



"Of course!" she said, hastily, blushing. "Why, I might have known. Give me a bushel, please." -Ladies' Home, Journal.



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
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
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

## What is Socialism?

By P. A. ZARING, M.D., Brownstown, Ind.

Many people have given many definitions to Socialism, yet many other people still have only a vague idea of what it means. Some critics have even urged it as an objection to the system that it is thus indefinitely defined, and thus indifferently understood. But as much might be charged against any other party, class, order, sect or cult. Even the old political parties after all of their labored efforts to explain their principles and platforms, yet have occasions to object to some of the attributes which are ascribed to them by outsiders.

So outsiders have vague ideas of the meaning of Freemasonry, or Agnosticisms. But the initiated understand themselves, and one another, much better.

It is difficult, impossible in fact, to describe a room or place we have never been in. But once on the inside, an impartial study of what is apparent, will clear up all misunderstandings. So I believe that Socialists understand themselves quite as well as do others.

Reduced to its simplest elements, Socialism is the doctrine that THE PRODUCER SHOULD HAVE ALL THAT HE PRODUCES, then what will be left for the nonproducers? Absolutely and emphatically, NOTHING.

Now, let us know what we mean by the producers and the non-producers, and the tenets of Socialism will be as clearly understood as could be desired.

The first of occupations is agrithe farmer and stock raiser is a producer. Farm products are called produce. But the farmer only partly prepares his products for preparation, the miller, the baker, the butcher, the packer, the canner, the preserver, the spiner, the weaver, the tailor, and all others who assist directly or indirectly to prepare these products for consumption, are producers.

The transporter who conveys these products from the farm to the factory and thence to the consumer, thus saving the individuals the time, trouble and expense of carrying their 'own supplies, thus enabling them to produce the more, is himself a producer.

The merchant who keeps these goods in quantities and saving people the delay of sending away for their necessities, and giving them the opportunity to see the goods before purchasing, may and do augment the producing capacity of the producers, and is therefore a producer himself, and in the absence of a better system is a necessity, and is entitled to his prorata

But the trust that gets control of these products, and without increasing the quantity or quality one iota, makes a profit by merely raising the prices, is not a producer, and has no moral right to participate in the deal.

Everybody knows that the quarryman, the stone cutter, the miner, and the smelter, are producers, so as already argued, are the transporters of these products, and those who manufacture them into useful wares. But the mere speculator who adds to such products additional costs, to enrich himself, as well as the agent who goes about selling people what they do not need, is not a producer and should be dispensed with.

It is generally conceded that intelligent people can and do produce more than the ignorant do or can. Then the educator who instructs a number of people, thus increasing their producing power, is himself a producer, pre-eminently.

The physician who restores the languishing to health and usefulness, and saves valuable lives that otherwise would be lost to the genculture. Everybody knows that eral economy, is unquestionably a producer. But the charlatan who imposes upon credulity whether through ignorance or wilful dishonesty, inflicting unnecessary exuse. Then those who complete the pense upon his dupes, and some times even leaving them in worse physical condition than he found them, actually causing their death, sometimes, is not only a non-producer, but a destroyer of products, by diminishing the number and efficiency of producers. Not only should he be denied any part of the producer's reward, but he should be punished according to the gravity of his misdeeds.

> The mechanic is plainly a producer. Even the contractor, by skillfully managing labor, and thus increasing production, over what

it would be, by random effort, is a worthy producer. But the contractor who makes his profit by giving short measure, as is now so common on public works, should be dealt with as any other thief.

The artist is a producer to the extent that he is an educator. So with the stage actor. To whatever extent they increase the intellectual power and comprehension of their patrons, and consequently augment their producing capacity to that; extent they may be considered producers. But the Socialist world must and will learn to discriminate between art that is calculated to educate the intellect, exalt the ideals, and so increase the powers of the devotee, and art that only excites fancy, influences the passions, and renders the individual weak, trivial and superficial.

Artists of the better types might be available as mere entertainers, if not apparent producers; for we need rest and diversion quite as well as labor, and production. Our ultimate aim is happiness. Whatever makes us happy without making others unhappy, and without reacting and making ourselves unhappy afterward, is eligible. "If the artist can furnish such pleasure or happiness, he is directly a producer.

It is only as an artist or entertainer that the clergyman can be considered available, and will be tolerated as an element of the general economy when Socialism shall have adjusted all classes to their proper relations. FORTHE PRIEST OR PREACHER CAN NOT BE CONSIDERED PRODUCER IN ANY SENSE WHATEVER.

The time has been when an army of defense was a necessity to guard against invasion, thus protecting those who produced the necessaries of life. At that time whatever army and navy were actually needed for defense of the producers were themselves producers.

