Industrial Union are battling heroically against mass arrests and gunfire from the armed scabs and scab herders.

Last night a meeting was held at the docks in defiance of police refusal of a permit. The police are attacking and dispersing all crowds at the waterfront now. In addition to the 60 pickets arrested Monday and Tuesday, 20 more were arrested yesterday morning and 15 last night. Eleven have been sentenced to 30 days or \$15 fine.

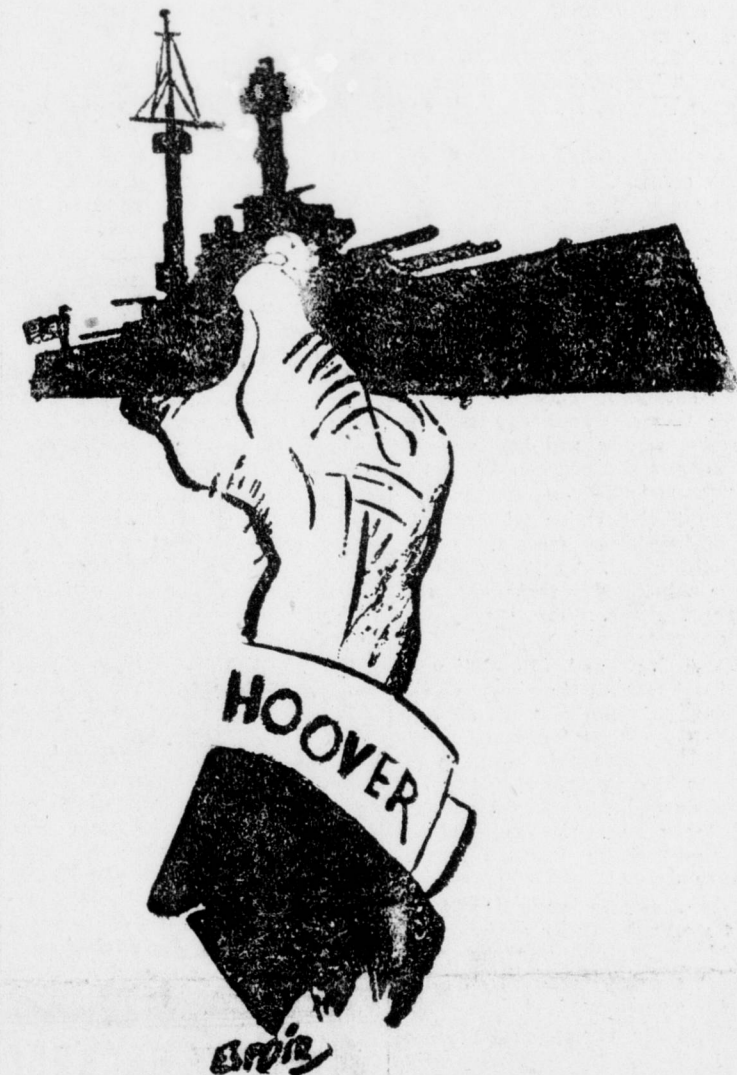
The National Organizer of the M. W. I. U., Harvey, is in New Orleans.

Word is received that the Philadelphia longshoremen held a meeting and voted solidarity, sending also money for the New Orleans strikers.

Many of the dock workers are Negroes. When the committee approached the boss Sunday, and for the first time in his history demanded an increase in wages, he said: "What the hell is the matter with you black bastards?" The men are fighting for a raise of wages from 25 cents an hour to 50 cents.

\$15,000,000 FOR BOSSES
WASHINGTON, D. C. — In a futile attempt to stop the falling price of wheat the Federal Farm Board purchased 60,000,000 bushels. In doing this the bosses' government spent a great deal of money. However, the expenditure did nothing to stabilize prices and wheat crashed downward to the lowest level it has known since the world war. In this little venture the Farm Board "lost" only \$15,000,000!

U.S. Wars On China Revolt

As millions of workers all over the world will demonstrate today against imperialist war, the first significant battle of the American imperialist war against the Chinese Revolution, since the bombardment of Nanking in 1927, has already been fought near Changsha, the capital of Hunan province, which

has been seized by the workers, peasants and Red Armies since Monday morning. Forced to withdraw because of low water level in the Siang River at the time of the fall of Changsha, the American gunboat Palos sailed toward the city and opened heavy fire at the workers guarding the city, when an unexpected rise in the river enabled her to do so. A fierce battle ensued which resulted in 50 Chinese workers killed and many more wounded. Five American sailors are reported to

Come From Shops, Mines and Factories Demanding "Not a Cent For War Armaments, But All Funds to the Unemployed"

Hoover, Green and Bosses "Change" of Tactics Is Only Strengthening of Front in Preparation For Attack on Soviet Union

MILLIONS FIGHT BOSS WAR MOVES ARMING GROWS

Demand Billions Spent For War Go to Jobless

While thousands of workers will demonstrate in Union Square today millions of workers will demonstrate in all capitalist lands against the growing spectre of approaching imperialist war. Under the leadership of the Communist Parties, the workers are being mobilized to fight against the imperialist war preparations. Foremost in the war aims of the imperialist bandits is an attack against the workers' republic, the U.S.S.R.

