But all this evidence fell on deaf ears when it came before Judge Bach. He had issued that mandamus and he was going to see it operate, so he found Schwartz guilty of contempt of court, and imposed a jail sentence of five days and a \$500 fine, which was suspended during good behavior.

The rank injustice of the sentence rests in the fact that no jury trial is allowed, that Schwartz can be arrested on any pretense at the will of the judge, that he is practically debarred from fulfilling his functions as secretary of his union and forwarding the interests of the strike, and that the sentence hangs over him for 20 years, or as long as this judge is on the bench.

Another rank feature of the case is that there is a political feature behind it-nice, clean, capitalist politics. Judge Bach is a democrat while Schwartz is a republican. At the last in the first ward contested Schwartz' telegraphers.

But all this evidence fell on deaf ears when it came before Judge Bach. He had issued that mandamus and he was going to see it operate, so he found Schwartz guilty of contempt of court, and imposed a jail sentence of five days and a \$500 fine, which was suspended during good behavior.

The rank injustice of the sentence rests in the fact that no jury trial is allowed, that Schwartz can be arrested on any pretense at the will of the judge, that he is practically debarred from fulfilling his functions as secretary of his union and forwarding the interests of the strike, and that the sentence hangs over him for 20 years, or as long as this judge is on the bench.

Another rank feature of the case is that there is a political feature behind it-nice, clean, capitalist politics. Judge Bach is a democrat while Schwartz is a republican. At the last in the first ward contested Schwartz' telegraphers.
