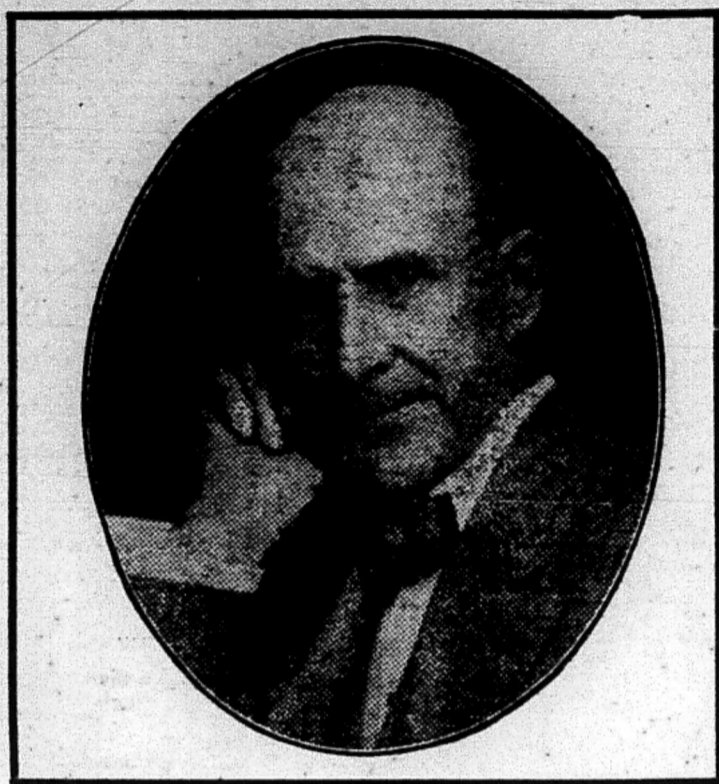

THE WAR IN MEXICO

The most powerful exploiting interests in the world are fighting for the conquest of Mexico. There are untold riches in sight there and these are coveted by rival gangs of capitalist brigands who are fighting for supremacy for themselves and for the subjugation and enslavement of the Mexican people.

The American and British capitalists are the most powerful among these invading marauders, the former grouped under the head of Standard Oil and the latter known as the Pearson interests, and these are furnishing the finances and directing the destinies of the nation as far as it is in their power to control them.

It is needless to say that the object of these rival aggregations of freebooters is precisely the same. Predatory by their very nature they have but one motive that animates them and that is their inordinate greed for profit. From first to last in every thought that enters their minds and every move they make, they are mercenary, brutal and without pity for their victims. They care absolutely nothing about Mexico, its government, its people. They would rape the nation and debauch its populace provided only they could convert its wretchedness and squalor and misery into profit for themselves. The lust for gold is their only incentive and they scruple not in the remotest degree as to how they accomplish their nefarious ends.

If it were necessary to sink the working class of Mexico to the level of cave men and beasts they would do it joyfully if they had the power, and then boast of how they were developing industry to promote the happiness and prosperity of the people.

These plutocratic pirates may be fighting one another, but they are all looking for another Diaz to crush the twelve million peons and keep them under the iron hoof of a military despotism and they will all unite when it comes to carrying out their common program of conquest and robbery.

But it is too late in the day for another Diaz. The revolution is in full swing and the toiling masses who have been despoiled of their lands and exploited to exhaustion are in it, of it, behind it and all about it. Constitutional government and the restoration of the land to the people are the supreme demands and these must be conceded before there can be peace in Mexico.

We are with the Mexican peons, our proletarian comrades across the border, heart and soul, in their struggle to drive out their despoilers. Their masters are also our masters, their exploiters our exploiters, their struggle our struggle, and we shall unite with them in one revolutionary body, strike hands in comradely concord across the Rio Grande, and fight together to destroy the devouring monster of capitalism and emancipate ourselves and our loved ones from our common slavery.

CARL PERSON'S TRIAL

After serving more than five months in the De Witt county jail, Illinois, charged with the murder of the thug who lured him from his office and assaulted him, Carl Person has finally been admitted to bail and released from custody. This is the first step in the trial that must finally result in Person's complete liberation and vindication.

The killing with which Carl Person is charged was the outgrowth of the strike of the shop employes of the Illinois Central railroad which has been on for over two years and is still on. Person was the leader in said strike and the editor of the official organ of the shop employes. He was assaulted by the thugs in the service of the company but he would not surrender and finally he was lured from his office by a company gunman and brutally beaten up, but, as it happened, he was armed at the time, as the result of being constantly dogged by strong arm men, and before being beaten into insensibility he succeeded in drawing his weapon and shooting to death his burly assailant.

The city of Clinton where this happened is completely dominated by the Illinois Central on account of the shops being located there, and ever since the killing all the powerful influences of the railroad, including as usual, the press and the pulpit, have been employed to prejudice the public mind and railroad the innocent victim to the gallows.

We say innocent advisedly for Carl Person acted solely in self-defense and only took the life of his brutal assailant, the hired thug of the railroad company, to save his own.

Comrade Pearson's lawyer, Frank Comerford, who has represented him with a loyalty and courage worthy of the highest commendation, has succeeded in procuring a change of venue. This is a big point gained, as it is notorious that De Witt county, the scene of the tragedy, is intensely prejudiced against Pearson on account of the complete domination of that community by the railroad company. Let us from now on stand by Comrade Pearson firmer than ever, until the hour of his acquittal! He is in trouble only because he upheld the cause of labor in one of its most desperate conflicts and we can do no less than to stand by him, financially, morally and otherwise until justice is done him.

INDUSTRIAL DEMOCRACY

The RIP-SAW stands for the Socialist party because the Socialist party stands for democracy, industrial and political democracy.

This means a free nation and a self-governing people.

Nothing less than socialism can mean anything of the kind.

As long as industry, the means of life, is the private property of the few, those few will rule and the masses of the people will be in servitude.

Ownership of the means of life of one class by another class, such as we have in the United States and in every other capitalist nation on earth, means class rule and class war; class supremacy and class subjection. It means that the few who own shall grow extremely rich without producing anything while the great mass who produce all shall remain in poverty.

It means Lawrence and Calumet and Ludlow; it means the brute struggle for existence for the working class and riotous opulence, self-indulgence and moral degeneration for the idle class.