While millions starve in the capitalist countries, the bosses spend billions for war. On July 22, senator Wagner admitted that the ratification of the naval "treaty" the immediate expenditure by Great Britain, the United States, France and Japan of \$5,255,797,750. Of this, the American imperialist will lay out \$1,071,000,000 for war.

Work is under way already on a fleet of 10,000-ton cruisers to carry from 25 to 75 bombing planes. A big increase in military training everywhere is evident. The Chicago Association of Commerce, as every other boss organization in the country, openly brags of its war preparations.

War is on foot everywhere in the capitalist domains. The growing and sharpening crisis of world capitalism heightens the war prep-

TRADE WAR PLAN AGAINST U.S.S.R. IS CONTINUED

U. S. in Maneuver to Quiet Workers

Recognizing the growing resentment of American workers to their war propaganda against the Soviet Union within the last few weeks, the generals of the trade war (leading to military attack on the Soviet Union) have now begun to straighten their lines. The active and open propaganda for immediate general embargo on Soviet Union products has gone ahead of other preparations. The open declaration for such embargo participated in by assistant secretary of the treasury Lowman, by Matthew Woll, vice president of the A.F.L., is now seen as a too rapid unfolding of the war plans, and a certain checking of the speed of advance on this particular field has been ordered.

But this is only strategy; the plan is the same, the drive towards war goes on, in a more orderly fashion.

Hoover and president Green of the A.F.L. now state that they "contemplate no general embargo on Russian products"; Hoover compels Lowman, the under secretary of the treasury who stopped 80 ship loads of pulpwood from U.S.S.R., to disavow his declaration of a general trade war; Green declares that Matthew Woll, who urged a general embargo does not speak for the A.F.L. The Fish committee, the "congressional committee investigating Communist activity," suddenly declares a recess of several months.

ENDORSE JOBLESS INSURANCE BILL; RALLY ON SEPT. 1

On the day that the Communist Party published its bill providing for unemployment relief for all workers, the American Federation of Labor, through its fascist president, Green, comes out and admits unemployment is growing worse. He offers no plan for relief, except continued collaboration with the bosses in their wage-cutting schemes.

We must take Green's figures with the greatest suspicion. He is an agent of the bosses. On every occasion he lies about the facts of the crisis and the class struggle. His figures show that unemployment in the A. F. of L. increased from June to July one per cent—namely, from 20 to 21 per cent of the total membership. This is deliberate underestimation. At least 30 per cent of the A. F. of L. members are without jobs. Green dares not publish the facts. The most drastic unemployment in the ranks of the A. F. of L. is in the building

Organize—to strike against wage cuts!

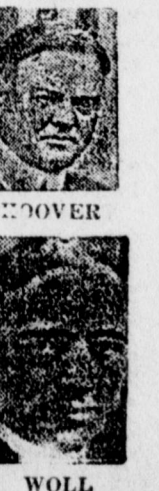
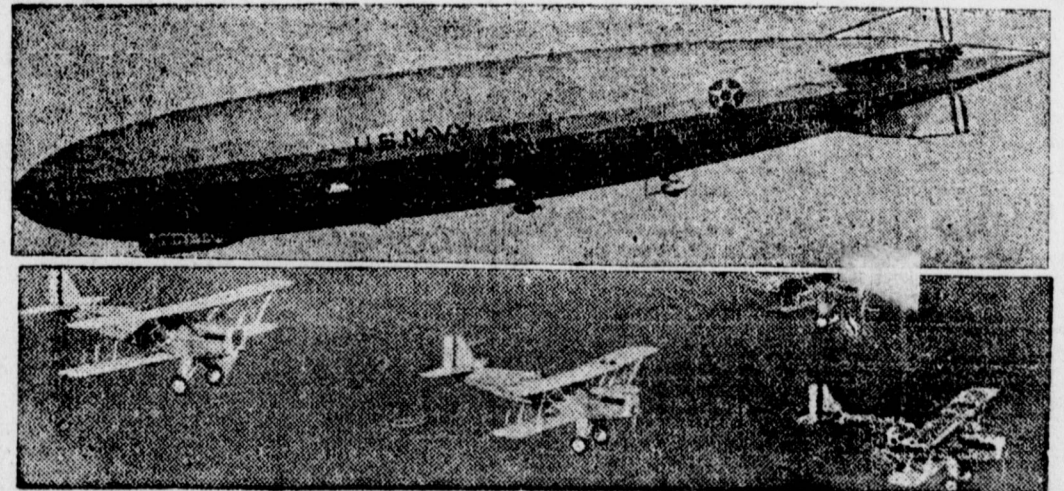
Organize—to battle for full social insurance!

