# TO THE READERS OF THE RIP-SAW GREETING:

Having concluded an arrangement with the publishers of the Rip-Saw under which I am to serve it, editorially and otherwise, beginning with the March issue, it is with much pleasure that I present myself to its many readers to voice my

greeting and to ask their consideration and co-operation.

The Rip-Saw has forged to the front during the last few years as a powerful exponent of the principles of Socialism and industrial democracy and as a fearless champion of the working class in all their struggles, economic and political, for emancipation. Its name is known and its columns are read wherever the struggle of the workers and producers is being waged on the American continent, and its many thousands of loyal and active supporters, who are at the same time among the most militant, energetic and tireless labor unionists and Socialists, constitute a tremendous force in the American struggle to rid the world of capitalism and wage-slavery and make way for the industrial commonwealth and the Socialist republic.

But this revolutionary force, organized and developed by the oppressed, robbed and degraded workers, can be greatly increased and improved and it is to this great task that I have been invited and to which I shall devote all the zeal and energy

at my command.

Giving full credit to the Rip-Saw and its management, including its staff of able and experienced writers, for having already placed it among the foremost revolutionary publications of the day, it can be said without the slightest reflection or disparagement that there is always room for improvement, a fact candidly admitted by the management in expressing the desire and determination to make each succeeding issue clearer in aim, higher in purpose, more steadfast in spirit and more advanced in method, thereby proving its fitness and worthiness to serve the people as an instrument for the overthrow of capitalist tyranny and the achievement of industrial and social emancipation.

Day by day, as the struggle proceeds, the need of a powerful press is borne in upon us and we can no longer hope to cope with the enemy, powerful, insolent, lawless and corrupt as never before, with any hope of escaping defeat, without a press

adequate to the crying demand of the American labor movement.

Papers there are in plenty, but either circulation is limited and they are barely able to support themselves or they lack class-conscious clarity and revolutionary vigor and enthusiasm. There are exceptions, of course, and the Rip-Saw will

be glad to note that these exceptions receive the loyal support they deserve and in due time become the rule.

The historic struggles now being waged in Colorado and Michigan; the abject subserviency of the governors, sheriffs and other executive and administrative officials to the brutal power of capitalism which rules with despotic sway in those states and in all other states of the Union; the murderous and cowardly assault upon and deportation of President Moyer; the infamous arrest and outrageous incarceration of Mother Jones; the shameless seizure of Adolph Germer and the dastardly insult to his wife by military blackguards; the atrocious crimes perpetrated upon strikers, too numerous to mention, and visited, without any more mercy than would be shown by hyenas upon helpless women and starving children,—all these cry aloud for a press that shall have the power and the nerve to expose the monster of capitalism, arouse the workers of the nation to the frightful menace that confronts them, appeal to them to unite and make common cause against the enemy, and not only point but LEAD the way to victory and emancipation.

The Rip-Saw will stand staunchly for the organization of the working class along the lines of industrial unionism and Socialism, and its policy will be to uphold the workers, organized and unorganized, in all their struggles to increase wages,

lower working hours, protect life and health, and better their condition and strengthen their position generally.

The Rip-Saw, realizing the vitally essential need of education, will use all its influence to spread the truth among the workers to the end that they may be organized in powerful industrial unions, as well as in their own revolutionary political party, that the maximum efficieny of their class power may be developed and brought into play, not only to fight their battles in the struggle now being so fiercely waged, but that they may be fitted by self-imposed discipline, self-restraint and the cultivation of the social and co-operative spirit, to operate the industries of the nation when they shall have been wrested from the ownership and control of the capitalist exploiters now in power.

Upon the basis of these principles and this policy, briefly outlined, we appeal to the readers and friends of the Rip-Saw to join in making its name a terror to capitalism and its regime of crime and corruption, and a beacon of hope and

strength and inspiration to the toiling and producing masses.



