It not infrequently happens that a convict released from a penal institution bewails the expiration of his sentence and begs to be allowed to continue to enjoy the economic security to be found. behind prison walls. There at least he has a job he can be sure of, and there he is guaranteed food at meal time and a place to sleep at night, all of which guarantees are cancelled the very moment he steps out into the "free world."

Labor bought and sold in the labor market is convict labor and not free labor, no matter what may be said about its "dignity" by the politicians, pulpiteers and other hirelings and retainers of those who exploit it.

Socialism, by destroying the private ownership of productive machinery and giving the workers free access thereto, retaining to themselves what is produced by their labor, releases the countless convicts of poverty and stamps upon labor the everlasting seal of its own divinity triumphant.

The ruling class may have its hoarded gold, which all too often becomes a curse to its possessors; the working class has its noble ideals which beckon them onward and lead them upward forever.

To be a contented slave is to accept as final the wallow of animalism and adjectly surrender the last vestige of manhood and all hope in the future.

Every now and then we hear of starvation threatening the babies in the countries engaged in the European war, and forthwith frantic efforts are made to provide the perishing infants with the milk they need and the food they must have if they are not to be permitted to starve to death.

The narrow patriotism that turns into hate at the boundary line belongs to the jungle-age of the past. The wider and nobler patriotism which embraces the earth and whose appeal is to all races and all nations is finding lodgment in the souls of men and in due time will conquer the world.

Each one can help at least a little. Take hold of what is nearest at hand and do it as if the world depended upon it.

It is not enough to join the party, nor enough to vote the ticket. These are but the beginnings of a membership that is to count in the service of the cause and there is never a time when there is not a chance to do something that needs doing to advance the interesta of the movement.

Enthusiasm is the holy fire that burns upon the altar of the soul and flames out into passionate service to the cause.

In every political party save alone the Socialist party the color line is sharply drawn although every effort is made at election time to obliterate it and to have it appear that all men are equal without regard to their previous condition of servitude. A more ghastly lie than this was never told. The colored worker is as welcome to the Socialist party as the white worker; it is not the color of his skin, but his economic status and his political principles that determine his eligibility to membership.

The working class regardless of color make up the Socialist party and beneath its banner all have equal rights, equal duties, and equal responsibilities. All are alike recognized as human beings and it is the purpose of the party to establish an industrial and social system in which they shall have the rights and enjoy the freedom of human beings.

The ruling class care not one whit whether the labor power they exploit is clothed in white skins or black skins; they draw no line in the skinning business and it suits them quite well to have the "white trash" and the "niggers" making senseless war on one Edward Carpenter says: "There comes a time when every another to their common undoing, knowing quite well that as long will be all the easier to keep the whole of them in servitude.

Socialism, which means the abolition of wage-slavery, will make it possible for every human being, regardless of race, color or sex, to have work, to make a decent living, to enjoy the fruit of his labor, and to live an honorable and useful life.

The eyes of millions of wage-slaves await to be opened. Don't waste time splitting hairs, but make every bit of your time and every atom of your energy count in awakening the slumberers and arousing them to action.

LABOR'S UNCEASING STRUGGLE

The beginning of labor's struggle is coeval with the beginning of organized society and this struggle has continued with varying fortunes ever since. The way has been long and weary and unnumbered millions have sighed in vain for even a glimpse of the promised land before their bones were left to bleach along the track of human progress.

Looking backward the road is swallowed up in the remotest antiquity and looking forward it stretches out before us as far as eye can reach and along every inch of it that labor has traveled it has had to struggle, at times with desperation, to maintain itself and to escape the ravages and plunders of its merciless oppressors. White slavery is the fruit of industrial slavery and the hideous traffic will disappear only when capitalism goes down to rise no more.

Class-consciousness and the unity and power that rise from class-consciousness constitute the real test of working-class efficiency.

MUTUAL CONFIDENCE AND HARMONIOUS RELATIONS

In the preamble to the constitution of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, the largest of the railroad craft unions, we read:

"Persuaded that it is for the interests both of our members and their employers that a good understanding should at all times exist between the two, it will be the constant endeavor of this organization to establish mutual confidence, and create and maintain harmonious rela-

This paragraph was written about thirty years ago and is about thirty years out of date. It is still heartily endorsed, however, by the railroads and accounts for their friendly attitude toward the union.