WAGES GO DOWN AND UNEMPLOYMENT UP IN PROVIDENCE FACTORIES

Boss Sheet Says Jobless Situation Is Worse Than in 1914 and 1921

Many Mills Close Down Permanently; Payrolls Drop Every Month

PROVIDENCE, R. I., July 31.—Unemployment is growing worse in Rhode Island. Out of 326,000 supposed to be "gainfully employed," at least 125,000 are walking the streets looking for work.

Wages are being cut heavily. Reports on payrolls show constant decreases. Here are the figures of the drop in payrolls: January 6.8 per cent; February 7 per cent; March 9.5 per cent; April 11.9 per cent; May 14.7 per cent; June 15.2 per cent. Here is proof of wage cuts and constant cut in pay for the workers.

There are one-third fewer workers employed in the textile industries. There are 16 per cent fewer jewelry workers. Over 1,000 men in the metal trades were laid off in May out of the 12,000 employed in Providence.

In other parts of northeastern New England mills are closing down. The Cheney Bros. dressing mill of South Manchester, Conn. shut down indefinitely, throwing 300 workers out of jobs.

The Rossie Velvet Co. of Wil-

liamantic, Conn., is running on part time.

The workers of the cotton department of the Thorndike Co., at West Warren, Mass., which closed down on July 5, were notified they would not be taken back. They are out of jobs permanently now.

Workers at the Bernon Mills, the Georjavielle branch of the Manville-Jencks Co., were laid off.

As far back as last December the crisis in Rhode Island was worse than at any time since 1914 and 1921. The Brown Business Service (an information bulletin for the bosses) stated in this regard:

"On December 31, manufacturing plants were apparently employing only about 106,000 workers, hardly more than were employed in the winter of 1921, and fewer than were employed in any month in 1914."

That conditions are now infinitely worse is proven by the payroll figures given above, which show constant drops since January. This would indicate at least double the amount of unemployment since January.

FINNISH C. P. IN CALL FOR AUG. 1

Fascist Thugs Burn Workers' Print Shop

HELSINGFORS, Finland, July 31.—The illegal Communist Party distributed a large quantity of anti-war leaflets calling for demonstrations on August First.

The Communist Party here is issuing mimeographed newspapers. Investigation proved that fascist thugs have burned down the printing shop of the last week newspaper in Savontyokio.

The major, Laskinen was kidnapped, manhandled and left lying at the roadside. The police arrested Laskinen and charged him with arson in obtaining insurance.

The Ministry of the Interior is considering the prohibition of trade unions for their "relations with Communism." Terror is raging everywhere and there are many mass arrests and handling.

In Kaunala, Lepuavirta, Kaunayoki, Sulunsalo, Saloyen and other towns, worker members of the municipal governments are forcibly ejected from the city government buildings.

"FIGHT WAR," SAY LEADERS IN JAIL

Delegation of Jobless For Aug. 1 Protest

NEW YORK.—From their prison cells, where they have been sent by the Tammany grafters for leading the unemployed demonstration of 110,000 workers, Foster, Minor, Amter and Raymond issued a call to all workers to participate in the huge demonstrations on August 1 against the imperialist war preparations. Their statement reads:

"Sixteen years ago, today, the capitalist powers plunged into a world war—a war that we workers were told was to end all wars—and today the world is an armed camp waiting for a spark to explode it into another more gigantic, murderous war.

"The whole capitalist system is in a crisis. Over-production, with no markets, has resulted in 25,000,000 workers unemployed, in the capitalist countries who with their families are suffering hunger. 8,000,000 are jobless in the United States. Millions more working only part time. Those still having jobs are being speeded-up at a killing pace. Wage cut follows wage cut.

"They are assisted in this damnable action against the working class by the fascist leaders of the A. F. of L., Green, Wolf and Co. and the social-fascist, socialist party of Norman Thomas, Hillquit, Waldman and Co.

