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








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Why Public Ownership is Reasonable

A public utility is a thing that holds the same relation toward a 'public user" as a private utility holds toward a "private user;" to illustrate.—A horse that the farmer must till his ground with, a cow which he must use to sustain the life of himself and family, the cook stove which he must use in order to prepare his food, or the wagon, plow or any other farming implement which he must use in order to cultivate and market his produce, is SACREDLY PRI-VATE, and its ownership is vested in him in toto, and no political party, either Republican, Democratic, Populist or Socialist disputes or questions his ownership.

Now, if the thing that the farmer or any other individual must use in his daily avocations of life, is sacred and subject to "private ownership," to be owned and controlled by him and his family, then undoubtedly no one is so dense and so ignorant that they would attempt to limit the private owner ship of these things, to a family of any certain size; as a family of ten-children has just as much right to the private ownership of the things which they privately use, as does the family of only two children; now, if the family of ten children have the same right to own and control the things which must be "PRIVATELY USED' by that family, as has the family of two children, and no one will dispute it, then the family of fifteen children has exactly the same right as the family of two, or ten, have they not?

Who was it out there in the audience said that he was neither married nor had a single living relative, and declared that the only "family" that he belonged to was the "human family?"——Step up here, Mister, you are exactly the man we want to see, as you have spoken up just in time to learn that you belong to the GREATEST and only REAL family that ever existed.

Every one has agreed that our logic so far is true, and that the things that must be "PRIVATELY USED" by a family should be "PRIVATE PROPERTY." -You have also agreed with us that

the size of the family does not alter

the conditions which govern that family's private property, as you have agreed that the family of two has the same right as the family of ten, and you have also agreed that the family of ten has the same rights as the family of fifteen and vice versa.

Now, if a family presided over by a father and mother have a right to privately own and use everything in connection with their private life and their private necessities; then why should not the things which two of these private families are compelled to use, as a lane or road that leads to town, to church or school, be just as sacredly private, although essentially public, as the things which every family privately uses?—You declare that so far our logic is correct.

Now, Mr. Reader, in order for these two families to enjoy the visits of their neighbors, the call of the mail-carrier, the groceryman or any other business which their neighbors must transact with them, it becomes necessary for them to use this lane or road in a public manner; now would it be right or just should a third family move in upon the borders of that road, for them to be deprived of the same use of said road as the two first families?——Everybody says, NO it would be inhuman to treat the third family in this manner, and everybody is right.

Now, Mr. Reader, this lane or road which the three families use is as much "PRIVATE PROP-ERTY" as the horse, the cow, the cook stove or the plow that either one of the three families use privately, and the road is only designated as "PUBLIC PROPERTY" simply because more than one family use it.

If these three families have a "COMMUNITY INTEREST" in that road, then as many other families as desire can use that road, for the transaction of any legitimate business they may have with that community of three families, and that road only becomes "PUB-LIC PROPERTY" simply because the public in general use it; but it as essentially "PRIVATE PROPERTY" as the cow or horse that is privately used, as the comand freely mingle and commingle with each other without that road.

Now, if a community of two, three, ten, twenty or as many more families as the case may be, have a "PRIVATE INTEREST" in that road to publicly transact their business, then you must acknowledge, Mr. Reader, that this road has become a "COMMUNITY IN-TEREST" and cannot be bounded by imaginary lines; therefore, we have dispelled from your mind the old fogy belief that there really exists any material difference between the thing used only by yourself and family, and things which are used by a group of families, as the difference in these two propositions only lingers in a mind which has not been properly educated.

Now, suppose that your lawmakers would enact a law forbidding you to own a cow, a horse, a plow or anything else that you must "PRIVATELY USE," and instead of permitting you to own the above enumerated animals and implements, would declare that the ownership of these things which you PRIVATELY USE, should be vested in a company or corporation, and that every time you worked a horse that you must pay that company or "trust" a certain amount; that every time you milked your cow you had to do the same thing, or every time that you used a plow, harrow or cook stove you had to contribute a certain amount to the man or men who owned these things; what do you think you would say about it?----Why, bless your souls, you would fly to arms immediately, and you and your boys would become soldiers for liberty's sake, and your wives and daughters would become amazons in battle for righteousness' sake; but you will permit a set of men to own and control the railroad which you are compelled to use, the telegraph line which you must use at times, and the telephone line which, in this day and age of the world has become indispensable, to every family, and each time you use these HUMAN NECESSI-TIES, you contribute MORE for their use than they are worth, or else those who own and control these things would not become munity cannot transact its business | MILLIONAIRES while the users

The Republican party is a party of millionaires; therefore, they are opposed to you using your own "PRIVATE PROPERTY" in a public manner.—The Democratic party is a party of millionaires, and in harmony with the same class of men, and also oppose you using your PUBLIC NECESSITIES for your PRIVATE BENEFIT.

should be owned and controlled by the individual members of that family, then pray tell us why the thing or things used by the individuals of a "COLLECTIVE FAM-ILY" should not be used in the same manner?-Give us a lucid reason why the same logic should not apply to the "COLLECTIVE FAMILY" as does to the "INDI-VIDUAL FAMILY" and you will make it plain to the minds of millions why the "MINORITY" should own, control and charge exhorbitant prices for the thing or things which the "MAJORITY" or the collective family is compelled to use or suffer.

The railroad, the telegraph line, nor the telephone line cannot be used, under the present system, until there is a PRICE PAID FOR THEIR USE, and so long as the user of these things which are used in public, is content to pay an UN-REASONABLE PRICE to their owners for that privilege, just that long human leeches will gather in the sweat of labor's brow; but when the time arrives that the "COLLECTIVE FAMILY" opens its eyes to the injustice of this hellish practice and declares that it, ITSELF, is the nation, and will own and control ITS - OWN UTILITIES, then will toil reap to the fullest extent of her sowing, less the ACTUAL price of production and transportation, and will not be compelled to add to the ACTUAL COST of these things an unreasonable profit to create millionaire swaggarts and pinched faced paupers to march hand in hand through a land whose hills and mountains are bursting with fuel and minerals, and whose valleys groan beneath an abundant harvest.



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