# THE SPIRIT OF CAPITALISM

When one reads of the awful disaster at Calumet, Michigan, on Christmas Eve, in which over three score human beings, nearly all children, perished, and hundreds of others were badly injured; and of the brutal treatment of Chas. H. Moyer, who was shot three times and beaten over the head and body by a blood-thirsty gang who styled themselves "The Citizens' Alliance," he can then begin to comprehend the true spirit of capitalism.

IF ALL THE HATE OF HELL, COMBINED WITH ALL THE GREED, MURDER, ROBBERY, DECEPTION, OPPRESSION, EXTORTION, CRUELTIES AND CRIMES OF ALL THE PAST AGES AND TINCTURED WITH THE MALEVOLENCE OF THE DEVIL, COULD BE GRASPED BY THE HUMAN INTELLECT, AND PICTURED ON THE HEARTS OF THE HUMAN RACE, IT WOULD SHOW, IN ALL ITS FIENDISH DIABOLISM, THE REAL SPIRIT OF CAPITALISM.

Let us try to picture to ourselves the scene at Calumet. A great strike had been on for several months between the miners and the capitalist mine owners.

The miners were holding out with persistence for a living wage, while the owners were resorting to every subterfuge known to their diabolical and hellish system to starve them into submission.

Feeling ran high, many of the citizens taking sides and organizing themselves into a "Citizens' Alliance.'

It was Christmas Eve, the birth night of the Lowly Nazarene, who himself was a poor workingman, and whose coming was heralded by the words: "Peace on earth and good will to all mankind."

But the spirit of capitalism reigned over Calumet.

Christmas means but little at best to the children of the working class.

The hand of greed has denied them the joys of the holiday season.

I can see them press their little faces against the window panes within which were delicious viands, and stop and gaze with sad disappointment through the great windows where warm clothing with bright colors was skillfully displayed.

But it was not for them.

There was one place, however, to which they could go. A great hall had been provided by the striking miners in which to enjoy the Holiday festivities; and to this the little ones turned their hearts and their footsteps.

The great hall was crowded; the program was in full blast. There were glad hearts and joyous laughter.

Suddenly a light flashed and a human fiend with the demon of capitalism in his heart and wearing a badge of the Citizens' Alliance, shouted, Fire!

There was no fire—but there was a panic in which seventy-two lives-mostly children-were crushed out.

Quick to spring to the aid of those victims of the disaster and their friends was Chas. H. Moyer. He was great hearted, fearless and outspoken. He came to aid the miners in their strike and comfort the heart-broken in their sorrow. Because of this the demon of capitalism hated him and marked him as its victim. A mob of human brutes fell upon him in a hotel, shot him three times, clubbed him, and then dragged him to the depot, put him on a train and told him if he ever came back they would kill him.

That is the story shortly told and witnessed by many persons.

Moyer had committed no crime.

As the President of the Western Miners' Federation he had a right to be there to represent his organization.

In the light of all facts the Citizens' Alliance are outlaws.

If Moyer had committed any crime why didn't this gang of bloody cut-throats resort to the law, swear out a warrant and arrest him, giving him that protection which the law is supposed to guarantee to every one before he is punished?

These two crimes constitute a national shame and dis-

They do more than that.

They constitute a national warning.

If only the workingmen are expected to obey the law there may be trouble ahead.

"Rebellion is a medicine necessary for the health of a republic. God forbid that we ever should be twenty years without such a rebellion as Shay's."

—Thomas Jefferson.

On the night of April 18th, 1775, the people along the road from Boston to Concord were aroused from sleep by the cry of flying couriers—"To Arms! The red coats are coming." When the British advance reached Lexington at early dawn, it found sixty or seventy minute men drawn up on the green. "Disperse, ye rebels!" shouted the British officer. A volley was fired and seven Americans fell dead.

