## LABOR DAY

THE CENTRAL LABOR UNION CELEBRATION THE USUAL SUCCESS—HARRIMAN SPEAKS.

The annual Labor day celebration of the Haverhill Central Labor Union was the usual success. The Pines being crowded from early morning until midnight. The program arranged was carried out without a hitch and the various sports and amusements were run as per schedule and gave general satisfaction.

The Haverhill Social Democratic band provided music for the occasion and elicited approval and applause from the visitors. The band members wore their new uniforms for the first time and made a fine showing under the leadership of Comrade Albert L. Gillen.

The principal event of the day to many was the political symposium of representatives of the various parties at 2 o'clock in the afternoon. Agent Donovan of the shoe council acted as presiding officer and introduced the speakers, who were E. L. Daley, representing organized labor; Representative Dean of Wakefield for the democratic party, and Job Harriman of California for the Social Democratic party. Attorney General Knowlton was expected as representative of the republican party, but did not attend, sending instead a letter of regret.

The muscles of workmen are the fountain of wealth and workmen's power becomes wealth as soon as it becomes a commodity. Harriman next devoted several minutes to establishing an elaborate parallel concerning labor conditions, developing and elaborating his premise and not giving forth his simile till the last, when his ideas were received with appreciative applause.

Mr. Daley's speech was devoted entirely to trades unionism. He was followed by Representative Dean, who defended and advocated the democratic party in a rambling and disjointed way. Job Harriman was late in arriving at the grounds, but received a warm welcome when he came on the platform. He spoke earnestly, eloquently and enthusiastically and was frequently interrupted by applause.

"Again the republican party has declared: 'We renew our belief in the policy of protecting American industry.' These were two issues in which the American people were absorbed four years ago. Now they will wish for the struggle among all the railroads of the past. What are these issues—the expression of temporary conditions that change as times change. It is important for people of the United States to own the railroads—yes, that is important; but if we should get just the railroads, the conditions would remain just the same. These are but incidents not the end of the goal of freeing a great people for the struggle among all in power."

your bread and butter. You do not develop because you compete with one another. The wheat does not develop off the weeds and stones, but through favorable soil and with the aid of the sun and air. We do not grow because of the back rooms of tenement houses, but they unfold as they have hours of leisure and their just due of the product of their work. All nature is full of examples of this. You raise a geranium on this eastern coast and if it attains to blossoms three or four inches across you think you have done well. But if the frost comes it is nipped and dies. We in California take it, plant it in the sandy soil, where it is nourished by the summer's sun and the gentle rain and this geranium grows to be sometimes a six or seven-foot plant, covered with large beautiful blossoms. And yet it is the same geranium. And so every hope and every aspiration is blasted when you meet the modern factory, the door of ambition is closed, and men are downcast. But when men gather the full fruits of their labor, they become giants, morally and intellectually, instead of the pigmies that they are today. I beseech you, men, vote for your candidate, not alone to put them in office, but overcome this more refined cannibalism. Cast your vote for this new system by which society will be reorganized and we will be able to say to the storms of the commercial sea, 'Peace, be still!'
