









Our friend gets a job . . . here he is at work . . . signalling the sling man . . . watching it rise . . . and there goes the lunch whistle. . . .








Well, there's the beanery . . . let's see what they've got for a hungry man . . . That corned beef sounds pretty good . . . let'er go. . . .