The RIP-SAW stands opposed to all this in the name of the working class, in the name of the Socialist party, and in the name of our common humanity.

The RIP-SAW has no time to tinker with the so-called reform measures that are intended as a sop to the people, but it stands out squarely for the overthrow of industrial despotism and the establishment of industrial democracy. It does not object to rational reforms but on the contrary approves and will encourage all those that tend to better the condition of the workers, provided it is recognized that these are but temporary makeshifts and that the ultimate object of our agitation and of our organization is to destroy the profit system, wipe out wage-slavery, and establish the socialist republic.

Industrial democracy is essential to every other kind of democracy and without it there can be no democracy whatever. Economic freedom is the basis of all other freedom and until this be achieved our boasted liberty is a myth, a delusion and a snare.

We, the people, must own, control, regulate and manage industry, the means of our common life, so that we shall all have a chance to work, enjoy the fruit of our labor, have leisure time for recreation and the pursuit of happiness, and live the lives of civilized human beings.

THIEVING DEMOCRATS

The mileage steal in congress is entirely befitting the character of a national legislature composed of professional politicians in the service of the ruling and exploiting class. This steal is a brazen piece of business but the politicians, both republicans and democrats, have been getting by with it for the last three quarters of a century.

When the government was first founded and members of congress had to travel by stage coach and canal boat the mileage of members was fixed at 20 cents per mile. When railroads were built members of congress usually rode on passes but they continued to charge the government 20 cents per mile and that is the charge they are making today. It is pure robbery. It is picking the people's pockets and this by a gang of politicians who have already raised their salary to over \$600 per month and provided themselves with palatial offices at the people's expense.

Under this arrangement a congressman travels 500 miles and if he pays fare it amounts to \$10, and for this he puts in a bill to the government for \$100, a clear steal of \$90, which every congressman is guilty of who voted to perpetuate it.

Now, when the republicans were in power the democrats raised the cry of robbery against them upon this and other issues, declaring that when they got into power they would put a summary end to such looting of the public treasury.

A few honest democrats made an effort to carry out their pledge in good faith, but when it was put to the test the thieving democrats in congress by a great majority voted to continue the mileage robbery for which they had so roundly denounced the republicans.

This is a fair specimen of the kind of reform the democratic politicians stand for. They denounce thievery in republicans only to have them ousted that they may get a whack at the swag themselves.

There is nothing less sincere than a democratic politician nor anything less democratic than the democratic party.

The thievery of these politicians, both democrats and republicans alike, is of the system which they represent. Personally, most of them are entirely decent fellows. But as the political agents and representatives of the bigger thieves who furnish their campaign funds and finance their parties, they are in the game purely for what there is in it for themselves, and to talk about reforming this sort of politics is to betray a feeble mind or to be guilty of hypocrisy and deception.

Clean out the politicians who represent the parasites and put the working class, the only useful and necessary class, in power!

TWENTY YEARS AGO

At this time in 1894, the Pullman strike was shaking the country to its foundations. The strike was won, but the federal government snatched the victory from the strikers and turned it over to the railroads.

Grover Cleveland is dead, George Pullman is dead, E. St. John, Chairman of the General Managers' Association is dead, Judge Wood is dead, Judge Grosscup is in disgrace and a number of others who believed they had killed the American Railway Union and forever sealed the fate of the labor movement sleep in more or less forgotten graves, but the labor movement goes marching grandly toward its shining goal.

Twenty years have gone since the American Railway Union was crushed and its leaders jailed; the union crushed into larger and lustier life than ever before and its leaders jailed into the revolutionary movement that is shaking the foundations of the world.

Twenty marvelous years have these been in the industrial struggle in the United States. To all the old veterans of the A. R. U. we send a greeting and a hand-clasp. The fight they fought twenty years ago, though lost to themselves, was won for the working class.

BOUCK WHITE

The time will come when the world will marvel that such a crime as this great comrade of ours has been made the victim of was possible in the twentieth century.

Six months in jail for endeavoring in a perfectly polite and proper way to ask a civil question of a supposed minister of the gospel!

It staggers one to believe it can be true and yet the truth of the outrage confronts us and challenges us to know what we propose doing about it.

This question the future will answer in a manner to silence all doubt as to the outrage having been atoned for to the last second of Bouck White's infamous incarceration.

The clouds are gathering and the rumbling of the approaching storm that is to purge this nation of despotic capitalism and its unspeakable villainies is heard in the land.

Bouck White in jail means that capitalism has gone stark mad. Rockefeller and his sycophant preacher and lickspittle judge

may gloat over White for a brief moment, but White will emerge triumphant and glorified at last while the rich man may again lift up his eyes and vainly cry out for mercy from the depths of the damned.

TO THE RAILROAD MEN IN COLORADO

Where do you stand in this war of Rockefeller and his gang of cold-blooded murderers on the miners of Colorado?

Are you with Rockefeller or with the miners?

Thus far you have stood by Rockefeller, hauling the assassins to the camps to murder the women and babies of your fellow-workers, but I know that all this time your better nature has been in revolt against such scabbery and that but for your craft union chains you would long ere this have made common cause with the brave miners.

You must know that Rockefeller and his gang own the railroads as well as the mines and that you are brothers to the miners and are duty bound to stand by them instead of hauling the villainous gunmen to the camps to murder them and their families in cold blood.

Any craft union agreement with a corporation that defeats class solidarity and keeps the workers divided while the corporation robs them all is not only not a sacred document but a vicious and damnable one and the sooner the railroad men of Colorado recognize this fact and refuse, however indirectly, to scab on the miners, the sooner will the war in Colorado be ended with victory for the miners and with honor for all the workers who helped to win it.

We are all opposed to war.

Then let us put an end to war and lose no time about it.

How? Easiest thing in the world.

LET THE CAPITALISTS DO THE FIGHTING!

Do that and there will never be another war. Not even a skirmish. They are not fools enough to go out and kill one another and the fools they hire for that purpose they hold in contempt.

The capitalists tell us it is patriotic to fight for your country and shed your blood for the flag. Very well! Let them set the example.

It is their country; they own it and therefore according to their logic it is their patriotic duty to fight and die for it and be brought home riddled with bullets and covered with flowers as shining examples of patriotic duty to the youth of the nation.

