Labor is the infinite creator and it is now engaged in creating a new world, a world of freedom, a world of duty and a world of joy for all the children of men.



THE PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN

CHILD LABOR AND THE POLITICIANS

Means of evading the law, even where it applies, will not be wanting, but it will not apply at all to a great majority of child workers and will be so construed as to bear as lightly as possible upon the mill owners and sweaters who coin the

As long as widespread poverty prevails, the poverty produced by capitalism, child labor will remain an incurable evil and while it may be mitigated it will remain to curse society until socialism has laid hold of industry, placed the workers instead of the parasites in control with the consequent abolition of poverty, and this and this alone will abolish the infamy and crime of child slavery.

The Rockefeller regime held sway in Colorado, according to the decision of the Supreme Court of that state recently rendered, through the "fraudulent and infamous prostitution of the ballot."

Ponder this terrific indictment well. It brands both Rockefeller

and the Republican party with infamy and crime.

This is the same Rockefeller who rules in the same criminal and corrupt manner in Minnesota, Michigan and West Virginia, and the same Republican party of which the virtuous and corporationserving Charles E. Hughes is the candidate for president.

Bear in mind, too, that this indictment was not drawn by socialists and agitators but by the Supreme Court, the capitalist Supreme Court of Colorado, which means that conditions must have become so frightfully rotten as to constitute a menace to capitalism itself.

And now behold the Iron Range of Minnesota where the same inhuman, debauching conditions are being imposed by the same Rockefeller bandits and under the same political administration!

Arouse, ye toiling, plundered millions, drive these pirates out, and take possession of your own!

The percentage of farm renters is increasing by leaps and bounds in the agricultural states. Landlordism is spreading like the deadly Upas and as a consequence thousands of those who but a few years ago were patronizingly pointed out as "independent farmers" are now headed for the Socialist party.

Industrial workers and agricultural workers must clasp hands and make common cause. Both are essential to the labor movement and to industrial emancipation.

#### CONGRESSIONAL 'CANDIDATES

#### THE THREATENED RAILROAD STRIKE

The nation-wide strike of the railroad workers in the train service involving 225 railroads and some 200,000 employes, threatened for several weeks, did not occur. In the last hour a settlement was effected through President Wilson and congress. The settlement is based upon a law rushed through congress which provides for the eight-hour-day and for overtime pro rata, not at all what the employes had dominded and what their leaders had declared they would stand for without compromise to the end.

The employes demanded time-and-a-half for overtime as a means of enforcing the eight-hour-day. This was denied them in the compromise and it is doubtful if any actual benefit will come to the majority of them in the net results which are to follow.

The Adamson bill, as the measure is known, becomes effective January 1st, and meantime the president is to appoint a commission for the purpose of noting the effects of the operation of the law

and reporting the same to congress.

The law under which the strike was averted provides for the eight-hour-day without reduction of the wage hitherto paid for a ten-hour-day. This feature of the law in effect fixes the wages of railroad employes by congress and leading corporation lawyers declare it to be unconstitutional and we venture the assertion that they are right and that it will be set aside accordingly and rendered void when it is finally decided, as it no doubt will be, by the Supreme Court of the United States.

The railroad officials have already expressed their determination to test the legality of the entire proceeding on the part of congress in higher courts and when this shall have been done there will be hardly enough left of the Adamson law to be of any practical benefit to the men who have been assessed hundreds of thousands

of dollars to make this fight.

But the law will serve until after the presidential election in November and that is mainly what it was intended for. After that the railroad employes will realize that they have been goldbricked once more and that they will have to make their fight all over again.

But—it was fortunate for the brotherhood leaders at least that the strike was not ordered and that it did not come to the showdown which the railroad managers were so anxious to have exhibited

to the country.

The actual farmers and farm-workers rightly belong to the Socialist party, the only party that stands for the overthrow of capitalism and for the industrial republic.

The Socialist party member who drops behind in his dues soon drops behind in the movement. If he has not interest enough in the party to keep up his dues his interest in the movement is not of sufficient value to be missed when he drops out and is left behind.

### "BACK TO THE FRONT"

The illustrated poem entitled "Back to the Front" which appeared in the September RIP-SAW has elicited wide and favorable comment and it is gratifying to note the effect this terrible indictment of and pathetic protest against war has had upon the people.

Murray E. King, of Utah, is the author of this extraordinary poem and L. F. Sesinger of Pennsylvania has given us the realistic and shocking illustration which accompanies it. Both are red-blooded young socialists and both have undoubted genius for their work.

To read these thrilling, terror-breathing verses is to realize in every line that they could have been inspired only in the breast of a true poet and interpreter of the revolution, and to glance over the various features of the illustration is to see at once that the real artist has also arrived and that his pictured plea and protest is destined to do its share to banish the hell of war from earth.