As well declare that there should be "mutual confidence" and "harmonious relations" between a horse and a horse-leech, or between a dog and the fleas that nestle in his hide as to declare that such relations should exist between a body of workers and the parasites that exploit their labor and drain the life-blood from their veins. The interests of workers and private corporations are not and cannot be "harmonious," nor can there be such a thing as "mutual confidence" between them. That is sheer buncombe if not downright dishonesty. The industrial union that is true to the working class seeks to establish "mutual confidence" and "harmonious relations" between all workers that they may put an end to corporation misrule, control their own jobs, and rule themselves.

Every Man His Own Landlord

By Walter Thomas Mills

Author of "The Struggle For Existence" and "Democracy or Despotism."

It is impossible for any one to live except he is a user of land.

The term "land" is used to include not only the soil but all natural forces and resources and

spaces upon the earth.

All food, clothing, fuel and shelter, the substance of all articles of use and of beauty, the power of falling water, electricity and steam, all depend for their availability upon the use of land. It is impossible for any one to be alive at any time without occupying some share of the space provided on the earth's surface.

Land, or space upon the surface of the earth, at no place has value unless at least two persons are anxious to use the same

place at the same time.

As the number of persons anxious to use the same space at the same time multiplies, and because of their competition with each other for the space desired, unimproved land values arise.

It is perfectly evident that these values arise at any particular place because of the presence of people at that place anxious to

secure control.

The values arising because of buildings, orchards, factories, shops, office buildings, are all improved values, and may be created as the result of individual investment and enterprise; but the value of the land regardless of improvement is entirely a social product. It is the creation of the whole community, not of any individual.

The evil of private monopoly in land arises whenever an individual is able privately to appropriate these values, which are not created by him, but are the direct product of the whole com-

munity.

It is entirely impossible for more than one person to occupy the same identical space at the same time. Monopoly of landif by this is meant the occupancy of land to the exclusion of others -is absolutely unavoidable.

The real land problem arises in the effort to provide land, for the exclusive occupancy of its any other, or enabling any one question. These interests would be as much more vital than are the private interests, now the beneficiaries of ground rents, as life itself is more to be desired than is an unearned private advantage.

The persons interested in such a universal mutual insurance, against distress are more númerous and at the ballot-box would be more powerful; would they act together, by a thousand to one, than are the handful of beneficiaries of the current private



Ride While You The Story of a Flour Sack

By Kate Richards O'Hare

EDITOR'S NOTE: In the January and February issues of the RIP-SAW Mrs. O' Hare told the story of the Ford factory, where the eight hour day prevails, where women receive a minimum wage of \$2.40 per day, men \$2.72, and where all employes, men, women and boys having others to support receive \$5.00 per days. The thousand women in the Ford factory work at light, pleasant tasks, in attractive well ventilated work rooms, have no speeding up or "chain" system, and when they speak of Henry Ford, tears of gratitude stand in their eyes.

Here is the story of another industry in which girls and women predominate where few receive a living wage, where the piece-work system and speeded-up machinery combine to make the nine-hourday extract every possible ounce of energy from the poverty driven victims; where the work rooms are filled with lime dust and lint, where machinery is used-that cannot possibly be made safe in its present form, where employes piece out their meager svages by appeals to charity or drafts against wage earners in other industries.

This story should strike home to every family in America, for we are all familiar with the humble flour sack. Here is the story of its sorrow-stained origin. It comes to you charged with the struggle and poverty of the human beings, girls and women, who manufacture it in hopeless slavery at the wheel of toil, victims of the competitive wage system, and men's thoughtlessness and greede.







like a gas meter. A girl must make a certain number of million stitches per week or lose her job. Not more than an inch and a half of thread may be left between bags, stopping the machines is severely reprimanded and the nervous tension of feeding the bags into the sateless jaws of the humming machine with less than an inch-and-a-half of leeway is terrific.

Some of the tasks are not adaptable to the piecework system and the girls who do straight week work are paid five and six dollars per week. The payroll works out about this way: ninety of the girls work for wages ranging from five to six dollars a week, seventy of the girls earn from six to seven dollars per week, seventy-five of the girls receive from seven to nine dollars and a very, very few girls sometimes earn a little

To a country woman these wages may seem to be quite adequate, but if one of your country women who reads this were to write and ask me to find a boarding place for your daughter who was coming to St. Louis to study music or art, the least possible sum for which I could secure board would be five or six dollars per week and she would at that price be compelled to share her room with another. Please remember also that clothing, laundry and street-car fare must be added to this sum amounting to two or three dollars per week more. The Minimum Wage Commission of the Senate of the State of Missouri decided that no girl could live in St. Louis on less than \$8.70 per week.