It is one thing, ye uniformed slaves, to fight for your country and another thing to fight for Rockefeller's oil derricks.

You never had a country to fight for and never will have as much as an inch of one as long as you are fool enough to make a target of your bodies for the profit and glory of your masters.

Bessie Ruler's Attack

The great reproach to the suffrage movement is, that it is not founded on reason, or expediency or COMMON SENSE. It is in reality, an affair of misplaced sentiment and parrot chatter. There always seems to exist in the mind of the suffragist some obscure connection between the right to vote and the expediency of wearing the "pants." The lack of logic is shown in every thing she does and says, and in nothing we have undertaken have we so plainly shown how inconsistent, narrow and ignorant we are, as in this matter of Suffrage for Women. In giving their reasons for desiring the vote THEN it was, that not only the intellectual man, but the thinking woman as well, discovered that these advocates of this movement for Suffrage DID NOT understand what they were doing, why they were doing it, or how it could be done. A distinct flaw in the reasoning of a woman who demands a vote is found in her failure to comprehend that all legislation in the interest of man, must, necessarily be also in the interest of woman. Men and women, whether friends or foes, are forever associated in a common interest and a common destiny. On the plea of sex equality, she desires to sieze upon the "soft snaps," the lucrative and the learned professions and politics, all of which have been considered hitherto as a man's work. But we have yet to see the Suffragist hastening to enlist her services as a MINER, a PUDDLER, a SEWER-CLEANER or a STOKER. Women in America are fortunate in having, under the law equal rights without equal responsibilities, and nothing women have ever written, said or done with reference to the Suffrage movement would indicate she was fit or able to assume the many intricate responsibilities growing out of the many branches of politics.

In one breath of dramatic ecstasy a vote means everything—and then if the argument requires it, you are told: "It only takes a minute to vote." Right at this point, let me state to my readers some real facts, not theories, as to why the Anti-Suffrage Party are opposing the Votes for Women. What I am about to state are facts of record that can be easily verified by any one consulting the proper references. First, however, it is needless to say, those opposing the movement of Woman Suffrage have nothing to gain in a material way, therefore the motive is purely altruistic. The first thing needed to improve the economic condition of the "working woman" is not votes but to get rid of prejudices and class feeling. In choosing an occupation, economic well being is by no means the woman worker's first thought. Here comes in the feeling of caste. Domestic service is a profession offering to women high wages, a comfortable home, good food and a sheltered life. It is the one kind of work that is never over-crowded, the demand being always greater than the supply. And yet how many girls prefer to work for a miserable pittance in a sweat shop, factory or department store. PREFERRING to live under unsanitary conditions, often exposed to grave dangers just because of prejudice, but feeling that they are in some mysterious way a little higher in the social scale.

We are told that when women can vote we shall have fairer and juster laws for woman's government; but the laws of all states, relating not only to working women but to all women, are exceedingly fair, and give a distinct advantage to women over men in many ways.

In fact, the discrimination is so great in favor of the woman that it is an insult to desire it changed. For instance, take the State of New York, and the laws are quite the same in every State: A married woman has far freer control over her own property, however acquired, than a married man has

over his. Her earnings, if she is a wage worker, are absolutely and solely her own, and she is under no obligation to provide for her husband as he is to provide for her, even to the extent of paying alimony if she gets a divorce and remarries. A woman in business is exempt from arrest in an action for debt, fraudulently contracted, though a man is not. A woman against whom a judgment for debt is obtained, enjoys certain exemptions from execution that a man does not enjoy except when he has a family to provide for. There are, moreover, many special statutes designed to benefit and protect women employed—in New York, (I am giving the laws in New York, believing that more of the masses will read these articles, and as stated above, the laws are quite universal.) For instance, there is a law which provides that a man may be imprisoned without privilege of bail, and that none of his property is exempt from execution, if he fails to pay the wages of a female employe up to fifty dollars. As to the GUARDIANSHIP of CHILDREN—Every married woman is the joint guardian of her children with her husband, with equal powers, rights, powers and duties in regard to them with her husband. It is only the survivor, be it father or mother who possesses the right to appoint a guardian by deed or by will. As a matter of practice, the courts, when called upon to award the custody of minor children in cases of separation, determine the question with reference solely to the interests of THE CHILD, with a strong leaning, however, in the mother's favor. I know that every reader of this article, like myself, has been informed that men making the laws discriminate AGAINST THE WOMAN—but they are wisely careful not to point out "WHAT PARTICULAR LAW." They do, in a vague way, touch the laws I have quoted, but you will find, (as I did) by personally looking into the facts, a very pleasant surprise,

and that men must hold women in very high regard, and I trust help to convince you that it is not because men consider we have not intellect enough to vote—or because we are not "good enough"—but "TOO GOOD."

Kate O'Hare's Reply

I, as a Socialist most emphatically state that I demand Equal Suffrage not merely as a SEX right, but also as a CLASS RIGHT. I demand not only better laws and better enforcement of laws for MY SEX, but more particularly for MY CLASS.

Mrs. Ruler says "there always seem to exist in the mind of the suffragist some obscure connection between the right to vote and the expediency of wearing "pants." I confess that I know nothing of the "expediency of wearing pants," but I do know that any sex, class or race that has been denied the right to vote has always worn the chains of servitude. The negro wearing the chains of chattel slavery in the South before the War was no more a slave than the disfranchised black man wearing the chains of wage slavery today. The white woman slave in the cotton mill is no more a slave than the white man slave in the lumber camp, both are disfranchised and both are slaves. I as a Socialist and a Suffragist, want to give each of them a ballot and protect them in the use of it, that working together, standing shoulder to shoulder they can by the intelligent use of that ballot wipe the curse of wage slavery out of our social system.

It is the WORKING CLASS in which I am interested; it is the working class to which I belong. The working class is ninety-three percent of the whole people and as half of that ninety-three percent of the people are women, I want the women of my class enfranchised not alone that they may help me fight the battles of my SEX,

but also of MY CLASS. I know that "all legislation in the interest of man, must necessarily be in the interest of women," hence I want the power to help make better legislation in the interests of man that as a woman I may be helped. Don't worry, Mrs. Ruler, about us Socialist women "not understanding what we are doing, why we are doing it, or how it can be done." We know why we are demanding the ballot; we are doing that because we want to use our ballot to peacefully bring about the social revolution which shall eliminate wage slavery and establish the collective ownership and democratic control of the collectively used means of life. We know this can be done only by the intelligent use of the ballot and we can't use it until we get it and there is the whole question in a nutshell.