The modern parasites who extort their very high living from the masses by this unholy profession, argue that this necessity still obtains. If it does, it is because they will have it so. If all of the nations would dismiss their armaments and never recruit them again, there would be no more war, and no necessity for any. The great casus belli has always been armament together with ambition to achieve reputation for heroism. If all armaments were discharged it would at once be recognized that they never had been needed. Na-

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tions could do business like individuals, trade if they want to, and if not just let it alone. Thus an enormous burden would be lifted from the shoulders of the producing class.

The politician who studies government for the good of a state or nation, and seeks unselfishly to preserve its safety, to defend its existence, and rights against foreign aggression, and to augment its strength and resources, and to improve the morals and well being of its people, is a producer well worthy of credit. But demagogues, whether in low places or high places, or out of any place at all are enemies of social equality and should be and will be eliminated from the social economy.

There is no way imaginable by which an attorney can be rated as producers. It is of no wonder that they are generally opposed to Socialism. In the rise of Socialism, they read the doom of their profession.

The journalists who always stand for what is right, whether it be popular or not, and who can even decline a subsidy, in the interest of justice, and who furnishes reliable information, to the producers on all matters pertinent to them as such, is pre-eminently a producer. I do not know exactly how many such there are. It seems to me that a very small number should be sufficient to revolutionize the corrupt systems of government, militarism, commercialism, and religion, under which the enslaved masses are now groaning.

It has been estimated that if the producer got the full benefit of what he produces, he would need to work only one hour where he now works eight. This sounds mighty loud, but it may not be any exaggertion. Let us allow that it is correct. Then if matters were as they should be, the great producing class could earn in one hour per day as good a living as it now earns in eight hours a day. Let the average man then work two hours a day and he could soon lay by a competence against unavoidable contingecies.

It does not hurt any well person to labor thus much, and it does not obtund the intellect. He could thus support his family, and have an abundance of time for mental and moral improvement. It would be so easy to earn an honest living that there would be but little temptation to dishonesty. It would nal.

be impossible to amass a great fortune, and so there would be but little temptation to greed. Everybody could see his way to be equal to everybody else, and there would be but little inclination to vagrancy.

Then when everybody has a plenty, without any very strenuous effort and the anxiety to get rich is gone with the opportunity, approximate contentment will obtain. Those who are contented are very nearly happy. And happiness is the ultimate aim of every life. But no one can be contented with his lot, and consequently, happy, while others possess more than himself, and he sees how he too might have obtained more, or how he may yet increase his wealth.

into granting him the privilege that any more for a day's labor than he desires; but what do the railroads, the telephone corporations, the gas light and electric light corporations do in such cases? Ah, they throttle the arm of justice with anarchistic principles, as they buy the officials to deprive and coerce the rightful owner of the property they covet, and by the process of "condemnation," which is as unjust and as dastardly a process as ever disgraced a free and enlightened country.

But our millionaire anarchists, resort to this lawless practice, week in and week out, month in and month out; but when labor forms organizations, and goes to our millionaire anarchists, who have raped and ravished every fundamental principle of a free government, and asks them to grant labor a just reward for its sweat and toil, then these lawless millionaire anarchists will set up a howl of anarchy, and accuse labor of practicing anarchy, and will brazenly inform the strong arm of toil that she has no right to set a price upon a day's labor; and there is not a railroad, a telephone company, a gas company or a street railroad, but what sets the price that you and I shall pay, and if we rebel against extortion, they will tell us to go smack smooth to the southern corner of hell, and ask us what we are going to do about it, as they have the franchise, and no one else is permitted to enjoy that privilege, and they know full well, that that franchise was gained through and by anarchistic principles, as they know that they enjoy that privilege by legalized theft, as they refused to pay the public or the individual, as the case may be, a reasonable price, for that or public rebelled, they resorted to the process of "condemnation" of public or private property, which is anarchistic in its conception and damnable in its practice.

Mr. Voter, let's do a little thinking on our own hook, just for a few short moments, and let's learn, if possible, why the interests of the man whose only ambition is to make money, is not in harmony with the laborer.

It is a known fact, that labor is the foundation of all wealth; therefore, those who have no other ambition than to accumulate wealth must employ labor.

Now, since such is the case, do you suppose that it is to the interest of those who hire labor, to pay

they can possibly help? Ah, most assuredly not, as the cheaper wealth can hire labor, the greater wealth's profit will be; then how in the name of common sense any toiler can get it into his infernal thick head, that his interests and the interests of wealth are in harmony with one another, is more than we can understand; for what is to the advantage of the man who has labor to sell, is to the disadvantage of the man or set of men who must buy labor; consequently, wealth endeavors to place the wealthy in office to make our laws, and the wealthy in office to execute them; for it is by this scheme that they make laws to oppress labor, and execute them to force labor to do their bidding; and such a process is anarchistic, and you can't make anything else out of it, as a law that is unjust to the masses is as anarchistic in its conception and in its execution, is the essence of anarchy itself, as an unjust law is worse than no law at all. 

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

Yes, we have outgrown our usefulness and forgotten our first lessons of honor, which were bought by the heart's blood of our forefathers.