"In order to set the wheels of industry going, the capitalists of the world are looking for foreign markets. This is bringing them into the sharpest conflict that leads directly to imperialist war.

"Against the unemployment misery and exploitation in the capitalist countries stands the growing socialism in the Soviet Union—the socialized industries, collective farms, rising wages, 7-hour day and increasing welfare and happiness of the workers and peasants under the hammer and sickle.

"The Soviet Union triumphantly building socialism faces the entire capitalist world. The Soviet Union is the only country that wants and proposed peace. The imperialists are answering with war.

"Comrades and Revolutionary Workers! Defeat these aims of the imperialists! Rally to the support of the Communist Party and Trade Union Unity League! Let your answer to the vile plots of the imperialists and their fascist and social-fascist allies be to join the Communist Party and the revolutionary unions!

"We American workers will defend the Soviet Union against their machinations and war plans.

"Not a penny for war—all funds for the unemployed!

"Fight for unemployment insurance!

"Fight against wage cuts!

"Fight against speed-up!

"Fight for full economic, political and social equality and self-determination of the Negroes!

"Demand immediate release of all class war prisoners, including Mooney, Billings, Powers, Carr, Newton, the N. Y. Unemployed Delegation, etc."

95 ARRESTED IN ORLEANS STRIKE

M.M.I.U. Secures 500 New Members

NEW ORLEANS, July 31 (By Wire).—Twenty more arrests yesterday morning and sixteen last night in New Orleans in the longshoremen's strike being led by the Marine Workers Industrial Union, brings the total of arrests so far to ninety-six.

The police, working closely with the dock companies, are breaking up all crowds that gather on the waterfront, and interfering with every meeting of the striking longshoremen.

The marine workers are expecting to bring into the ranks of the strikers the employees of the Morgan Docks. It is believed that they will walk out today.

Hourly the situation grows more tense, and the Marine Workers Union is throwing all its forces into the struggle. The International Labor Defense attorney is prepared to defend all cases on the basis of the right of workers to assemble, strike, and picket.

The spirit of the strikers is strong and militant, and the police strong arm methods have only reinforced their determination. Arrests are made wholesale, cases dismissed, and new arrests made. The latest sentences imposed on eleven of the arrested workers were \$15 or thirty days.

HOOVER ACTS TO FOOL JOBLESS

Fight For Jobless Insurance Not "Figures"

WASHINGTON, July 31.—The 8,000,000 jobless demand unemployment insurance, so Hoover hands them another of his fake commissions. Yesterday a select committee was formed, under the Wagner bill, to "investigate" the unemployment problem. This committee will have on it representatives of the same groups of exploiters and the A. F. of L. which met last November and planned the wage-cutting campaign against the workers. It has on it every liar that helped Hoover in an attempt to cover up unemployment figures throughout the crisis. It has no plan for any form of relief and its duties will be to keep quiet any real information it gets about the vast extent of unemployment in this country. Only organization and mass action of the workers will force the bosses to pay unemployment insurance through their government.

The Steel Corporation which is running at 56 per cent of capacity, compared to 100 per cent last year, at its board of directors meeting yesterday issued its usual amount of bunk. The steel bosses handed out millions in profits to the coupon clippers. They said steel production would increase in the fall. Every worker will remember that these same bosses said after the stock market crash that steel production would not go down. It went away down. Later they said it would go up to 90 per cent. It dropped to 50 per cent. Their present statement should not fool anybody.

Resistance to wage cuts is growing all over the country. These wage cuts will become more frequent as the crisis worsens. Behind the wage cuts are not only the bosses but the entire machinery of the A. F. of L. The Trade Union Unity League is leading the work of organization for strike against wage cuts. It is doing this in the mine fields, in the automobile industries, in the needle trades, in the metal industries. It is these industries which have been hardest hit by wage cuts. The strikers against wage cuts must be extended.

'WORKING WOMEN' AUG. ISSUE IS OUT

Fights Imperialist War Danger

Working women of all trades are mobilizing for the Anti-War Demonstration to be held in Union Sq. Final mobilization for the August first demonstration found many women of the various trades actively engaged in activities arranged by the revolutionary unions and mass organization of workers.

A special call issued by the Women's Department of the Communist Party, U.S.A., was distributed in front of large factories employing women workers. Special battalions of women workers with slogans calling upon the working women to participate in the demonstration have been organized in the various sections of the city to picket the shops and lead the workers to Union Square.