Mrs. Ruler is much mistaken when she states that "on a plea of sex equality, we desire to sieze upon the 'soft snaps,' the learned professions and politics." We demand our franchise that we may peacefully take over the earth and the machinery of production and distribution out of the hands of the greed crazed spoilers who are making of it a charnel house of poverty, misery, disease, degradation and death. We demand the right to use the earth God made and the machinery man made to feed, clothe, shelter, educate and bless mankind and we further demand the right to use our brains and our ballots to harness the forces of nature and the power of machinery to lift from the shoulders of the human race the brutalizing load of needless drudgery. Certainly we are not "hastening to enlist our services as a MINER, a PUDDLER, a SEWER-CLEANER or a STOKER." We are intelligent enough to know that puddling and stoking are far better done by machinery today than by hand and that mining and sewer-cleaning can be much better done by machinery also, and will be so done when poverty forces no man to brutalize himself by loathsome labor better done by iron and steel.

We women are also well aware of the fact that it is not necessary for us to "enlist" for the loathsome, filthy jobs under our present system. The woman who cleans sausage casing in a packing house, who scrubs office and restaurant floors, or who works in a rope factory, does work infinitely more hard and repulsive than that of a miner, puddler, sewer-cleaner or stoker, and does it for a one-third the wage men receive. Machinery can do the work far better and we want to use our ballots to gain control of the machinery and do away with loathsome labor for both men and women.

Does Mrs. Ruler imagine for one moment that any human being on earth is so ignorant as to accept her statement that "those opposing the movement for Woman's Suffrage have nothing to gain in a material way, therefore the motive is purely altruistic?"

Who are "those opposing the movement for Woman's Suffrage?" Let us line them up and look them over, gaze for a moment at their purely altruistic motives.

Who are lined up with Mrs. Ruler? The women of the leisure class who live upon the products of other's labor, the liquor interests who fear women would vote to eliminate the liquor traffic; the white slaver and vice kings who know that women in politics would rob them of the power to fatten upon the shame of fallen women; the Southern cotton mill owners, the Eastern woolen mill operators, the Western packinghouse kings and the Copper barons of the North who pile up their millions from the labor of women and children; these are the altruistic gentlemen and ladies who oppose the movement for Woman's Suffrage.

Mrs. Ruler and her "altruistic" kind are quite sure that the way to improve the conditions of the working woman is NOT TO GIVE HER A VOTE, but to induce her to become a DOMESTIC SERVANT. We are glad to have Mrs. Ruler solve the problem in such a nice, ladylike, altruistic manner. Unfortunately facts are against her. Domestic service is NOT a profession, it is at present a benighted reversion back to slavery and serfdom. The wages for domestic service are not high, but disgracefully low, while the hours are criminally long; it does not offer a good home, but entails an utter lack of home life and social position; it does not offer good food and a sheltered life. The food of nine domestic servants in every ten is the cold scraps from the employers' table eaten in the kitchen in loneliness, after the master and his family have been served and eaten their fill. The "sheltered life" is the life of a serf and not that of a free human being. In every social survey dealing with prostitution and illegitimate births, it has been proven beyond any dispute that domestic servants furnish the largest percentage of prostitutes and of mothers of illegitimate children. In St. Louis, according to figures furnished by the City Health Department, compiled by the School of Social Economy of Washington University, and published in the St. Louis Republic, there were 699 illegitimate children born during the year ending March 1912. Three hundred and thirty-three of them were children of domestic servants. Dr. Anna Dwyer of the Morals Court of Chicago, reports the former occupation of 759 fallen women; 225 were domestic servants, 174 waitresses and 136 were laundresses. These figures put several crimps in our altruistic friend's solution for the working woman's problems, and emphasize the good sense shown by the girl who chooses factory and business life (bad as they are) in preference to the worse domestic service. Of the 699 mothers of illegitimate children in St. Louis only 40 were factory girls, 13

claimed to be school teachers, nine telephone operators, seven stenographers, eight milliners and one cashier. Of the 759 fallen women classified by Dr. Dwyer there were 83 clerks, six stenographers and one manicurist. Possibly these statistics may explain "girls PREFERRING" business life to the blessing of domestic service.

Mrs. Ruler assures us that "women in America are fortunate in having under the law, equal privileges without equal responsibilities." This is just as true and wise a statement as the altruistic attitude of anti-suffragists and the solution of domestic service for labor problems. Most emphatically women HAVE NOT EQUAL PRIVILEGES without equal responsibilities. The most sacred right, the fundamental privilege of life is the privilege and right of SELF PROTECTION and that no voteless human being, man or woman can have. Even if Mrs. Ruler's statement were true (which it is not) no right minded woman wants privilege without responsibility; that is the position of the slave, the child and the mentally incompetent, and we deny that we are any of these. Grant again that Mrs. Ruler's statement is true (which it is not) that the laws of all states relating to all women are exceedingly fair, and give a distinct advantage to women over men, the position would still be abhorrent to all intelligent, right thinking women. I am not asking for better laws for women; I am asking for no special privilege; I am whining for no privilege without responsibility. I demand better laws for the working class and the power to convert the whole human race into useful workers and to eliminate the parasitical idlers. I want no special privilege for myself, for my sex, or for my class. I merely demand equal opportunity for all. I want to shoulder my own responsibility and I ask for the ballot to strengthen my arm for its task.

Mrs. Ruler challenges me to point to some specific law that places women at a disadvantage and I will name but three out of the many that exist. But remember, these are laws aimed not directly against women as a sex, but against women as a part of the working class. The women of the property owning class are fairly well protected, for laws are made for the protection of property and not human life.

In Missouri, law places the whole burden of responsibility on the shoulders of the unmarried mother. By law the father of an illegitimate child must be protected and a birth certificate bearing his name will not be accepted by the Board of Health. By the laws of Missouri no illegitimate child may bear the name of its father, nor may it inherit any of his property or make any claim upon him for support.