Congratulations to Murray E. King and L. F. Sesinger, whose names will one day shine resplendent upon the pages of revolutionary

history!

PATRIOTISM ON PARADE

The day following the great parade held in Milwaukee, an associated press dispatch announced that the socialist mayor of that city was at the head of it and that it was a preparedness parade and demonstrated, with the approval of the socialists, the patriotism of the city. We denied the report at the time it appeared, convinced that it was a lie intended to injure the socialist mayor and the Socialist party of Milwaukee. The report persisted however, until we made inquiry direct and ascertained to our very great surprise and regret that the report was true so far as the Socialist mayor heading the parade was concerned. Denial was made, however, that it was a preparedness parade.

According to the statement issued by the mayor the parade had for its object not preparedness, but a demonstration of patriotism and of loyalty to the nation and its institutions. This is simply the same thing by a different name and it seems unbelievable that the Socialists of Milwaukee could have ordered their mayor through their central committee, as they are reported to have done, to march

in any such parade.

This act from any real socialist point of view, cannot be too severely condemned and we are not of those who propose to withhold censure because of the cowardly fear that we may injure the party. Whether it was a "preparedness" parade or a "patriotic" parade amounted to one and the same thing and they who are responsible for it ought to be made to account to the Socialist party for their perfidious action which amounts to nothing less than the sanction of bourgeois "patriotism" and the betrayal of socialist principles and ideals.

The parade was conceived, initiated, organized and managed by the ruling class, and its hirelings were expected to march in it

—and did.

Since when has it become necessary for socialists to demonstrate their "patriotism" by marching in bourgeois preparedness parades financed by the steel trust, the powder trust, the gun factories and the munition manufactures who are fastening an infamous militarism upon the country?

Was this action on the part of the socialists at Milwaukee intended to popularize the party and catch votes? If so, these are

the dearest votes they ever bargained for.

The political managers of the parade were shrewd enough to flash the news over the country the following morning that the socialist mayor had headed the march of the preparedness parade in Milwaukee.

"Patriotism" received a heavy jolt in the European war. The workers are not so blind that they cannot see what "patriotism" of the capitalist variety will mean to them and their families when the ruling class conclude to plunge the nation into war for its own aggrandizement and material profit.

Blessings on the workingman who thinks!

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

The fourth period and the first in barbarism began when women invented pottery and added pots to the kitchen furniture. These pots along with the fires and hunting grounds were still owned in common but the marriage relation became more exclusive. Each woman might claim some man as hers, but as in modern high society it was easier to claim a man than it was to keep him from straying in the direction of some fair young damsel, and from that day to this women have had one long struggle to raise the morals of men above those of tom-tits.

The fifth period began when the women tamed the young animals that the men brought in from the chase and in this way established the herds of domestic animals. The women also built rude huts of abode and the home became a more or less fixed abiding place. The collective ownership of property and co-operative form of work still endured and women still hammered away on the thankless job of making men a little less loose in their love affairs and a little more inclined to graze in their own pasture. During all this time the sexes still lived apart, the men in one house and the women in another. Morgan in his "Ancient Society" tells us that he found the Iroquois Indians living in this manner. There was a "longhouse" in which all the women of a group dwelt and another for the men. He also found that these Indians had a democratic form of assembly in which all adults had equal suffrage. In tribal councils the women had exactly the same voice as men. There were no slaves and no masters, no kings and no subjects, no judges and no prisons, no lawyers and no lawsuits, no poverty and no riches. And yet splendid men and women were produced by such a society. All the white men who came in contact with the Indians unspoiled by Christian civilization were impressed with the independence and personal dignity so universally an attribute of Indian character.

#### Women Become Property.

The sixth and last period of barbarism began with the smelting of metals, when iron tools were made to till the soil and iron weapons to wage war. The groups federated into nations; strong men fought for the possession of favorite women and the possession of a large number of women became the mark of a chieftain's success, and a necessary adjunct to a man's comfort and happiness. Of course, not all men could have a lot of women, only the military leaders who were ery powerful in war were so fortunate.

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



# Debating With The **Preachers**

### Kate Richards O'Hare

ask about the results of my debates held with Rev. Witcher of Texas, at Center Ridge, Arkansas and Rev. Hull of Gravette, Arkansas at Conway,

Ark., October 17, 18, 1916.

