Pres. Lynch's Visit. President J. M. Lynch, of the International Typographical Union, was in the city Sunday. In an address before the local printers' union, he spoke very encouragingly of the progress of the struggle of the book and job printer for an eight-hour day.

What Unionism Accomplishes. It has been the policy and is now the aim of the Cigar-makers' International Union to keep the standard of the cigarmaker at the highest possible ebb and to resist with all means in its power the systems and devices put forth by non-union employers to degrade the occupation and lessen the wages paid to the makers.

The Molders' Strike. The Molders' strike progresses, and the outlook gets better from week to week. The trouble is the molders are such cussed nerved fellows that while they are careful to respect the laws they do not waste a minute in applying the tactics of their fight.

General Labor Notes. A Baseball Stitches' Union was recently organized at Philadelphia. In Germany children under 15 years of age cannot be employed at any occupation.

A new law has been passed in Iowa which prohibits the employment of children under eighteen in any gainful occupation which would injure health.

At a meeting of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, held in St. Paul, Minn., a resolution was passed to stand by the working girls in their demand for an eight-hour day wherever made.

There are 300 shoe factories in this country using the union stamp, according to a report recently issued. These factories give employment to 40,000 union shoemakers.

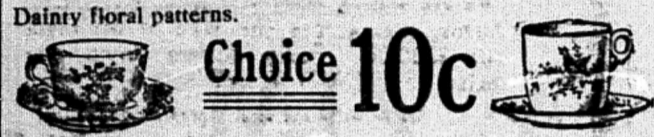

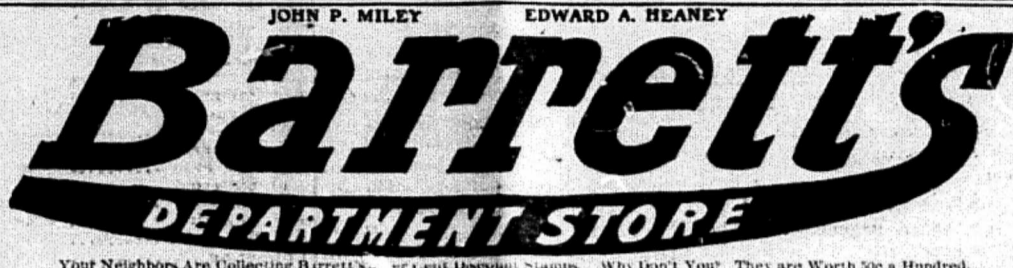