The age of consent in many

states is placed at from ten to fifteen years and no punishment can be laid upon the man who seduces a girl of that age and no responsibility can be placed upon him for the care of the fruit of his lust.

In Georgia and South Carolina the age of consent is ten years and a man may make a girl the victim of his lust three years before she has reached the age of puberty.

Even these unjust laws work little hardship upon the daughters of the owning class, for they have always money enough to shield themselves from shame; it is only upon the daughters of the working class the heavy burden falls. The sons of the idle rich may prey with impunity upon the daughters of toil and the laws of our states will protect them.

Mrs. Ruler closes with the statement that certain altruistic gentlemen would deny us the vote, "not because we are not good enough to vote, but because we are TOO GOOD." How charming! How perfectly delightful these altruistic gentlemen are. We are not "too good" to be the prey of their lust; not "too good" to toil in their factories; not "too good" to do their dirty work; not "too good" to be the producers of their wealth, but "WE ARE TOO GOOD TO VOTE."

We women of the working class thank you altruistic gentlemen very kindly but we have some ideas on that subject ourselves. IF WE ARE GOOD ENOUGH TO BEAR THE CHILDREN WE ARE NOT "TOO GOOD" TO USE OUR BALLOTS FOR THEIR PROTECTION; IF WE ARE GOOD ENOUGH TO PRODUCE THE WEALTH OF THE WORLD, WE ARE NOT "TOO GOOD" TO USE OUR BALLOTS TO GET POSSESSION AND ENJOYMENT OF WHAT WE HAVE CREATED. IF WE ARE GOOD ENOUGH TO BEAR THE BURDENS OF CIVILIZATION UPON OUR SHOULDERS WE ARE NOT "TOO GOOD" TO DEMAND THE RIGHT TO SHARE IN THE BLESSINGS OF THE CIVILIZATION WE HAVE MADE POSSIBLE.

REVOLUTION AND REFORM

By Oscar Ameringer

The ruling class of every period has been the class who owned and controlled the things by which the people live, that is, the means of production.

Slavery rested on the ownership of human beings.

Feudalism rested on the ownership of the land.

Capitalism rests on the ownership of capital.

At a certain stage of social development the dominant or ruling class is no longer able to feed its slaves. Poverty, disease, crime, insanity, suicide, and prostitution increase to such an extent as to force themselves on the attention of society. Thereupon people who have a habit of thinking, ask themselves the question, "what is wrong?" and ills produced by the prevailing system become the "SOCIAL QUESTION."

At such times two schools arise who advocate two different remedies for the solution of the social question. One school preaches reform—the other preaches revolution. That is, the abolition of the system.

ROME

About two thousand years ago, when the classic slave system was tottering towards the grave and pauperism swept the Roman empire like a pestilence, good honest old Roman reformers came with their remedies of free bread and free circus. "If the people are hungry, give them bread. If they are miserable, amuse them with shows. Elect good honest old Cassius to office. Put clean men in the forum." "Somebody pass a law against usury, or to make bread cheaper, or to increase the gifts of the Caesars." "Yes, somebody do something as we're going to Pluto," as the devil was called in those days.

Thereupon the reformer started to reform by putting new patches on old garments, fresh paint on rotten props and cornsalve on the social cancer.

The better class, then as now, was willing to do most anything to help the poor, except to get off their backs and so allowing them to do something for themselves. Bless your heart, there was nothing wrong with the system. It wasn't the thing itself, but the abuse of it that hurt. If all the masters were just as good to their slaves as some of the masters; if all of the slaves worked as faithful as some of the slaves; all would be just lovely. The roots are all right; the trunk is all right; the limbs are all right, only the fruits are rotten, that's all. Cut out a soft spot here and there; remove a few worms, bore out the core and everything will be all right.

And while the ladies and gentlemen patched, sewed, bored and poulticed around the old carcass,

men and women met in stables, caves and catacombs and said, "it has to go."

Ragged riff-raff, lowest of the low, you had more wisdom in your empty bellies than all the philosophers of your time. YOU said it was THE SYSTEM. THE SYSTEM OF THE PRIVATE OWNERSHIP OF LAND AND HUMAN BEINGS. The system which gave to one man the product of another's toil; the SYSTEM which divided the human family into exploiters and exploited, you said IT had to go. Your remedy for slavery was the abolition of slavery and the establishment of communism.

"All men are brothers. The earth belongs to all; work not and neither shalt thou eat." These were your catchwords and slogans. But these did not sound good to the topnotchers.

They had a solution of the social question which did not include the necessity of getting off of the backs of the underdogs. So their Nero's and Deocletians made bonfires of some of the rabble and fed others to the wild animals to the great amusement of the human animals in the stone benches of the Amphitheatre.

However, Rome was not reformed from above, it was chloroformed with Gothic battle axes and operated upon by surgeons who crawled out from the caves and catacombs with cross and torch. The master class could not reform society without destroying its own supremacy, and the underdog could not free himself and save society without throwing the master off his back, and the patient died in the operation.

FRANCE

"If the people have no bread, give them cake," said merry Marie Antoinette, on the eve of the French revolution. Yes, give them something. Hand something down to the poor devils, but don't get off their backs.

At that interesting period the population of France was 24,460,000; composed of 150,000 nobles; 310,000 priests and 24,000,000 commoners. The 150,000 nobles had a total income of three hundred and eighty-six million francs. Out of this they paid sixty-one million francs taxes, which left an average net income of 2,160 francs per noble per year.

The 316,000 priests pocketed together three hundred and seventy million francs. They paid twenty-seven and a half million taxes, giving each holy father 1,100 francs per year.

The 24,000,000 commoners earned fourteen hundred and sixty-five million francs; they paid 936 million taxes, which left to the common yokel 22 francs per year.

Here you've got the social question of that time in a nutshell. Priests and nobles owned the land. The commoners did the work for which they received 22 francs a year. The land owners swiped the rest. Some of the commoners got a little more than 22 francs, others got a little less. Some of those who got less, could not live and went begging.

Then they proceeded to take each little problem by itself; built almshouses for paupers, jails for criminals, mad houses for the insane, promised hell fire for the suicides and erected pillories for the harlots—all for the cat.