A few hours later British troops approaching Concord bridge were The crack of the fired upon. American rifles was heard from every fence and tree. The War of the Revolution had begun. What was it all about? George had levied a tax on tea, a luxury of the well-to-do in those days. He had taxed notes, bonds, stocks and testaments. A stamp had to be affixed to these documents held by a very few people. Smugglers, like John Hancock, had been convicted before British Courts and thrown into English jails. And a nation rose in arms to throw off the yoke of British 'tyranny."

How trifling appear the reasons for the Revolutionary War when we compare them with conditions around Calumet in the year of Our Lord 1914. What a decent sort of a chap was George the Third when we compare him with the copper barons of Boston, the sons of the American Revolution who own the copper mines of Michigan. All George wanted was a few pennies on every pound of tea consumed at American pink tea parties, and a little rake-off on chattel mortgages and similar parchments on which their owners drew not less than twenty per cent per annum. between a mining shaft and a badger hole. For the pay of managers, superintendents, presidents and directors of the company was paid out of the running expenses of the company. The wages of these gentlemen run anyway between \$10,000 to \$100,-000 per year.

Now when people take \$200,-000,000 out of a hole without going into the hole it stands to reason that the folks who do the actual work can't expect too much. If they did they were disappointed, for I see by the government report lying before me that the copper miners received on an average \$2.98 per day while they worked. When they didn't work the pay stopped, but the living expenses went on just the same. So this cuts the living average pretty close to the hunger line. The working hours average between ten and eleven per day. Do you wonder they started a strike?

Now what does it all mean? It means that King George during his whole life never got as much money out of the American colonists as a few Boston buccaneers have got out of the Calumet and Hecla miners. It means that if Adam and Eve and Cain and Abel had started to earn their living in the sweat of their brows and had made \$100 per day on the job and put every cent of that daily wage in their socks, they would now have just about \$200,000,000 plunks put away. It means that if every man, woman and child who lived in Boston in 1775 was still living, and had saved \$100 every year until this very day, all of them together wouldn't have as much as the stockholders of the Calumet and Hecla mines squeezed out of a couple thousand miners in forty years. It means that the American people are just about the biggest aggregation of pure and undulterated damphools to be found in all the world.

Since the American people seem to have lost every bit of backbone, why not allow Finlanders and Slavonians to start a movement to translate Fourth of July orations into American life. They could begin by having another Boston tea party-but they could improve on it by throwing the Boston stockholders of the Calumet and Hecla Mines in the water, instead of perfectly good tea that had never done any harm to anybody.

It's really too bad King George couldn't have lived long enough to see what a hell of a fix we got ourselves into by getting "free and independent." It would do his old soul good to come over here nowadays and say, "I told you so. I wanted to hang 'em but you wouldn't let me."



# Murder Will Ou

Government Report Discloses That Drunken Militia and Armed Deputies Started Violence That Resulted in Murder at Calumet

### Kate O'Hare's Story of Calumet in the December Rip-Saw Confirmed in Every Detail

The following press dispatch | taken from the St. Louis New Star of January 12, confirms the statements made in Kate O'Hare's story in the December Rip Saw, and in the reports publishe; in the labor press throughout the country. The bold fact is revealed that the truth has been suppressed by the capitalist class until they were forced into the corner by the recent outrages, and that the copper barons and their thugs have been guilty of every crime imaginable in Calumet:

Washington, Jan. 12.—Sensational features of the reiort of Department of Labor Investigator Walter B. Palmer on the Michigan copper mine war, which were not mentioned in the statement issued Saturday by Secretary Wilson will form the basis for a renewed appeal for a Congressional inquiry.

Among the findings by Palmer which were suppressed were the following:

"Many Michigan militia men became intoxicated and were allowed to wander about the streets armed.

"Much violence, some of which resulted in fatalities, was provoked by the armed deputies imported by the mining companies.

"Many of the mines are entirely lacking in proper provisions for safety, sanitation and drinking water for the employes.