#### HEATHENS.



# Over-Production Tommyrot

"Over-production!" What is it? Is it too much food and clothing, too many homes? . It is absurd to so conclude while 80 per cent of the people are homeless and lack proper food and clothes. "Inability to buy back what is produced"-this is the, true explanation. Let me illustrate the use of lines. Here are two lines:

One is five times as long as the The long line represents wealth produced, while the short line represents wages. (See Census Bulletin No. 150.) It is evident that, as wages equal but 20 per cent of wealth produced, only 20 per cent can be bought back and consumed. The 80 per cent is "over-production"—even though every worker in the land is naked and hungry.

Study the lesson in these lines. See in them what capitalism does for the working class. The proportion one line bears to the other is immaterial. Suppose it to be 50 per cent, instead of 20 per cent. thus:

The lesson is the same. The working class could then buy back but 50 per cent of what they produced—the other 50 per cent would be "over-production" even though the whole world of workers were in poverty and rags.

Capitalism has no remedy. On the contrary, it gets worse. As the factory system and improved farm machinery reach other lands (and they are going everywhere), the "over-production" increases and becomes world-wide, and we are therefore approaching a worldwide panic. Nothing can break this world-wide panic except to overthrow capitalism and adopt Socialism, so that all who produce may be able to buy back the full value of their product.

Look at this diagram, representing the difference between production and wages-or production and ability to consume, supposing the difference to be 50 per cent instead of 80 per cent, according to government figures:

TATE OF THE PARTY OF THE PARTY.

The top line represents WAGES middle line, total wealth produced; bottom line, wealth not consumed, or "over-production."

And this "over-production" is present in all the great nations now-Germany, England, France, the United States, Japan-and is spreading to China, Russia and every part of the globe as fast as the machinery can be shipped.

Now, put your thinker to work. What must occur when the "overproduction" represented by these lines is world-wide? Surplus everywhere, market nowhere, panic everywhere, and every door of hope closed in all the world! The Socialist alone holds the key to unlock the door and release the world from panic.

Represented by diagram, Socialism proposes this:

First line represents production, 100 per cent. Second line represents pay, or ability to consume-100 per cent.

Hence, no over-production. This plan will distribute all wealth to the producers, hence better living -no poverty. Panics are caused by over-production-no market. Socialism will make panics impossible, as it will solve the problem of distribution of wealth. Machinery has solved the problem of producing wealth. The mission of Socialism is to solve the problem of distributng wealth.-W. L. Thurman, in Farmers' Journal.

## Roman Shackles Shattered

Rev. Father G. G. Fradrysso, a friar of the Franciscan Order of the Roman Catholic Church, who is a licentiate of the University of Madrid, and for twenty-two years had been in charge of a congregation in Barcelona, Spain, has been in Mobile, Alabama, being entertained by the Catholics.

On the evening of December first, however, he startled his friends in that city by renouncing the faith to which he so long had clung, and asserted that he could no longer accept the doctrines of the Roman Catholic Church, nor "SUBMIT TO THE YOKE OF THE PONTIFICATE."

He came here with a special dispensation from the Pope in his possession, by which he is empowered to exercise the functions of the priesthood in every diocese which he might travel, and the document confers upon him the right to grant absolution and extreme unction in cases where even many of the Catholic bishops are not permitted to act without special dispensation.

The reverend father asserts that he is much exercised over the letter which President Roosevelt wrote in condemning the attack upon Judge Taft's religion, in which the President asserted that a. Roman Catholic might exercise the functions of the Presidency, equally as well as a Protestant.

In answer to this, Father Fradrysso has addressed a long letter to the President, in which he says:

"The great power and civilization of this country, which is the admiration of the world, is in great measure, due to her religious freedom, and in order to guarantee and preserve this precious liberty, her citizens should be very cautious before casting their votes for a Presidential candidate of the Roman Catholic faith, for if such a candidate was elected it would cause untold alarm throughout the country.

"The Roman doctrine obliges its followers, be they kings or presidents, to refuse any distinction whereby they must think and act in private differently from what they must do in public. In both instances they must be under expressed rules laid down by the Roman creed.

"A Roman Catholic President is required by his church to believe that the great American Constitution is reprehexsible and an unnatural crime, precisely because of its claim of religious freedom, and he must by all possible means, within his power, bring about reforms favorable to Romanism. He must believe that, notwithstanding his being the First Magistrate of the nation, he is at the same time and by the same concept a subject of the Pope. He must understand and firmly believe that above the sovereignty of the nation there stands the pontificate sovereignty, which he must obey over all, as it is within the power of the pontiff to release the subject of any oath of allegiance.

"A Roman Catholic President must believe that the ecclesiastical power is superior to the civil power; that the canon law is above the civil law; that the church and not the state must be the advisor in all matters appertaining to mortals, and in mixed affairs between the church and the state, the church and not the state must decide and be obeyed."—Ex.