And yet there was but one problem; one deep underlying cause for all that human misery, and that was the private ownership of the earth by a handful of parasites. The mudsills couldn't read or write, but they knew the cause and demanded LAND! LAND! LAND! LAND! They didn't want anybody to do something for them. They only asked for the precious privilege to do something for themselves. However, the nobles and priests wouldn't let go of the land. Not even after one of their own kind, Turgot, a royal minister, had demonstrated to them that the road they travelled was leading to hell.

He asked the nobility and clergy to assume their share of the tax burden. Asked them to give land to the serfs.

Turgot saw the CAUSE, and sought to eliminate the misery of his nation by eliminating the cause. What he didn't know was THAT NO RULING CLASS EVER RELINQUISHED VOLUNTARILY ITS PRIVILEGES.

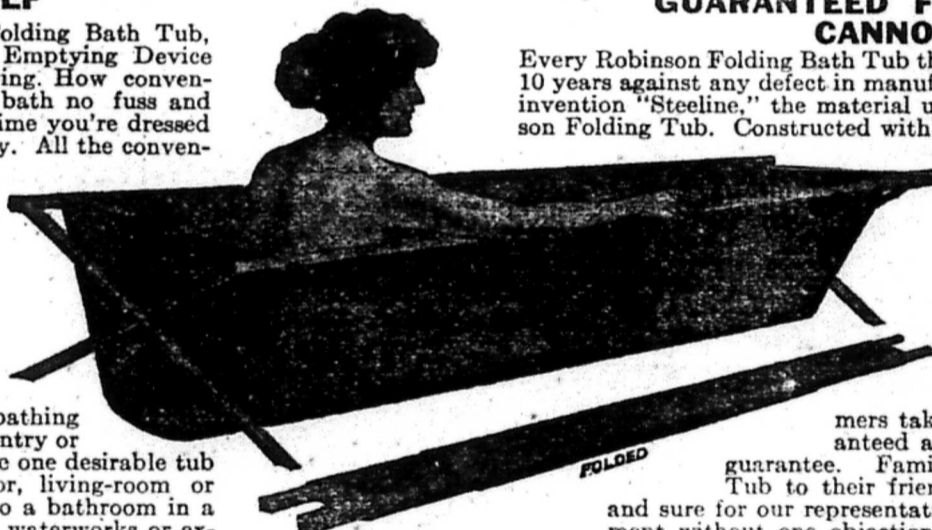

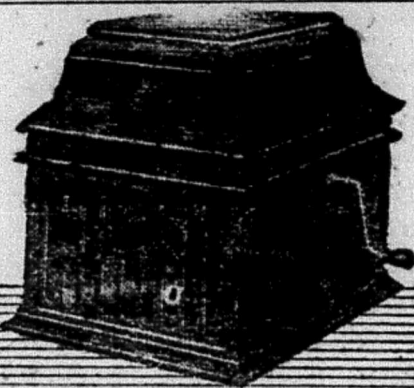

have over-production, and we have over-production because we have under-consumption. And we have under-consumption, because we don't get enough wages to buy the goods we make; and because there are more goods than can be bought, there are always more men than there are jobs. And because there are more men than there are jobs the workers compete for jobs and the fellows who work for the least get the jobs. And on account of this competition, wages tend toward a point where they are barely sufficient to support and live. AND THE PEOPLE WHO GET LITTLE CAN'T SPEND MUCH.

Then, when the people are starving the packing plant discharge men because there is too much to eat.

When the children go bare-footed, on frosty ground, then the shoefactories close down because there are too many shoes.

When the workers sleep in box cars, station houses and rescue missions, then the bricklayers and carpenters are thrown out of work because they've built too many houses.

Capitalism has developed to a point where unemployment is chronic. It is with us all the time, and gets worse some of the time, like the present time.

The causes of unemployment and industrial panics were known and put in black and white by Robertus when John Quincy Adams was president. They were explained by Karl Marx when "Tippecanoe and Tyler too" ran their celebrated log cabin campaign. Ferdinand LaSalle hammered them into the heads of the German workers at the time of the civil war.

If there is one thing under the sun that has been proven beyond the shadow of a doubt, it is that unemployment, and with that, ninety-nine and nine tenths of the evils of our times, are caused by the inability of the workers to purchase the products of their labors.

Working Class Union

This paper stands uncompromisingly for industrial unionism as against craft unionism for the same reason that it stands for industrial democracy as against industrial despotism.

Each passing day brings into bolder relief and into more flagrant evidence the utter impotency of craft unionism and the crying need for industrial unionism.

The Pennsylvania railroad company offers one of many conspicuous illustrations. The shopmen east of Pittsburg went out on strike some time ago because they were discriminated against and discharged for trying to organize. The employes in the transportation service remained at their posts on account of their

Stick a pin in that. No, drive a railroad spike in it. Paste it in your hat. It is the only correct diagnosis of social disease; and knowing the CAUSE, we have no trouble to find the remedy.

It is a fact, plain as day, that the higher our wages are and the lower prices are the more goods we can purchase. FROM THIS IT FOLLOWS THAT IF THE WAGES OF ALL THE WORKERS EQUALLED THE SELLING PRICE OF ALL THE PRODUCTS THEY COULD PURCHASE WITH THEIR WAGES ALL THEIR PRODUCTS.

But, if the working people get all they produce, then there is nothing left for the capitalist. And if the capitalists can not get any more profits, then they will go out of business, and when the capitalists go out of business, then Society, state, nation or municipality must go into business. And when Society goes into business, it will operate railroads, mines, packing plants and all other big industries like we operate the postoffice, the parcel post and the municipal water works, for the good of all the people; and just as there is no over-production of postal stamps and city water, and no unemployment among letter carriers, mail clerks and water works employes, so there will be no over-production and unemployment when the principal industries are operated by Society for the benefit of society.

Capitalism can not be reformed, it must be abolished just as every other economic system was abolished when it reached the point where it could no longer feed the human race. All reform measures which tend to prolong the system are vicious. All measures which tend towards the transformation of industry, proves private to public ownership are revolutionary instalments, and are right.