These debates were essentially the same as many other that have been held all over the South. Many think that because the Socialists debate with preachers that we are attacking religion and the preachers are defending it. This is not true at all; every Socialist that debates with a preacher does their level best to keep the discussion strictly on the basis of socialism and leave the whole question of religion to the preachers whose particular business it is. The reason that nearly all debates have a preacher for the defender of capitalism is that the lawyers and politicians of Dixie are too wise to meet a Socialist, so they hire a preacher to do their "dirty

The crowds at both of these debates were marvelous. Center Ridge is just a wide spot in the road, twenty miles from a railroad in a hill country, but five thousand people bumped over the rocks in all manner of vehicles from a battered "tin Henry" to an oxcart to hear the discussion. Conway is thirty miles from Center Ridge and possibly a thousand of the people who heard the debate at Center Ridge drove to Conway the next day to hear me speak again. But Rev. Hull had put in an appearance in the meantime and wanted a debate so we accommodated

Rev. Witcher is without doubt the most able of these hired defenders of the capitalist system. He is well educated in a superficial way, has a good command of language and is the shrewdest and most artful dodger extant. He can punish the truth more and harder in a given length of time than any other man in Dixie.

We were billed to hold two sessions of the debate, forenoon and afternoon. Rev. Witcher did not appear until noon and the crowd insisted that I deliver a lecture in the forenoon. found was a favorite trick of the reverend gentleman's. It puts his opponent on the platform tired and reduces the whole time of debate to two hours. His supply of material just about fills one hour and if you can compel him to go into two sessions he runs out of

"soap." Rev. Witcher's tactics are to care fully avoid Socialism on every point and attempt to hide the real issues under an avalanche of filth and slimy lies. At no time in our debate did he ever touch in any manner the teachings of Socialism or the platform of the Socialist Party, but spent all his time in yelling that Socialism was "free-love" and "atheism." This compelled me to pound away on the fact that Socialism was the collective ownership of the collectively used machinery of production and their democratic control and then ask the crowd what this had to do with the mess of filth Rev. Witcher was dishing up.

Debating with Rev. Witcher is exactly like trying to corner a skunk. You are sicked by the vile smell and after you catch the pesky varmint he isn't worth the trouble. So far as I am concerned I have no desire to bother with a skunk, but sometimes it is necessary and I can do it if I have to. It was a disgusting job but the effect of the bad smell on the Democrats of that neighborhood was well worth the discomfort.

Hull to debate with a socialist who has a sense of humor and I'll wager you will have to borrow the old lady's corset to prop up your sore ribs.

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

# Murder in the First Degree

Not one of the accused is guilty.

On the contrary, they are all absolutely innocent of the crime charged against them.

It is another case of punishing the workers for the crimes committed against them by their masters.

Let us briefly review the facts in this extraordinary strike on the Mesabe Range. First, let me say that I have several times been over that territory and that as far back as twenty years ago I spent several weeks there organizing the iron workers on the range. I am therefore familiar with the conditions which are responsible for the 20,000 iron workers in and about the mines being out on strike.

These mining properties belong to the Steel Trust and in its program of union extermination the trust wiped out all the unions on the range. From that time to this a union man has been a criminal there and treated accordingly.

The Steel Trust, having their employes absolutely at their mercy, began to grind them to the marrow of their bones. Not only were wages reduced to the starvation point but they were treated in all respects more like cattle and hogs than human beings.

If they dared complain they were discharged. Spies among them kept them under suspicion of each other. Petty bosses ruled over them like despots and if they would hold their jobs they must be boot-licking sycophants and slaves.

Finally these insulted, outraged peons could endure it no longer and a whirlwind of revolt swept them out of the pits into a strike. The Steel Trust lost not a moment in attempting to break up the strike and drive them back into the pits. George P. West, field examiner of the Committee on Industrial Relations tells the story on the report of his investigation. It is as revolting as Colorado at its worst. Every worker in America ought to read it.

> I shall not believe that in this crisis the working class will coldly ignore indictment of these comrades, the heroic service they have rendered, and abandon them to their fate.

Read the report of the Labor Commissioner of Minnesota and the report of the Committee on Industrial Relations and you will see why these men and this woman, comrades of ours, have been indicted.

Just as the mine owners attempted to murder Moyer, Haywood and Pettibone ten years ago, so now are the same blood-thirsty tyrants attempting to repeat their infamous crime in Minnesota.

These comrades, though as innocent as babes, will be murdered by the Steel Trust as certain as the coming day unless the working class is aroused and stands between the brutal trust and its intended victims.

The Steel Trust is itself the archcriminal in the case and its clutches are red with the blood of the innocent, but no grand jury will find an indictment against these multi-millionaire murderers.

It is only the poor who are indicted for being the victims of crime and only the rich who go free in spite of their guilt.

I have said enough. You know the story. We are going to stand by our own and see that they get a fair trial. Every one of us must do our part and contribute our share.

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
