On the evening of the 2nd of January, von der Launitz received an invitation from His Highness, the Prince of Oldenburg, to be present at the solemn inauguration of a new division in the Institute of Experimental Medicine.

About one hundred and fifty invitations were issued to the upper ten and to the leading men of the medical world. The greater part of those invited were persons of royal blood or of title.

As a matter of course, not all of the august personages accepted. Times are not favorable for appearing in public, and at about half-past ten only some fifty people were assembled in the chapel of the institute.