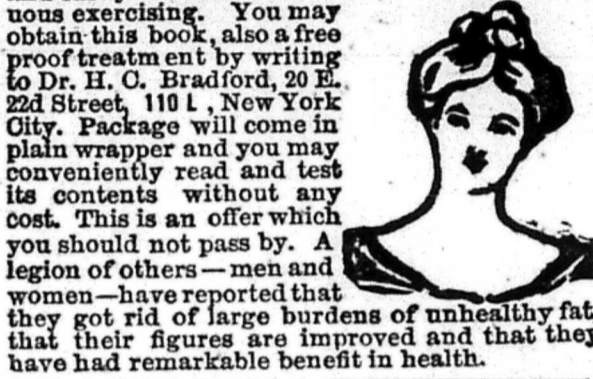
The reformer has been a failure everywhere and at all times.

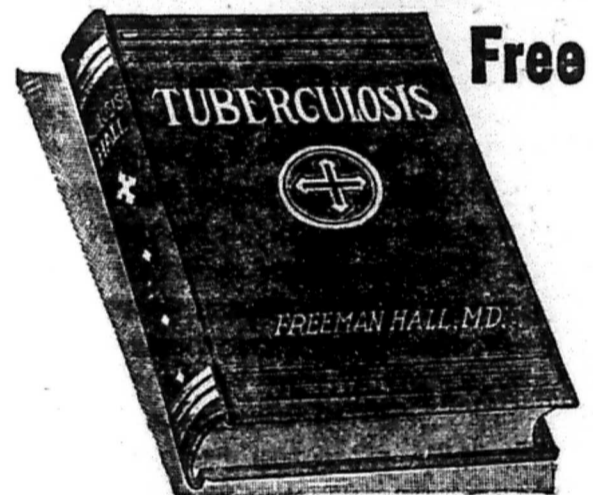

story. It is sad to the verge of tragedy and yet the craft unionists, in spite of their instinctive revolt against scabbing on their fellows, seem unable to break the spell that binds them to these outgrown, outworn, reactionary and worse than worthless craft unions of a past age.

How much longer will the rank and file of these craft unions allow themselves to be led by the nose by their so-called grand officials, who have a working agreement with the railway officials to keep the craft unions intact and to prevent at any cost any general organization of the employes?

The railroad employes are not as well paid for their services, all things considered, as they were twenty-five years ago, and their unions are doing absolutely nothing to keep wages apace with the high cost of living. Nor are these craft unions able to protect any member against discrimination and unjust dismissal by the company.

On a single division out of Harrisburg more than 140 brotherhood employes in the engine service alone have been discharged without good cause, many of them because they were real union men, and not one of these has been reinstated through the craft union to which he belonged, notwithstanding the thousands of dollars spent for that purpose.

Each of these craft unions in the railroad service has a small army of highly paid officials, all of whom are strictly for the craft union and against the industrial union for the same reason that every other average man sticks to his job, especially if it pays well and there is not another in sight.

The industrial unity of the railroad workers will never be accomplished through the officials of the several craft unions, but will have to be established by the rank and file in spite of them.

The revolt is even now brewing and there is no telling how soon there may be a break in the light of which the craft union leaders may see their doom.

When railroad officials and craft union leaders act in harmony in propagating craft unionism and thwarting industrial unionism, the former by discharging and the latter by expelling employes who refuse to scab on their brothers in the name of brotherhood, it is time for the rank and file to rebel and to get together and make common cause for their common protection in spite of both their railroad officials and their union leaders.

The pay roll and expense account of the army of craft union officials in the railroad service alone amounts to hundreds of thousands of dollars each year, practically all of which is wasted, thrown away, and to keep up this useless expense, this unnecessary burden, dues and assessments have become so heavy, so

oppressive, that increasing numbers who have paid until they can pay no more are expelled in disgrace, stricken from the rolls, and if they fail to recruit the ranks of the scabs and strike-breakers, as thousands of others have before them under similar circumstances, it is not the fault of the craft unions which took their last penny and then set them adrift with the mark of Cain upon them.

One glance at Colorado today is enough to condemn craft unionism and to demonstrate the imperative need for the industrial unionization of the working class in that state. In the Northern coal fields the miners have been on strike continuously during the last four years, and during all that period the railway employes, all members of unions, have been cheerfully hauling the scabs to the mines, the scab-mined coal to the markets, and delivering the thugs and gunmen at the several camps to murder the striking miners.

And this is unionism of the Gompers, Civic Federation, and American Federation of Labor brand! It is not only a travesty upon organized labor but a crime against the working class.

When the babes at Ludlow were roasted by Rockefeller's fiends every union man in the state should have struck and would have done so if they had not been chained to their masters by their craft union agreements.

How long would the strike of the miners in Colorado last if the railroad men who belong to unions and who call themselves union men and profess to stand for union principles served notice that they would strike in a body within twenty-four hours if the operator refused to settle with the miners?

The Rockefellers own the railroads as well as the mines in Colorado and they have their ironclad association through which they deal with the railroad as well as the mine workers; then why in the name of common sense do not the railroad workers stand by the mine workers and help them win their fight instead of helping the Rockefellers to cut their throats and in due course of time have their own cut for their loyalty to their masters and their treason to their fellow-workers?

The industrial union is the forerunner of the industrial democracy; it is the revolutionary beginning of the overthrow of industrial despotism, the emancipation of the working class, and the establishment of the Socialist Republic.

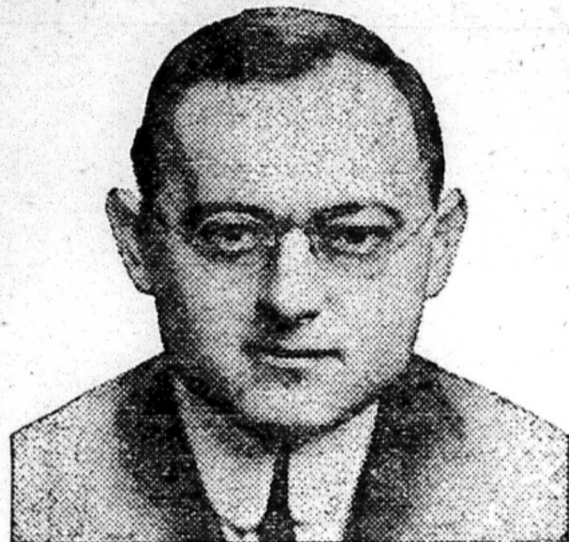

TRIBUTE TO DANIEL DeLEON

By Eugene V. Debs

The death of Daniel DeLeon, editor of the New York People, and leader of the Socialist Labor party, marks the passing of a striking figure and an extraordinary character from the stage of revolutionary activity. For a full quarter of a century DeLeon has been a leader of Socialism in the United States, head and front of the Socialist Labor party, making a name for himself that is known throughout the world. Gifted with a mind of unusual depth and brilliancy and educated in the leading colleges both here and abroad, he was fitted as perhaps no other American Socialist for great work in the educational propaganda of the Socialist movement.