Bitterly Opposed to Unions

Naturally Bemis Bros. is bitterly opposed to trade unions and all forms of labor organization. They consider them immoral, un-American, un-Christian and a harful and demoralizing force in American industry. The policy of the concern is absolutely "closed shop" against any member of a union. Bemis is quite as bitterly opposed to any sort of labor legislation. At the time the less pious and more progressive people of the State of Missouri were making a heroic fight for the nine hour law for women, Mr. Bemis, Senior sent his son Judd to Jefferson City to fight the bill. Of course the fact that the Bemis people worked their five-dollar a week girls ten hours per day all the time and as long overtime as they saw fit in the busy season had nothing to do with the matter. Certainly not! It was the welfare of the girls Mr. Judd Bemis had in mind. His heart was sorely oppressed by the sad, sad thought of his girls spending that extra hour "gadding about the streets" when they could just as well be pushing trucks and stitching bags in the highly moral atmosphere of his very pious factory.

The Polinsky Family

One day I chanced to be looking up some data in the office of the Provident Association. The Provident Association I might add, is the organized machine for dispensing charity for Protestant St. Louis. Among the machinelike reports I found the bare outline of a little life tragedy, not strange or unusual, but quite commonplace. It was only one of the "short and simple annals of the poor." No doubt I would have passed the story by without a second thought as I did hundreds of others, but for the fact that the name BEMIS figured in it and attracted my attention as perhaps no other firm name in St. Louis would.

The Polinsky family (this is not their real name) came to America from Poland some years ago. John, the father had been killed in a sewer cave-in. Mary, the wife and Anna the sixteenyear-old daughter had found work in the Bemis Brothers Bag Company after his death and by the slender thread of underpaid piecework were trying to bind the family together and keep young John, a boy of thirteen, in school. During the slack season when work was scant the "social worker" employed by the Bemis Company noticed that both Mary and Anna were too weak to do their work properly; a little questioning brought out the fact that they were slowly starving to death. The social worker appealed to the company for assistance for the women, either for a direct gift, or for more work, but the official replied that there was no more work and that it was against the rules of the company to give charity. The social worker then appealed to the Provident Association for food to keep the women alive. Food was supplied by the charity organization to these Bemis employes!

The report card said that the Polinskys were quite superior to their en-squeezed from the lifeblood of a few vironment, that they showed refinement, education and high ideals of life and that their two-room tenement was spotlessly clean and their clothing was brushed and darned with great

Two months later the social worker had again asked for aid. This time it was not because of slack work but on account of illness. Anna's strength had been depleted by hunger, worry, and the humiliation of being forced to accept charity and when the rush season came she had broken down under the strain of overwork. Illness had brought want, want brought charity and the story ended with the simple notation "rations given."

As I read the pitiful little story of

the Polinskys coupled with the name Bemis, I decided that I wanted to know something of the concern who produces almost all the flour bags used in this country.

A Parasite Industry.

The Bemis Bag. Co. is a "parasite industry." A parasite on other industries; it is an industry that does not and never did pay living wages VERY generous in his donations to to its employees. by a charitable institution. All sorts of industries in all the cities named are subsidizing Bemis employees and furnishing workers to the Bemis Co. at less than the cost of life. In other words the Bemis Bros. Bag Co., exists exactly like the mistletoe on the oak, like ticks on dogs and mites on chickens; "it habitually purloins its food from others."

For example: We will say that Jim Jones works as a conductor on a street car in St. Louis. The railways company pays going wages to the man, but he has a seventeen-year old girl. This girl works for Bemis for five dollars a week which is three dollars and seventy cents less per week than will sustain life and efficiency. In order that the girl may live and be strong enough to push a truck for Bemis, the father must rob himself of necessary food and clothing, rob his savings account, rob his recreation account. Bemis Bros. not only rob the girl of the product of her labor, but they also rob the railways company of the physical fitness and efficiency for which they paid with the father's wages.

The House of Bemis.

About forty years ago the two Bemis brothers started a bag factory here in St. Louis. The business was launched on a very small scale and Mr. S. A. Bemis takes great pride in telling his employees how with labor and sobriety he has built up the great industry from

almost nothing.