Trucks bearing anti-imperialist war slogans are to tour some of the industrial sections where women workers are employed. Working women in ever larger numbers are beginning to see through the schemes of the imperialist government of this country who are preparing war sentiment by organizing the gold star mother tours and other war propaganda. All indications point to the fact that in this anti-war demonstration on this August First, 1930, the turn out of women workers, who are the greatest victims of capitalist war, will be better than at any previous demonstration arranged by the Communist Party.

The August issue of the Working Woman is off the press ready for sale and distribution among the women workers. We also have some copies of the special Call for August first. All comrades are called upon to report to the office of the Women's Department of the Communist Party, 28 Union Sq. to secure their share of literature for final distribution.

JAIL 200 IN FRANCE ON EVE OF AUG. 1

44 Jailed in Budapest; Police Arm in Spain

PARIS, July 31.—On the eve of the world demonstrations against imperialist war on August 1st, the fascist police chief, Chiappe, is mobilizing the entire police and military force around Paris in an effort to crush the demonstration planned by the Communist Party here.

There are 100,000 textile workers on strike around Lille who will be drawn into the demonstration. The police are planning attacks on these workers. Florimonde Bonte, managing editor of L'Humanite, Communist newspaper, was arrested this afternoon. Over 200 other leading comrades were jailed.

BUDAPEST, July 31.—Forty-four Communist leaders were imprisoned today, in an attempt to prevent the August 1st demonstration here.

MADRID, July 31.—The fascist government of Spain has ordered the police and civil guard to arm themselves in preparation for August 1st. There have been a series of strikes throughout Spain, and the government fears the August 1st demonstration of the workers.

AUG. 1 DEMONSTRATION PROHIBITED AT GRAZ

VIENNA, Austria, July 31.—The anti-war demonstration is prohibited at Graz. The International Austro-German meeting at Hallein is also prohibited. Vienna police have confiscated anti-war leaflets. Propagandists are arrested and local and provincial party headquarters are searched.

GERMAN JURIST OPPOSES EMERGENCY DECREES

BERLIN, July 31.—The doyen of the German jurists, Senate President Freymouth, has just published an analysis of the emergency decrees in the Berliner Tageblatt.

His conclusion is that the decrees are unconstitutional, illegal, and invalid, and that the taxpayers are legally justified to refuse to pay taxes thus imposed.

He said that workers councils should proceed against the firms that will attempt to deduct poll tax from workers' wages, etc. This article caused great sensation and such discomfort to the government.

WORKING WOMEN HIT WAR DANGER

Call For Participation in Aug. 1 Protest

NEW YORK.—Calling on all working class women to participate in the August 1st demonstrations, the United Council of Working Class Women today issued a statement which reads in part as follows:

"This August first marks the 16th year of the beginning of the last world slaughter (the world war). In hundreds of workers' homes in the United States, in millions of workers' homes the world over, the horrors of the last war are not yet forgotten. In spite of that the war mongers are again in the height of preparation for a new war among themselves and especially against the Soviet Union (the workers' fatherland). The capitalists cannot tolerate the success of the industrialization of the Soviet Union.

"The capitalists realize that the working class women will replace the male workers in time of war. In industry, that they will have to be instrumental in sending the boys across, that they will have to boost patriotism in the capitalist countries, and will also have to do actual fighting.

"The working class women will not, however, be misled by these maneuvers. The working class women and wives of workers, will come out into the streets on August 1st, and will raise their voices of protest against imperialist wars. On August 1st, the working class women will tell the whole world that they will fight the war danger, and they will demand that the billions of dollars being used for war armaments should be used for unemployment relief.

ARREST 2 WORKERS DISTRIBUTING AUG. 1 CALLS

NEW YORK.—Upon the instigation of the Hearst bosses, police arrested two workers who were distributing shop papers and August 1st leaflets to the Hearst Building workers. The shop papers expose the conditions of the maintenance men in the Hearst building and calling for organization of the workers.

When the two workers, K. M. Cohen and M. Theos were brought to night court the police had difficulty in placing charges against them and they were dismissed.

STRIKE AGAINST CUT IN BOND CO.

Metal Workers League Calls Rest Out

JERSEY CITY, N. J., July 31.—With 300 on strike against a ten per cent wage cut in the Bond Electric Corporation here, the Metal Workers Industrial League is organizing rapidly and calling on the rest of the 1,700 young girl workers to come out.

The strike started with 700 coming out. Wage cuts of 10 per cent for all piece workers and cuts of from 50 cents to a dollar for all earning over \$10 on time work aroused intense resentment.

The bosses talked to the strikers, and with sweet words and fake promises persuaded 400 back. These will soon find the machinery speeded so that they pay in work for the lack of a cut, and then many will be fired.

The M.W.I.L. is calling a meeting. There are 150 police at the factory at times.