Daniel DeLeon was a true disciple of Marx and Engels, and one of their ablest and most brilliant interpreters. His editorials in the People covered the whole range of economics, sociology, politics, history and philosophy and his versatile genius appears at its best in these columns.

He was an uncompromising champion of economic and political organization, believing that only through their economic and political solidarity could the workers emancipate themselves from wage-slavery. He fought the craft unions in and out of season, exposing without mercy their weakness and impotency, and he stood with equal insistence for revolutionary industrial organization. He was bold and pointed in his criticism, persistent in arguing his convictions, and tireless in fighting for what he believed to be right.

The speeches and writings of DeLeon evince keen insight and rare powers of analysis, clear thinking and lucid expression. He had, in a remarkable degree, the faculty of making the most involved and abstruse propositions clear and understandable to his readers. As an editorial writer of clarity, brilliancy and force he had no equal on the American Socialist press and no superior anywhere. His versatility, range of mind, and felicity of treatment were, indeed, unsurpassed, and his death leaves a vacancy that never can be filled.

There is not a doubt that Daniel DeLeon, with all his wealth of intellectual endowment and his classical education and high culture could and would have ranked high in any profession he might have chosen, but when the light of Socialism came into his life, it determined his destiny and he plunged into the propaganda with a vigor, and zeal which never abated until his vital powers were exhausted and death put an end

to his activities. When the prodigious amount of work he did is taken into account, such as translating the classics of Socialism and other standard works, addressing propaganda meetings, holding debates and making speaking tours, in addition to his editorial work on the Daily and Weekly People, it is not strange that he broke down prematurely and that, sad to tell, he literally worked himself to death.

Whatever fault may be found with DeLeon, his personality, his methods or his tactics, it cannot be gainsaid that his zeal, his energy, his very heart and soul were all with the working class, and

that with a singleness of purpose as exalted as it was inspiring, he consecrated himself to their emancipation. He had his faults, as all men have, but these will fade away in the light of his monumental services to the cause. He fought the good fight without flinching, to the end, and left the world a heritage of light and hope and inspiration that will keep his name bright and his fame secure through the coming ages.

With deep regret and with sincere appreciation of his masterly services and his loyal devotion to the cause we note the passing of our valiant comrade from the field of conflict to the realm of rest, and to his stricken widow and family we tender our heartfelt sympathy in their great bereavement.

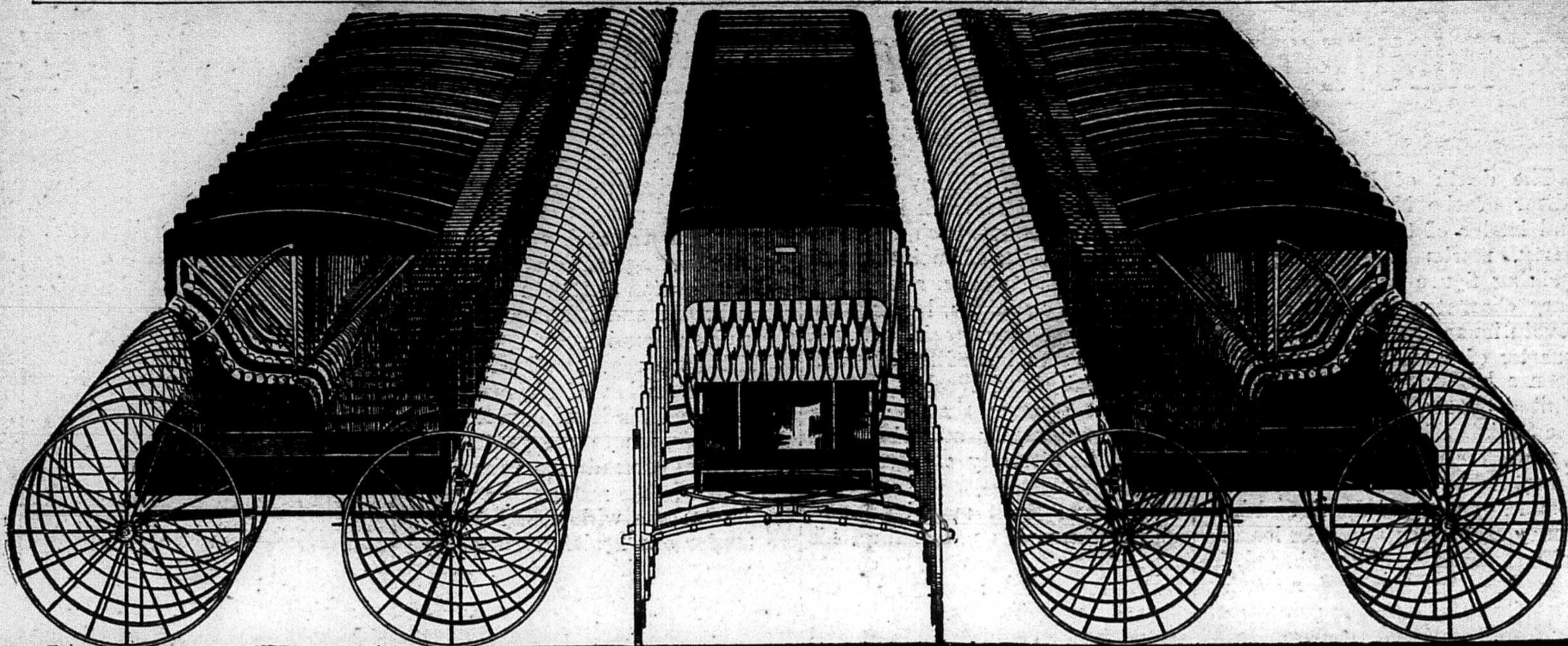