Today the Bemis Bros. Bag Co., is an eight million dollar corporation every dollar's worth of stock owned in the Bemis family. The company has factories in St. Louis, Kansas City, Omaha, Minneapolis, Winnipeg, Indianapolis, Memphis, New Orleans, San Francisco and Seattle. cotton mills in St. Louis and Jackson, Tenn., and a jute mill in Calcutta, India. In all the plants in this country there are about five thousand women and girls and twelve hundred men and boys employed. There is no history of over-capitalization or watering the stock in the Bemis Company. Every one who pretends to know anything of the industry declares that the various plants and the business are well worth the eight million dollars. The business has thus grown in forty years from practically nothing to an actual valuation of eight million dollars. That means that every five years the comparatively small number of employees have given the Bemis fam ily a million dollars, besides a luxurious living, money to build churches and to pay preachers. As I studied the conditions in the great St. Louis plant, I readily understood how an eight million dollar industry could have been

The Third Picture.

One Sunday morning my husband and I went to church here in St. Louis. We attended one of the richest and most fashionable churches in the city and the minister is one of the foremost of his calling. At the close of the services the pastor greeted us cordially. As we chatted a dignified, well dressed, self-satisfied old gentleman marched up the aisle from the Amen corner of the church and stopped to greet the pastor. With all that oily sweetness that only a preacher's voice can achieve and does achieve when he talks in the presence of the man who pays a large part of his fat salary, the minister introduced us. He said: "Mr. and Mrs O'Hare, I want you to meet the father of this church, one of the two forces which has made this beautiful building and this great Christian institution possible—Mr. S. A. Bemis." There was considerable more along the

same line, all carefully impressing on our minds the fact that Mr. Bemis was

GEORGE R. KIRKPATRICK ACCEPTS VICE PRESIDENTIAL · NOMINATION

TO THE SOCIALISTS OF THE UNITED STATES:

My dear Comrades: A telegram from our National Office at Chicago informs me that you have nominated me for the role of Vice-presidential candidate of the Socialist party in the political campaign of 1916.

Coming at this time of tragedy and crisis in the affairs of mankind, when hundreds of millions of intelligent people throughout the world are regarding our international movement with profound respect and earnest hope, this nomination is truly a very unusual honor; an honor, however, which imposes such heavy obligations that any personal gratification I may feel is instantly and completely disciplined into a minor matter and the sobering thoughts of serious and imperious duties have absolute right of way over all else in my mind.

The nomination I accept with gratitude and with appreciation of the honor. The duties imposed by the nomination I assume with distinct realization of their moral significance and with the pledge of hearty co-operation to the limit of my power in the coming campaign.

By the brutal deeds of this present time of mockery and agony in Europe, vast multitudes of the producers of a dozen countries are trampled to death under the iron-hoofed god of war, bridled, saddled and directed by distinguished cut-throats in political and industrial authority.

The motherhood of a continents is in tears and the lives of hundreds of millions of children as yet unborn are already mortgaged in advance with deadening extra toil and darkened with invisible ignorance imposed by astounding war debts.

In the hideous enthusiasms of a prosperity stained with blood and tears our boastful masters here in our own country are holding multitudes in hunger and cold and fear, and are cunningly building a great army to crush the hungry multitude of slaves in the mighty army of the unemployed in the swiftly coming industrial collapse.

She has needed dolls, flowers, play, songs, brightness, sympathy, care, love and has been given the stone of hard labor instead. all the blessings to which childhood is entitled this child has been robbed. In the brief life of this long-deferred hope, experience that scars, denial self-pity, hunger of the spirit, STARVATION OF A CHILD'S SOUL FOR LOVE, HOME, HOPE, HELP."

Fantine is the greatest character in fiction and the highest type of social martyrdom. The face of Fantine, in which we behold "the horror of old age in the countenance of a child," is the mirror which reflects society's own sin and shame.

The Fantines have been raped of their virtue, robbed of their womanhood, dishonored, branded, exiled; the ignorance of childhood is with them still, but not its innocence; they have been shamelessly prostituted, but they are not prostitutes. They are girls, women who have walked the path of thorns and briers with bare and bleeding feet; who know the ways of agony and tears, and who move in melancholy procession as capitalist society's sacrificial offering to nameless and dishonored graves.

The very flower of womanhood is crushed in capitalism's mills of prostitution. The girls who yield are the tender, trusting, loving ones, the sympathetic and unsuspecting, who would make the truest of wives and the noblest of mothers. It is not the hard, cold, selfish and suspicious natures that surrender to the insidious forces of prostitution, but the very opposite, and thus is the motherhood of the race dwarfed and deformed and denied its highest functioning and its divinest expression.

The system which condemns men to slavery, women to prostitution, children to poverty and ignorance, and all to hopeless, barren, joyless lives must be uprooted and destroyed before men may know the meaning of morality, walk the highlands of humanity, and breathe the vitalizing air of freedom and fellowship.—Eugene V. A Bill Proposed by Fred Warren Providing that Those Who Make War Shall Do All the Fighting

THE WARREN BILL

An ACT relating to military service of all those persons instrumental in bringing about war and profiting by the sale of munitions of war to the United States government.