"Employes who have built homes on land rented from the Calumet and Hecla Company may be dispossessed of their property when they are discharged or otherwise leave the employment of the concern.

"Men employed in the mines as trammers perform the labor of beasts of burden and soon wear out."

Officers of the American Federation of Labor are preparing to bring the statements by Investigator Palma er to the attention of the House and Senate this week. They also will lay stress on the declaration of the companies that they will not tolerate the presence of a single union man on their payrolls.

This attitude, in itself, ear the leaders of labor, would "Civilization." then civil

warrant a Congressional investigation in an age when workingmen are recognized to have as much right to organize as have their employers.

Worse things than are told in the foregoing press dispatch is now leaking out through the Finnish Socialists of Calumet. The Buffalo (N. Y.) Socialist, in its issue of January 10, tells the following:

"The fact that 62 of the victims of the night before Christmas at Calumet were Finns is one reason why the authorities were so anxious to arrest the editors of the Tyomies which is a Finnish paper.

We are informed that about 25 of the guards and Citizens Alliance were in the saloon beneath the Italian hall at the time of the catastrophe, waiting for the signal

to rush out and block the stairway, which they did.

The Finnish papers state that something was thrown in the stairway and when two of the men attempted to clear it the deputies drove them: away. Instead of clearing the stairway they stopped the people and caused them to pile one upon the other. One of the deputies got into the hall and twisted a six year old boy until his neck was broken, and dragged one man by the throat until his thumbs stuck through his windpipe.

The deputies and citizens seemed crazed with delight. One man, who said there was no fire was immediately knocked down with a blow from the night stick of one of the deputies.

These are some of the terrible things credited to the 'law and order' element."

NATIONAL BIP-BAW.

Editor's Note—A series of twelve articles on the "Socialist Party" began in the January issue of the Rip-Saw, to run through the year 1914. A Socialist Local is like a human, being with its several ages; five or six like-minded comrades, united by a vision of a world-to-be in which there will be no classes, no exploitation, no poverty, and no undeserved economic misery, unite and secure a "charter" from the state organization of the Socialist Party. The group begins to grow, enrolling new members elected to membership by the local itself. The members hold "Red-Carda" and pay dues for the support of the organization, precisely as trade union members and lodge members are enrolled and hold membership cards and pay dues.

The baby local finds that going through the "order of business" uses about all of its time, for learning par-Hamentary procedure is a slow task. The local beside being a self-governing group handling Ita own local affairs, passes on the acts of its national and state officers and committees, through the device known as the initiative and referendum. And the state and national socialist bodies are in constant communication with each of the four thousand Socialist locals in America, submitting financial reports, new business, and proposed legislation in regard to the management of the National Party and the State Party organisations. Handling this routine work sometimes seems irksome, or unnecessary, and some of the new members do not realize that this kindergarten stage must be gone. through that here are being learned the first lessons of real democratic political management.

#### Propaganda Work.

siderable detail work involved in his membership. He must assist in holding city conventions, framing city platforms, nominating tickets for the city election, raising the necessary campaign funds from among his friends and shop mates, and helping in the campaign before the election day. All this is done by the local, not by the individual candidates. And even then the work is not yet done. The local must see that the vote is honestly counted, and when necessary fight some more to see that the elected Socialist officials are not unseated by the fraud of unscrupulous political opponents.

#### Committee Work.

As time goes on, the local grown large in membership and with yarled functions, finds that the "general meeting" can no longer transact all of its business. The general meeting sits as a board of control and a special committee takes charge of each department-lecture work, house to house distribution of literature, organization of women, young people's work, holding pienies and encamp-ments, running the local Socialist weekly paper, looking after the legal. political duties of the party, conducting social entertainments, strike-relief work, etc. In a large city, where the membership reaches sometimes several thousand, the activities of the total are intensely varied and complicated, and specialists are developed to handle the increasingly complicated work, yet all are under control of the rank and file