Be It Enacted by the Congress of the United States:

Section 1. All representatives and senators voting "Yes" on a declaration of war against any foreign power, shall be drafted into the army of the United States as private soldiers and shall be assigned for duty in the army corps first dispatched to the front.

Section 2. Any editor, or publisher of any newspaper or other publication who writes or causes to be written and printed in any newspaper circulated within the United States or any of its possessions, an article favoring such declaration of war or who wrote or caused to be written and printed any article advocating such war before such declaration is made, shall be drafted into service as a private soldier and set to the front with the first army corps assigned to service on the battlefield.

Section 3. Any preacher or priest, who in pulpit or other public place, asks God's blessing upon the success of arms of the United States, shall be drafted into the service as a private soldier and sent to the front with the first army corps detailed for service.

Section 4. All stockholders in all factories supplying munitions to the United States government shall report for duty at the nearest army post or recruiting station on the morning following declaration of war and there be drafted into the army of the United States as private soldiers and detailed for service in the first army corps sent to the front.

Section 5. All male citizens between the ages of 18 and 60 who publicly express themselves in favor of such declaration of war, or who, before war was declared, publicly expressed themselves as favorable to such declaration, shall report for duty at the nearest recruiting station, where they shall be mustered in and sent to the front with the first army corps detailed for service.

Section 6. In the event of the physical disability of any of the above named classes of men subject to military service, then his next male relative shall be drafted as a substitute. Where the stock is held in any munition factory furnishing supplies to the United States government in the name of a woman, then her nearest male relative shall be drafted as a substitute.

Section 7. Failure to report for duty two days after the declaration of war, or two days after such declaration of war has come to his knowledge, shall subject such individual to courtmartial on the charge of treason, and upon conviction shall be condemned to death and shot at sunrise on the morning follow-

Section 8. In the event that the United States government calls for volunteers or in the event that conscription is resorted to, then the United States government shall pay to the families of such volunteers and conscripted men a sum, weekly, equal to the wages earned by such volunteers and conscripted men before entering the United States army. In the event of the death of any soldier of the United States army, the government shall pay to his widow or dependants a sum equal to the wages earned by such soldier before entering the service. The sum shall be paid during the life of the widow and as long thereafter as there are any minor children in such deceased soldier's family. In case of the total disability of any soldier, a sum equal to wages earned by him before entering the service shall be paid during his lifetime. In case of partial disability, then the government shall pay a sufficient sum to raise his income to what it was before entering the service. In no case shall such payments exceed \$1,500 per year.

Section 9. The funds to pay such soldiers shall be raised by assessing a tax of 90% against all incomes over \$3,000 per year.

heartening lesson that has been than this? taught by the present war is The Germans have not only in breaking them.

Every civilized and Christian soldier in the world is well aware of the fact that Germany's sudden attacks with submarines upon vessels loaded with war munitions for her enemies, and the suffocating of soldiers with poisonous gas, are not according to the rules of civilized warfare. No other enemy of Christian nations, nor any other people about to be attacked by a Christian nation, has ever resorted to these foul methods. Look at the war that England waged in South Africa, for the purpose of confiscating the gold fields and other property of the Boer farmers. The Boers, to their credit, fought the hosts of Great Britain in a perfectly civilized way. About all the weapons they used—or possessed—were squirrel rifles. Take the war that England waged against the Chinese in order to force the opium trade upon China—the Chinese did not barbarously blow up British ships, or suffocate British soldiers with gas. No-the Chinese met the armed invaders with a beating of tom-toms and the discharging of a few old flint-lock muskets. How did the Hindoos resist the British conquest of India? Mostly with swords and spears. How have the Irish fought their British conquerors? With Shellelahs. Did the Egyptians resort to the cruel and uncivilized methods of the Germans when England was conquering them? spears were about Egypt's only weapons.

Take our war in the Phillipines. Old fashioned Spanish blunderbusses were the arms the Filipinos fought with. Even when we burst the bellies of the Filipinos with the water-cure they did not resort to the uncivilized methods of the Germans. Nor were the Spaniards themselves much better prepared than the Filipinos when - Col. Roosevelt heroically shot one Hill. Look at the bloody battle of Ludlow; where Rockefeller's brave gunmen victoriously slaughtered old men and women, and children, and pregnant wives of the miners. Suppose these pregnant women had suffocated Rockefeller's gunmen with poisonous gas-can you imagine anything


